At the appointed time, the 20th inst., as duly notified through the press and otherwise, the Association met in Vanbuskirk's Hall, Kingston, the president, A. C. Vanbuskirk, Esq., occupying the chair. After reading and confirmation of the minutes of the annual meeting in March, correspondence from Hon. L. E. Baker, Yarmouth, president and manager of the Y. and B. S. S. Co., was read, expressing a readiness to return all empties of small fruit packages over their line free of charge, and of affording every reasonable encouragement in the way of access to the Boston market via Yarmouth.

The motion passed at the March meeting, viz. "That we discuss the advisability of putting a man in Halifax to handle our products" was then taken up, on which we had expressions from Jas. Gates, the mover, and G. C. Miller, L. R. Baker, Geo. McGregor, and some others; but the proposition did not appear to merit much favor, and was therefore dropped.

On motion, it was ordered that a quantity of stationery and appropriate printed headings be procured for use of the Society, and also to be supplied at cost to such of our members as wish it.

Some other business items were disposed of, and Mr Miller then called the attention of the association to the danger in importing cranberry pests, quite prevalent there, prominent among which is the "fire worm," which is very destructive to the plants and said to be proof against arsenical remedies, spraying with a dejection of tobacco being the only effective remedy known.

A considerable part of the time of the meeting was occupied in discussing the matter of the variety and various sizes of berry packages, careless or dishonest packing, variation in quality of fruit from different growers, etc., there being a variation in the size of packages used by different parties from an imperial quart down to less than a pint and a half. It was made manifest that those who use the under size packages and ship the poorer quality of berries realize equally as much per package as do those who use the full sized measure and fill it with the higher grades of fruit, from the fact, as shown, that our commission merchants in the city continue on a uniformity of price on each day's supply, and transfer to their respective patrons their consignments, good, bad and indifferent at the one uniform set price, leaving the retail dealers to grade the fruit at their pleasure and make their profits out of the full measure and honest packing, thus affording discouragements to honesty, while the reverse should prevail. Several suggestions were offered as a remedy for the prevailing wrong, including legislation, regulating the size of packages and imposing a penalty on those deviating therefrom. But it is believed that our consignees have it in their power, with due care and attention to these irregularities, to remedy them in a large measure.

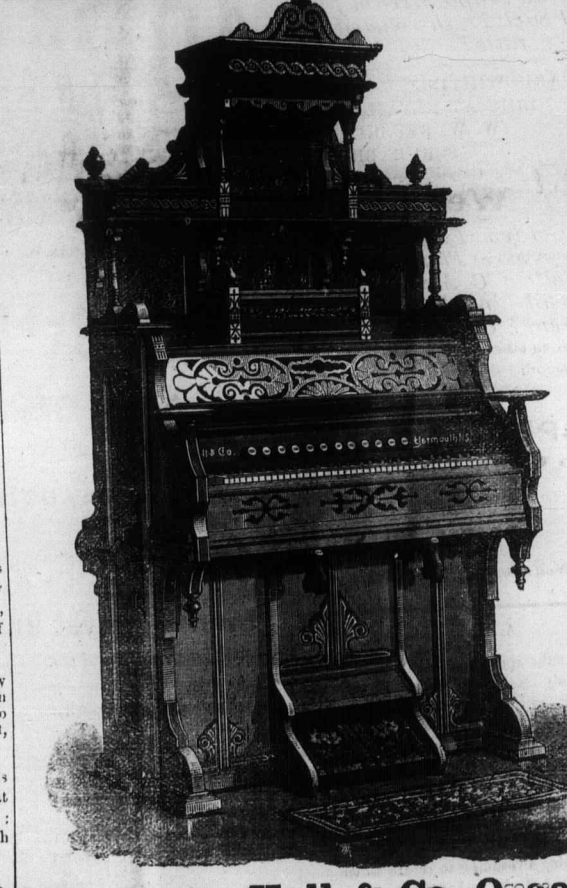
