Drummond, has been published in twenty-first edition—and an occurrence almost unique in the experience of present-day poets. They will issue in the fall another volume by the same author—"Fanny Courtesan and Other Poems."

The Woodstock, N. B. Sentinel says: Miss Rachel Simpson may be smothered among the heroes of the day. Learning that she was a family in the smallest district that was suffering on account of being unable to secure a nurse, regarding it in the light of a necessity and duty, she has gone to help take care of the patient, regardless of the personal risks to herself involved.

Commander Gascoigne, formerly in command of the Canadian militia, and as present commander of the British troops at Hong Kong, arrived at Yangtze on Wednesday from Hong Kong, enroute home to England on leave of absence. He speaks warmly of the work done by the Canadian contingents in South Africa, and says he has made high praise of the work he has just completed in crossing the Atlantic from Massachusetts.

The intercepted captain had an unusually rough passage for the time of the year, especially when he entered the Gulf Stream, where he was at one time tossed about for forty-two hours. He also encountered off the Portuguese coast a heavy gale and a north-west wind during the last four days.

Over his early arrival, and indeed his life, to the stomach little boat, of which he is very proud. It cost twelve hundred dollars, and is twenty-five feet long, seven feet wide, and four feet deep. It contains a large boiler, a tank holding fifty gallons of water, a stove, and compass.

The following is a list of the names of the men who were on board the boat when it was captured, and of those who were on board when it was released. The names are: Captain Blackman, and several British steamers, some of which passed without inquiring whether assistance was required. One in the Gulf Stream during a very rough spell, sighted the tiny boat apparently deserted, blew her whistle to see if any one was aboard. Blackman came on deck and said "All right," and to show that no assistance was needed he set sail, leaving the boat off on her way. The steamer doubting that a small boat could live in such a tremendous sea, followed to the leeward for several minutes, and then, seeing that all was right, turned off to the south-west.

Prof. Prince, of the Fisheries Department, Ottawa, has been conducting a series of experiments with dynamite in St. John harbor to ascertain the effect of explosives upon the fishy tribe, there being some complaints against its use by fishermen. It is claimed by those who advocate or defend its use that fish are not killed outright, but only temporarily stunned by the concussion. Prof. Prince excluded two sticks of dynamite in the harbor near the water last Friday evening, and had two explosions of Sand Point Saturday forenoon. The explosions were heard plainly, and the water was thrown up in a column about eight feet high. Numerous small and small apparatuses floated on the surface of their boats, and Prof. Prince secured a large quantity of specimens to examine.

The Winnipeg Tribune says: "Lieut. McMillan, of Baden-Powell's South African police, writing to his father, Mr. Wm. McMillan, of Treherne, in the course of his letter says:—'Wilport was the place Lieut. Borden was killed in the Boer war. I was there for three weeks, and I had to continue firing in that position for about an hour, the fire being too heavy to permit me to shift. We killed 82 Boers on that hill, that is where I got the rifle I sent you, from a Boer prisoner. The fight was so good that it called forth congratulations from Lord Roberts. I took command of Mr. Borden's troop after he fell, and was detailed to follow up the Boers for three miles, not returning until midnight.'"

"We are at present at Pretoria resting. I don't expect to be home for at least six or eight months yet."
