PASTORAL LETTER.

TO THE CONGREGATION OF THE AMERICAN PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

Dear Friends:

It is a pleasure to pen the opening words of this year's Report, for a glance at the total shows that, both in the number of subscribers and in the amount contributed, this year's record surpasses that of any previous year in the history of the fund. A net increase of fortyeight rames upon this "Roll of Honor," and of over eight hundred dollars to the Lord's work through this channel is encouraging evidence of healthy growth in benevolent and missionary interest, and ground for hearty thanksgiving to God.

A study of this year's disbursements shows them to have been most judicious and satisfactory. Never have I been so thoroughly satisfied with the results of our expenditure at Inspector Street Chapel as this year. Never have the letters of our own missionaries given greater

evidence of the good that our gifts are doing.

A comparison of the classified list of subscribers with that of last year shows that the increase has been among the small givers, rather than the large ones. We still have one noble subscription of \$300; but, while last year there were three who gave from \$150 to \$200, this year there is only one. While last year there were three who gave from \$75 to \$100, this year there is only one. But for the increase in the number of smaller gifts, we should have fallen behind. I earnestly hope that those who have led this ever increasing host will not begin to lag. If you decrease what you have given out of your abundance, others will certainly lessen what they have given out of their poverty. I sincerely hope that the leaders will quicken their pace to the speed of last year at least.

Though a number of names appear upon this year's Report for the first time, a comparison of the list with our congregation directory shows that there is still much ground lying fallow. Many give nothing through this channel. I would affectionately urge all these to begin now to help on this important work. Your help is needed and giving will do you good. Do not excuse yourself because you may not be heartily in favor of some object for which appropriations have been made. You can specify for what objects you wish your contributions to go.

Again I would urge you to give REGULARLY, IN-

DIVIDUALLY, and PROPORTIONATELY.

It is encouraging to hear that a number of our people pay their subscriptions WHEN DUE, putting their contributions in the box the first of every month with com-

mendable regularity.

It is gratifying to notice in a number of instances the names of whole families—father, mother, and all the children, from the oldest to the youngest. It is better for the same amount to be divided among the members of family than for the parent to give it all. It would be better still for each member of the family to give out of his own allowance or earnings. Let our children "subscribe with their own hand unto the Lord." This will give them an interest in the Lord's work, train them to habits of benevolence, and impress them with the fact of their individual responsibility.

Your kindly and generous reception of earnest appeals in the past leads me to believe that you will not

take these faithful words amiss.

On your behalf, I would sincerely thank the members of this Committee, who not only contribute generously themselves, but give valuable time and faithful service to this cause.

DORCAS SOCIETY.

This Society had a membership of sixty-seven during the season. Eleven meetings were held, at which two-hundred and six garments were made, repsesenting in value, about \$125.00, these were distributed among eight of the city charities.
