Agricultural.

The Humming of Leaves.

Those who are familiar with Dr. Hedges' famous experiment, showing the rapid evaporation of moisture by leaves, will not commit the frequent mistakes made by unskillful cultivators. He placed a mass of growing turf under a gold bell glass, and in two minutes the grass condensed on the glass, and ran in drops down its sides. Plants pump the water from the soil, and their leaves discharge it in the form of invisible moisture into the air. A garden-er once remarked that the weeds grow up among his crops answered a valuable purpose of shading the ground, and preventing the soil from drying out. The soil—not being aware that they were drawing up the water, and discharging it into the air many times faster than a clean, mellow soil. If Dr. Hedges had placed a dish of growing leaves in his bell glass instead of growing leaves, it would have had little effect. The experiment is performed in another way. Cut off twigs from a fruit tree, and remove the leaves from the twigs, and wrap them in paper. Throw them down in the sunshine. In a few hours the shoots to which the leaves are attached will be found shriveled and wrinkled from the loss of their moisture. The leaves, when removed, are found to be plump and fresh. And yet ignorant persons, not aware of this operation, have let the leaves on the shoots, and have let them out for budding under the mistaken notion that the leaves would protect from drying!
