

TERRIBLE DEATH TOLL OF UNITED STATES ROADS

2.535 Killed and 49,911 Injured in Three Months - Collisions and Derailments For the Quarter

Washington, Nov. 28-The Interstat tin issued for the quarter ended June 80, 1918, shows that as compared with returns of the corresponding quarter of 1912, there was a total increase of 140 in the number of persons killed, and of 288 in the number injured in railroad accidents of all kinds in the United States. There was an increase of 124 in the number of train accidents.

Defective roadway and defective equipment together caused more than 69 per cent of all derailments reported, 15.1 per cent being caused by broken rails

passers.

The total number of collisions and derailments reported for the quarter was 3,596, of which 148 collisions, and 242 derailments affected passenger trains. The financial damage caused by the accidents was \$3,224,289, a material increase over the returns for the corresponding quarter of 1912.

Ottawa, Nov. 28-The government is preparing to meet parliament with an "emergency" and "contribution" policy in the tariff and cost of living problem Liberalism has proposed in each a permanent policy on strict economic and constitutional lines. The government, by its alliance with the protected interests of wealth and tariff privilege, cannot reduce the tariff even on foodcannot reduce the tariff even on foodstuffs, or propose any permanent programme of tariff relief for the consumer.

Because of Premier Borden's alliance
with the Nationalists, he cannot propose the only practical and permanent
solution to the problem of naval defence and must again revert this session to an "emergency" policy.

The "emergency" policy in the tariff
and cost of living policy was semi-officially announced today in despatches
sent to the government press and inspired by the minister of finance. In
order to tide over the financial stringency, give employment to the unemployed and help the general taxpayer to
meet his grocer's and butcher's bills, it
is announced that the government proposes to greatly increase the expenditures
of the people's money.

ing.

That, in effect, is to be the temporizing reply of the government to the demand of the opposition for permanently relieving the consumer of a part at least of the burden of customs taxation. No action towards appointing a Royal Commission in cost of living has yet been taken by the cabinet, but it is believed here that such action would be taken before parliament meets. An Excuse for Delays.

An Excuse for Delays.

The government hopes to take temporary shelter behind the promise of definite tariff action after the report of this commission is made. Meanwhile a policy of liberal expenditures on public works and heavy borrowings has been decided upon.

Within two years the total expenditures have been practically doubled under the present parliament. Last session the total appropriations amounted to a quarter of a billion dollars and the actual expenditure for the fiscal year will be well over \$200,000,000.

For the coming year it is deliberately announced that this enormous total will be exceeded. Revenue is decreasing, but expenditures are to go up.

Finance Minister White has already started the borrowing process on a big scale, event at a time of high interest rates. His recent loans in the London money market at 43-8 and 45-8 per cent, are considerably higher than Canada has had to pay for many years past. Today the treasury of Canada is practically emptied and the public debt has again started to climb.

Another aspect of the policy of increased expenditures is that it will afford an excuse for not reducing the customs taxation. The plea can be made that revenue is not adequate to meet expenditures and therefore the customs revenue, the chief source of income, should not be reduced.
