

OVER TWO HUNDRED HOUSES BURNED.

A San Francisco, Cal., despatch of posterday says: Details have been received of the terrible floods and famine which have pravailed recently in the interior districts of Northern China. The people of Schnan have soft-red terribly by floods, which destroyed temples, bridges and walls in the tes districts in Wen-Chuan. The loss of life will reach fully 1,000. Immediately following the floods as Pie Chang a fire broke out and destroyed 35 houses. In the cother places houses were burned to the number of 200.
