The recent money crisis has exercised an unfavorable influence over every branch of trade and industry in the city. On many of the steamship docks and at the railroad depots half the usual number of hands are employed, while at others the men are working on full time. The agent of the New York and Baltimore transportation line stated yesterday that there was a decrease of about one half in eastern bound freight, but that western traffic was the same as usual. The grain trade with Baltimore has completely fallen away. The hotel proprietors complain of the exceeding duliness. One or two hotels on the American plan have made a reduction in prices, and with one or two exceptions the hotels run on the European plan have made a reduction in the prices of rooms of 20 per cent on former prices.


