





REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

The Council of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association have the honor to submit the Thirteenth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association.

- 1. The Council desire to record their acknowledgment of the support and encouragement given to the Dominion and Provincial Associations, by the continuance during the year of the several grants made by the Government, and also for the assistance given to County and other local Associations through the Department of Militia and Defence.
- 2. The Annual Prize Meeting commenced on the 6th September, and, as far as related to all open competitions, was concluded by mid-day Friday the 10th. Competitors from the distant Provinces were thereby enabled to return to their homes without any undue delay, a result due to the provision of additional Target accommodation, and the introduction of a methodical system of detail for firing.

The Council feel bound to acknowledge that the success of the Meeting was in a great measure due to the competitors themselves, who by their ready compliance with the rule for making entries by the 1st September, and by their punctual observance of all instructions rendered the work of the Executive Staff a comparatively easy duty.

- 3. The general meeting of the Association, provided for by Clause 19 of the Constitution, was held at the Rideau Range. Its proceedings will be found in the Appendix.
- 4. Places in the Team for Wimbledon in 1881, were competed for. The names of those eligible for selection will be found in the Appendix.

- 5. The Wimbledon Team for 1880 sailed from Quebec on the 19th of June, under the command of Lt. Col. A. H. Williams, M. P., with Major Macpherson, G. G. Foot Guards, as second officer. Attention is drawn to the report of the Commanding Officer, which is published herewith.
- 6. At Altcar the Team made excellent shooting, and in the usual matches with the 15th Lancashire, the 1st Cheshire Rifle Volunteers, and the Liverpool Rifle Brigade, they came off victorious.

At Wimbledon, the number of prizes which fell to the Team was about the same as in former years, but the unfavorable state of the weather when the Canadians were shooting at the 600 yards range in the "Queens," destroyed the prospects of several members who had gone back to that range with scores, which fully entitled them to hope that they might gain the honor of a place in the 2nd stage.

Want of success in the Kolapore Cup Match has again to be recorded.

- Lt.-Col. Williams calls attention to several matters relative to the internal economy of future teams which are worthy of serious consideration.
- 7. The usual distribution of Silver Medals to affiliating Associations has been made.
- 8. Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise, was graciously pleased to add to the gift of His Excellency the Governor General, their joint presentation being \$500 (five hundred dollars). This amount was competed for under conditions approved of by His Excellency, and the Match determined the positions of the Competitors in the Wimbledon Team for 1881.

His Excellency has again presented a Silver and Bronze Medal to each of the Provincial Rifle Associations in Canada.

9. It is with much pleasure the Council refer to the handsome donation of \$250, by Lt. Colonel Gzowski, A.D.C. to the Queen, President of the Association, which with the gift of £100 sterling, by the Hon. Sir

John Rose, Bart; is placed for division amongst the Members of the Wimbledon Team for 1881.

- 10. The Council have also the pleasure of referring to the generous donations, of \$100, by Lt.-Colonel the Hon. L. R. Masson, M.P., and of \$150, by Lt.-Colonel Allan Gilmour, Vice-President of the Association.
- 11. The prizes won at the Annual Meeting were presented by His Excellency the Governor General, who was pleased to return to Ottawa specially for the purpose, thus continuing to show the great interest His Excellency has always taken in the welfare of the Association. In this, as in other ways, His Excellency has encouraged the Council to increase their efforts to make rifle shooting attractive ito the Militia of the country, and thereby afford an important stimulus to our system of national defence.
- 12. In response to representations made by His Excellency the Governor-General, the Directors of all the leading Banks have generously contributed a fund for prizes, to be given at the next meeting; thus showing the Council that they have the sympathy of the Monetary and Commercial leaders of the country, in their efforts to foster the efficiency of the Militia force of the Dominion—a force which is so essential for the protection of property in the event of civil commotion or other disturbances. A list of the contributors will be found in the Appendix.

The Council recommend that a suitable acknowledgment be made by the Association for this timely aid.

- 13. The Council have much pleasure in stating that the suggestions contained in the 18th paragraph of the Report of last year were carried out, and much of the success of the prize meeting of 1880, was due to the efficient control and management of Captain Costin, the Chief Executive Officer.
- 14. The Department of Militia and Defence again provided camp equipage and stores for the use of the Association during the meeting.
- 15. Prior to the matches, a large but necessary expenditure was made in increasing the target accommodation on the Rideau Range.

The total number of targets in use was twenty, 2nd and 3rd class, one 2nd class extra series, and two 1st class.

