MR. CHAMBERLAIN TELLS HIM BRITAIN WILL BE REPECTED.

The President of the Transvaal invited to Cross the Water and Explain Himself—Outlanders Fratricide for the Pacific Nature of Their Aspirations Against Aggression Worthy of the Dark Ages.

London, Feb. 8.—The despatch of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, of Feb. 4, to the Governor of Cape Colony, Sir Hercules Robinson, was gazetted last evening.

It reviews the history of events in the Transvaal since 1891, and points out that the mining interests, the majority of the country, are mainly in the hands of Uitlanders, who are debared by legislation from the rights of citizenship.

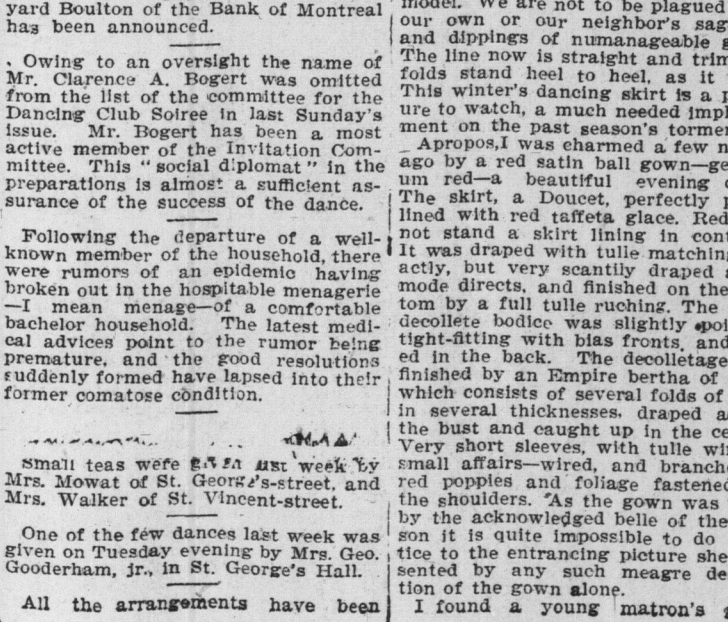
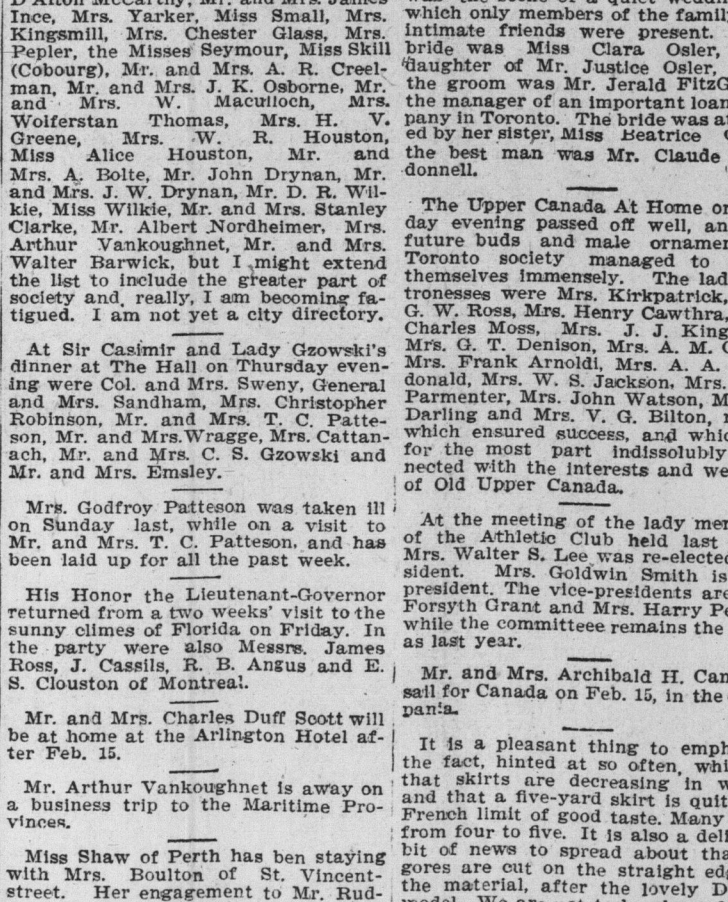
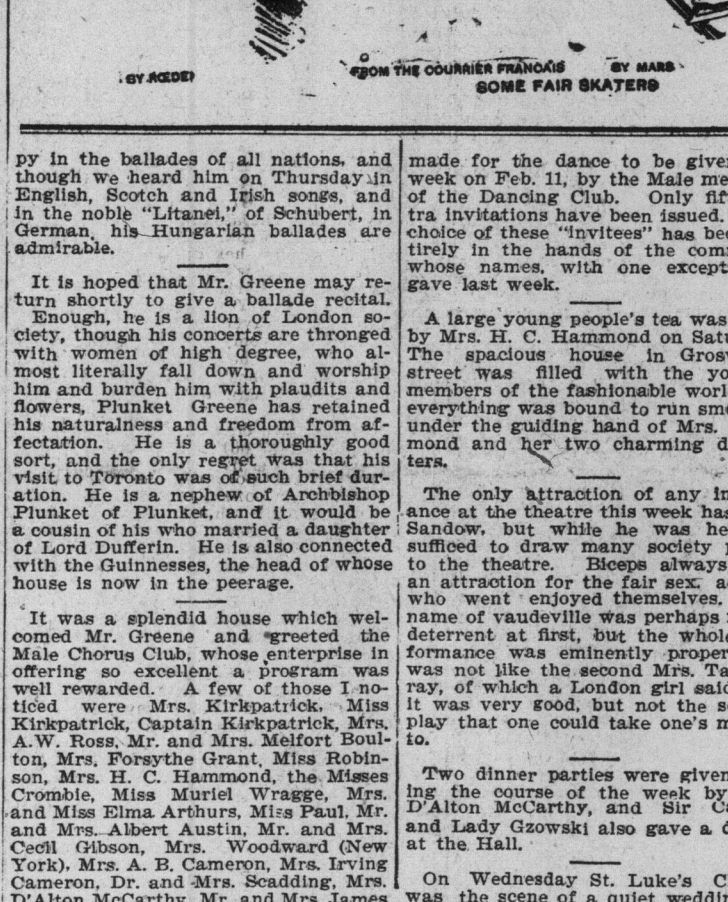
