On behalf of McGill University I desire to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 29th 1919, and also of the Medal to which you refer in this communication.

We are deeply touched by the sentiments expressed in this letter, and the Medal is, I can assure you, a gift which is very highly prized by McGill University and which will ever be treasured as a tribute from the great Mother University of Paris to McGill as a recognition of the sacrifices which we have made towards the winning of the Great War.

The Medal has been placed in the Redpath Museum of McGill, and I am enclosing an extract from one of the Daily papers of the City of Montreal in which a public announcement of this gift is made.

Two or three days ago I handed over to the Redpath Museum for exhibition and safe-keeping the Medal which had just been presented to McGill University by the University of Paris.

I am enclosing herewith a letter from the Vice-Rector of the University of Paris to the President of McGill University which refers to this Medal and to the reasons which moved the University of Paris to have it struck off and copies of it presented to the Universities of the Allied Countries.

There is also a letter from the Consul General of France, which accompanied the Medal.
