Notwithstanding the heavy rain and the fact that the farmers are busy with their hay, there was a good representation of delegates from all parts of the riding, among the prominent Conservatives being W. H. Ross, M. J. A. C. J. Thornton, the Conservative candidate in the last Dominion contest; J. H. Devitt, Anson Taylor, reeve of Cartwright; J. K. Allen, T. Powers, Dr. S. C. Hillier, Capt. W. C. King, P. C. Trebilcock, James Brown, reeve of Clarke, M. Mansy, D. J. Gilson, Osborne, James Gale, Ed. News and others. The president of the association, Angus Stalker, occupied the chair.

Hon. N. Clarke Wallace and Mr. J. W. St. John went down from Toronto to discuss political questions with the West Durham people, but before the public meeting was called to order the association elected their officers and discussed the advisability of bringing out candidates for the approaching election. The election of officers resulted as follows: President, Dr. S. C. Hillier, Bowmanville; vice-president, J. H. Devitt, Blackstock; secretary, James Gale, Bowmanville; treasurer, Capt. W. C. King, Bowmanville, and E. H. McLean, Newmarket.

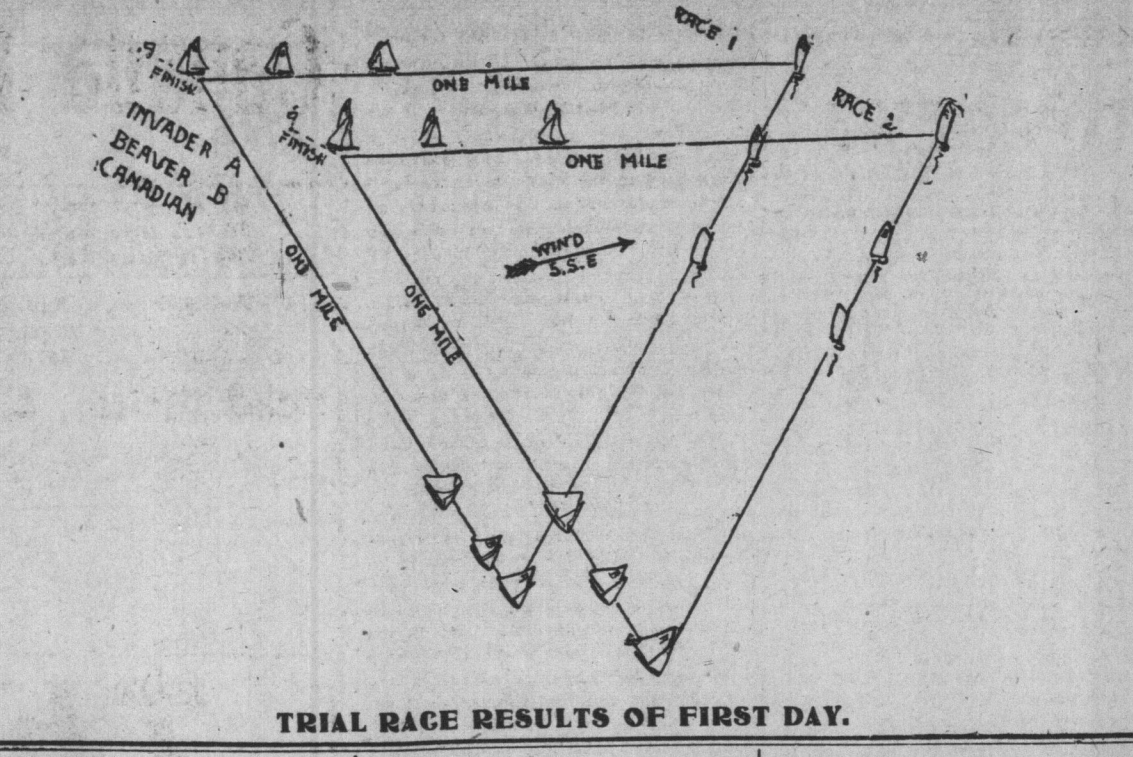
