THE SILVER QUESTION.

The discount on American silver at Guelph is 44 to 5 per cent., and at Hamilton it is now up to 53. The merchants of the latter place argusubject to a continuous and enormous loss in consequence, for they have—the majority of the retail dealers—continued to take silver at par, with scarcely an intermission, and their an noyance at the increasing rate of discount is not to be wondered at Private enterprise for the removal of the silvernuisance having failed, the old plan of an appeal to the Government in the premises is received, and it is now urged by certain parties to fix foreign silver at a proper value, and make it a legal tender for duties and customs, and afterwards export it out of the country, or else fix its value at a figure that will afford to recoin it into our own currency. To the adoption of this plan there is the great objection that the Government would lose a great deal of money in carrying it out—at least from two to four percent, on import duties; and besides, what circulating medium is the silver to be replaced by? The issue of Canadian coin is exceedingly limited, and would certainly not be sufficient to meet the requirements of trade. It is of course a great nuisance to have so much foreign silver in our midst, but it would be a far greater one were there too little coin of any kind to circulate. The most feasible and inexpensive plan to adopt would perhaps be for government, should it decide to take action in the matter. to issue fractional legal tender notes of small denominations, with a fresh silver coinage of five and ten cents, to be used in exchange for the foreign silver, which could be converted into bullion without loss to the country. Mr. Weir's method of dealing with the question was a good one, but slow in its operation, and conducted at considerable expense to his patrons. The Crowded Thoroughfares of London.

Among the many great improvements now going on in London to relieve the over-crowded state of traffic, and for opening up new means of communication, the Tower Subway is one which deserves especial no ice, as forming an easy and safe connection between the two densely populated districts situated north and south of the Thames Tunnel This work is now in course of construction under the bed of the river, from Tower Hill to Tooley street, and consists of a tunnel less than a quarter of a mile in length, access being gained to it by a Hill to Tooley street, and consists of a tunnel less than a quarter of a mile in length, access being gained to it by a shaft at each end. The depth of these shafts will be fifty-two feet and 60 feet respectively, in which it is proposed to have lifts for the transmit of passengers, parcels, &c., to and from the Subway, which will be about twenty-two feet helow the bed of the river. A wrought-from shield will be employed overlapping the tunnel, provided with doors in the front, through which workmen can drive the heading, but which can be immediately closed on any appearance of water, and so render all water-tight; this shield will be propelled by powerful screws, and as it progresses the tunnel segments inserted. The Tower Subway was commenced on February 16th last, and as the shaft to the Middlesex side is also sunk to the depth of sixty feet, and the remainder of the work well advanced, it is expected to be opened to the public before the commencement of the year 1870.