16. Owing to this increase in the number of targets, and for the satisfaction of competitors generally, it was considered desirable not to confine the selection of markers to one locality. To give effect to this resolution the services of a detachment of two N. C. officers and twelve men from 'B' Battery Kingston, were obtained to act in that capacity, and the remainder were selected from the local force at Ottawa. The Council have to record their satisfaction with the manner in which the markers performed the duty entrusted to them. They also feel that the thanks of the Association are due to Major Hebert, "B" Battery in Command of the detachment from that corps for the assistance he so willingly rendered on all occasions throughout the meeting.

17. The Council desire to thank Surgeon Malloch of the Governor General's Foot Guards, and Surgeon Bentley of the Ottawa Field Battery, for their attendance during the Competition, and also to thank the several Railway and Steamboat companies, for the facilities afforded to competitors, and for granting them transport to and from their homes at reduced rates.

FINANCE.

18. The Council refer to the Treasurer's Statement of the Finances, duly audited, for the period from 29th January, 1880, to 13th January, 1881.

19. The total receipts from all sources for that period have been \$12,697.69; balance brought forward from last year's statement, \$1,435.70; total amount, \$14,133.89; the expenditure amounted to \$14,120.82, leaving a palance of \$12.57 to the credit of the Association.

20. The amount for "Annual Subscriptions" is \$168, as against \$166 received in 1879. "Affiliation Fees" amount to \$780. The receipts under this head are the same as last year, owing to the payment of arrears by one Association in 1879.

Being an increase of one Affiliating Association as compared with last year.

- 21. The amount of "Special Donations" received this year is \$850.00, as against \$500.00 in 1879; increase of \$850.00.
- 22. The "Entrance Fees" to matches in 1880, including sighting-shots, blow-off tickets, post entry fees, fines, &c., amounted to \$2,273.12, less refund of \$63.90, made to competitors who did not attend the meeting and others who were unable from special causes to compete in certain matches, leaving a net amount of \$2,209.22, as against \$2,156,80 received in 1879.
- 23. The account of expenditure made by Lt.-Colonel Williams, Commanding Wimbledon Team of 1880, will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

OF THE

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association

- 1. The Annual Prize Meeting of 1880 was held at the Rideau Rifle Ranges, commencing on Monday, the 6th, and terminating on Friday, the 10th September.
- 2. As in previous years, all requisite arrangements for the Meeting were made and carried out by the Executive Committee of the Council
- 3. The duties of the Secretary were very considerably lightened by the appointment, for the first time, of an Executive Officer. To the untiring energy of Captain Costin, the officer selected for this important duty, and to his thorough knowledge of the duties required of him, the success of the Meeting is mainly attributable.
- 4. The necessity for further Target accommodation, which was so apparent at the Meeting of 1879, was met by a large increase to the number of Targets formerly in use.
- 5. Lieut. Whitman, of the 60th Battalion, with a score of 47 points, carried off the MacDougall Cup on its 11th anniversary.
- 6. The Province of Ontario had the good fortune to secure—with its representative team—the London Merchants' Cup with a score of 417 points.

The Team from the Province of New Brunswick was second, with a score of 378 points.

8. British Columbia was the only Province of the Dominion unrepresented at the Meeting of 1880.

The result of the competition in that Province for a place in the Wimbledon Team for 1881, has not been received in time for insertion in the Report.

9. The weather during the Meeting was variable, and not in favour of good shooting.

A detachment of 12 men, under an officer of "B" Battery, together with men of Local Corps of Militia, carried out the marking, which was successfully and satisfactorily performed.

10. The Meeting was unattended with accident.

Report of Lt.-Colonel Arthur T. H. Williams, M.P.

WIMBLEDON TEAM, 1880.

PORT HOPE, 20th September, 1880.

SIR,

The command of the Wimbledon Team of 1880 having been offered to me by the President, Lt.-Col. Gzowski, A.D.C., and the responsibility duly accepted, I have the honor to state, that in accordance with instructions, the members of the Team reported themselves to me at the Brigade Office, Quebec, on Friday a.m., the 18th of June, and subscribed to the regulations as approved of by the Dominion Rifle Association.

On the evening of Friday, His Excellency the Governor-General, howeved the members of the Team by receiving them on the Citadel

Terrace, and addressing words of encouragement to them.

Owing to the Steamship "Polynesian' having been delayed in the river, the Team did not embark until late in the afternoon of Saturday, the 19th, which delay had the effect of slightly increasing the expenditure at Quebec. The accommodation provided on the "Polynesian" was in every way satisfactory, as were also the attention and courtesy extended by Capt. Brown and the various officers of the ship.

We arrived at Liverpool on the morning of Wednesday, June 30th, and at once disembarked, and proceeded to the Hightown Hotel, near the Altcar Rifle Ranges, which were kindly placed at our disposal as had been

customary on former visits.

