HORRIBLE MASSACRE OF JEWS.

London, May 14.—The desperate economic situation in south-west Russia between Odessa and the Rumanian frontier has been brought to a crisis by the recent massacre of the Jews, which is feared will be repeated as the racial and labor conflict in that region remains at a complete deadlock.
