

SPECIAL SESSION.

FIRST DAY.

Wednesday the 4th March, 1863, being the day appointed, by the Assistant Minister of the Cathedral for the Meeting of the Synod for the purpose of "electing a successor to the See:"—Divine Service, including the administration of the Holy Communion, was held in the Cathedral at 10, 2, m.

Morning prayer was said by Rev. R. G. Plees and Rev. G. J. Magill.

The Ante-Communion Office was said by Rev. G. V. Housman.

The Epistle was read by Rev. A. W. Mountain.

The Sermon was preached by the Rev. J. W. Williams, Professor of Belles Lettres in the University of Bishop's College, Lennoxville, and Rector of the Junior Department.

The Rev. S. S. Wood consecrated, and was assisted by the Revd. Dr. Nicolls, Revd. A. W. Mountain, and Revd. G. V. Housman, in distributing the elements.

At 2 p. m., the Rev. G. V. Housman took the Chair, in the Lecture Hall, Anne St., and called the Synod to order.

EVENING SESSION.

The Synod reassembled at 7.30 P. M.

All Clergymen of the Church, present in Quebec and all Lay Members of the Provincial Synod were invited to take a seat on the floor of the House.

Moved by Mr. Geo. Irvine, seconded by Mr. Andrews, Sr.: That Robert Hamilton, Esquire, having a regular certificate as Delegate be admitted to take his seat.

Moved in amendment by Mr. E. J. Hemming, seconded

by Mr. W. G. Wurtele:

That whereas it appears by the Journal of Proceedings that another delegate has already been elected to the mission in question, and has been legally summoned to attend the present Synod, and that there is no sufficient evidence before this Synod that the said Delegate has resigned, or that his office has otherwise become vacant, the certificate granted to Mr. Robert Hamilton be declared null and void.

The Chairman informed the meeting that he had received letters from the Rev. L. C. Wurtele, Rev. E. G. W. Ross, Rev. S. Crosse, and Rev. Dr. Adamson, expressing regret that they were unable to attend.

The Clerical Secretary read a letter from the Rev. Saltern Givins, Honorary Secretary of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, enclosing a resolution adopted by that body at a Special Meeting held on 11th February last, expressing "its sense of the great value of the services "rendered to the Church of Canada by the late Lord Bishop of Quebec, during his long and laborious career, "as well as by the character of deep and gentle piety by "which through life he was distinguished."

He also read resolutions adopted at the General Meeting of the Church Society of the Diocese of Montreal, held on 21st January last, "expressing the profound sorrow felt by "the members of that body for the loss sustained by the "Church in Canada, by the removal of the late Lord Bishop "of Quebec, and tendering their sympathy to the Diocese

"and to the bereaved family of the late Bishop."

Moved by H. S. Scott, Esq., seconded by Rev. H. Roe. That this Synod being now fully organized, desires to express its sense of the great loss which this Diocese has sustained by the removal of the late beloved and lamented Lord Bishop, whose patience and urbanity as its President, his devotion to the advancement of the interests of the Church, and the personal sacrifices he was always ready to make in its cause, had secured for him the affectionate reverence of all who had the happiness to be placed under his charge, and that this resolution be conveyed to the family of our late beloved Bishop.

Carried by all the members of the Synod standing in

solemn silence.

That the Synod do now proceed to ballot silently for a person to fill the office of Bishop of the Diocese of Quebec, and that they continue to ballot (adjournments excepted) until some person has received the number of votes necessary for a choice.

That the following be the order of proceedings:

1.—That the vote be taken by ballot.

2.—That there shall be no formal proposal of names, but the ballot shall bring forth all names desired by each member.

3.—That before balloting permission be given to members to address the meeting, avoiding all invidious

remarks subjecting to a call of order.

4.—That the ballot shall continue until the vote shall culminate to the number requisite for a choice.—Lost on a division.

That, inasmuch as it is desirable, in the best interests of the Church, that a contested election for a Successor to the vacant see of Quebec should if possible be avoided, a Committee of Conference, consisting of clerical delegates and lay delegates, fairly representing the different opinions held by the various members of this Synod, be named for the purpose of conferring together and ascertaining whether they can unanimously recommend to this Synod any nominee duly qualified to fulfil the high office of Bishop of this Diocese; and that the said committee consist of Rev. E. W. Sewell, A. J. Woolryche, R. Short, H. Roe, C. Hamilton, A. Balfour, and Messrs. H. S. Scott, W. Wurtele, Hon. E. Hale, G. Irvine, H. N. Jones, W. R. Doak.—Lost.