At the request of Lt.-Col. Tinley, Commanding the 5th Lancashire Rifles, Capt. Montague Hope, the Adjutant, called upon me and most kindly offered to supply us with ammunition until permission could be obtained to enable me to purchase the same from the Military Stores at Chester.

The practice at Altcar was most promising. Wheeler Ogg, of the Wellington Field Battery, in the match for the Altcar Morning Challenge Cup on the 2nd July, won the prize with a score of 94 out of a possible 165. Private McIntyre tied for the second place with a score of 88. In the competitions in which the Team as a body took part, their shooting was remarkably satisfactory; they defeated twenty of the 15th Lancashire Rifle Volunteers by 25 points; the 1st Chester Volunteers by 18 points, and the Liverpool Rifle Brigade, which is considered the crack shooting corps of that part of England, by 76 points, our Team averaging nearly 80 points per man, while their opponents averaged over 75 a man.

On the afternoon of Friday, July 2nd, I proceeded to London to complete arrangements at Wimbledon, having first issued an order that the Team would pursue the usual course as to going into camp, but if any member of the Team felt that he would be "physically weakened" by camp-life, a personal application to remain out should be made to the officer commanding.

It has been claimed that the supposed exposure in camp had the effect of impairing the powers of marksmen, and, as the point had been agitated, I deemed it my duty in the interest of the Association to add to the comfort of the Team in every way, and was forced to an additional expenditure in flooring the tents, which certainly added greatly to the comfort

of the occupants of the camp.

As the few who had permission to remain out of camp, although good marksmen, fell far behind what was expected of them in the matches, I infer that camp-life at Wimbledon has the reverse effect of what they anticipated, and I would suggest that for the future it should be an established rule of the Association that those who go to Wimbledon as marksmen and representatives of the Active Militia of Canada, should reside in camp. The Canadian Camp has always been a centre of attraction to visitors, and the personal representation of the Canadian Militia upon Wimbledon Common is most important from a public or national point of view: if the Team as a body were allowed to remain out of camp, under the plea of physical weakness, it would reflect seriously upon the physique of Canadians generally, as well as on that of the Defensive Force of the country.

General Sir Garnet Welseley, Quarter-Master General, upon application kindly placed at our disposal the ranges at Wormwood Scrubs on Friday and Saturday, the 9th and 10th of July. I thought it most desirable to give the Team the opportunity of practicing on a range and in an atmosphere similar to that at Wimbledon, and accordingly gave directions for the Team to proceed to Putney, on Thursday, by the Midland Railway, and, on arrival, quartered them at the Oxford House Hotel until Saturday

afternoon.

On Saturday, the 10th of July, at 6.30 p.m., everything being in

readiness, the Team went into camp at Wimbledon.

The success of the Team as prize-winners, although not up to their expectations, was not so very far behind that of previous years. "Queen's," at the two first ranges, Private S. Graham, of the 25th Battalion, succeeded in scoring 66, and placing himself thirteenth in the list, the highest score being 68. Quarter Master Sergeant Stenhouse, of the P. W. R., scoring 64; but when the hour for the Team to fire at the 600 yards range came, the weather was most unfavorable and quite destroyed their prospects. I would suggest for the future that in the "Queen's," and in some of the other matches, the Executive Committee of the National Rifle Association be asked that the Canadians be not all squadded to shoot at the same hour, but that they may be so distributed

to fire during the day, that the varying changes of the weather at any par-

ticular moment might not injuriously affect the whole Team.

In the match for the Kolapore Cup, the Canadian eight did remarkably well at 200 yards and at 600 yards, the Home Team beating them only by four points at the former range, and by one point at the latter; but at 500 yards I regret to have to say our men failed most seriously, and I am compelled to record the want of success on the part of the Canadians.

The Canadian Camp was honored by the presence of many distinguished persons, including H. S. H. the Duke of Teck, General Sir Garnet Wolseley, who addressed the Team in terms of congratulation; Lord Kimberley, Secretary of State for the Colonies, and Lieut-General Sir Selby Smythe, lately commanding the Canadian Militia, who also addressed the Team. The Rt. Sir John A. Macdonald, Prime Minister; Sir Charles Tupper, of Railways; Sir Alexander Galt; and other prominent Canadians also visited the Camp, and met the Secretary for the Colonies and other distinguished noblemen and gentlemen at luncheon in the Camp on Thursday the 22nd. Sir John Rose, Bart., who so generously presented a prize for competition, to the Dominion Rifle Association, was thanked on behalf of the Association, by myself, as the officer commanding, in the presence of the Team.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge inspected the Team on Saturday the 24th, and addressed them in complimentary and encouraging

terms.

The prizes were distributed on Saturday afternoon by Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales in the presence of a large number of spectators, and on Monday at 9 a.m. the Canadian Camp broke up.

