NEWFOUNDLAND ELECTIONS TO BE FOUGHT ON THIS QUESTION.

The Disability Bill Passed By the House But Imperial Assent Being Refused a Royal Commission Must Come - The Banks Denounced By the Press and the Press By the Pulpit.

St. John's, Nfld., Jan. 20.-The newspapers are filled with denunciations o the management of the suspended banks here. One firm alone, it is shown, overdrew its account \$25,000 last year, for the greater part of which no assets existed. This firm executed a mortgage for \$70,000, but the mortgage was not registered. Another firm purchased

registered. Another firm purchased steamers with the money obtained from the bunks. The steamers are now mort-gaged to repay the money. The creditors of several of the firms are opposing the ratification of the com-promises offered, holding that the firms are able to pay more than they are of-fering. The creditors have filed objec-tions with the Sapreme Court, urging that the trustees be appointed to carry on the business of those firms until ulti-mately, wound up. This is objected to by the general public, because it would completely ruin the colony's trade in a year or two.

The Antelope Nearly Extinct.

Upon the far western plains the antelope, a few years ago a familiar sight to the travelet by rail or wagon, has now almost wholly disappeared. In Coloraalmost wholly disappeared. In Colora-lo, Texas and western Kansas shy a most wholy disappeared. Kansas shy bands, numbering from two to three to half a dozen antelope, are sometimes sighted, where fifteen years ago the herds were many and large. The ex-tinction of these beautiful, fleet crea-tures, seemingly so near at hand, will be less the result of systematic hunting, such as characterized the extermination of the buffalo, than the encroachments upon their feeding grounds by cattle-men and sheepmen with their herds, and the desultory shooting of sports-men, ranchmen and cowboys, now so generally distributed over the plains, that the timid animals can find no place of security. In New Mexico the ante-loges have almost wholly disappeared lepes have almost wholly disappeared from the high plains cast of the Rockies, where once they abounded, a few small herds in the southwest of the territory being about all that remain within its