The Team were well and correctly dressed and presented on parade a regular and soldierlike appearance. As regards the conduct and demeanour of the members of the Team, I issued on the 24th an order of which the

following is an extract:

"The Lt.-Col. Commanding cannot allow the Team to separate "without thanking each member individually on behalf of the Dominion "Rifle Association, for the exemplary behaviour which has marked the "conduct of the Team, both individually and collectively from the day the "Team first assembled at Quebec -as an Officer of the Active Militia of "Canada, he desires to express the great satisfaction and pride he has "experienced when commanding them on parade; their soldierlike appear-"ance and steadiness have been such as to reflect credit upon the Force "which they represent."

I might add that the Team distributed hundreds of the pamphlets issued by the Dominion and Ontario Governments on the desirability of Canada as a field for immigration; such information being circulated among so intelligent a body of men as the marksmen at Wimbledon, who came from all parts of the United Kingdom, must be followed by good

results.

I enquired for the articles belonging to the Dominion Rifle Association, as per list on page 41°. of last year's report, and could not find them (see replies) except a few worn out flags which were in possession of Messrs. Atkinson & Co. I was compelled to purchase a new flag lettered "Canada," and two small flags for the team marquee. I would suggest that certain articles such as are hired annually, should be purchased by the Association, and that permission be obtained from the National Rifle Association to have them, with the flags and other property of the Dominion Rifle Association deposited in their stores at Wimbledon.

I would also suggest that for the future neither of the officers in command of the Team should be allowed to shoot in any of the watches

at Wimbledon.

I enclose herewith the various statements of receipts and expenditure connected with the duties entrusted to me, and which I trust will be found satisfactory; the additional expenditure referred to, for tent floors, flags, &c., as well as for the entrance fees for the 2nd officer, have swelled the amount above what I would have wished, but these in a measure were beyond my control.

I have to express our thanks to Earl Stanhope, Chairman, Capt. Mildmay, Secretary, and to all the other officers of the National Rifle Association, as well as to Colonel Phillips and the Camp Cfficers, for the

great courtesy and consideration shown to the Canadians.

In conclusion I would desire to express my regret at having been deprived of the President's presence in Camp, and of his valuable aid and experience in the various Camp details, as well as in the more pleasing duties of hospitality. I am satisfied that the annual representation of the active Militia of Canada on Wimbledon Common, is of more importance to Canada than is generally supposed. The object to be gained is not alone the winning of a few prizes; but a fair assertion annually made there of Canada's position in the British Empire among such an influential and representative body of Englishmen, must attract to Canada an attention which could not otherwise be drawn to it; and I am sure all Canadians who have visited Wimbledon must feel deeply grateful to our President, Lieut, Col. Gzowski, for the efforts he has continually made in securing this representation, and for the prominence he has given to Canada's position there.

CONSTITUTION

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

- 1.—That this Association be denominated "The Dominion of Canada Rifle Association."
- 2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2 00, and paying the same before the 1st day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.
- 3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

- 4 .- Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion not less than \$20.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in the proportion of one to every dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when selected, to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him previous to the Annual Prize Meeting Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its bona fide members. The winner of such medal being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an Officer retired retaining rank to be entitled to compete free of all entrance fees in the Dominion of Canada and Affiliated Association Matches, at the First Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the Medal. Provided name of the winner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.
- 5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

- 6.—There shall be a President to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8.—There shall be a Council composed of Forty-eight Members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:

Fourteen, [14] from Ontario,
Ten, [10] " Quebec,
Six, [6] " New Brunswick,
Six, [6] " Nova Scotia,
Four [4] " Manitoba,
Four, [4] " British Columbia,
Four, [4] " P. Edward Island.

one half in each case to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their annual meetings; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, on or before the day of the annual business meeting in each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

- 9.—The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.
- 10.—The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee consisting of fifteen (15) of its members. Five (5) to be a quorum.
- 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, being members of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.
- 13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do, all such acts and deeds, as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may, from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.
- 15.—The Council may, from time to time, make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.
- 16.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent by mail to members of the Association at least one menth previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

- 18.—The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business shall be held at Ottawa on the third Wednesday after the Assembling of the general session of the Parliament of the Dominion, At the close of such Annual Meeting or any adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.
- 19.—A General meeting shall be reld on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.
- 20.—No alterations in the constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month at least previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21.—The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

General By-Laws of the Association.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1377.

Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second on the first day of the annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct,—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting,—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the Members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council to keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to the inspection of any member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council to be chosen at the first meeting.

Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such charreceived in tered Bank as a Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association,

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of a general nature are to be made only nature upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual Accounts.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.
