THIRTY-SIXTH SESSION

*(Being the Nineteenth under the Synod Act of Incorporation of 1874.)*

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened at London, on Tuesday, June 20th, 1893.

Divine Service was held in the new Cronyn Hall, as St. Paul's Cathedral was undergoing renovation.

The sermon was preached by Rev. Canon A. C. Hill, rector of Trinity Church, St. Thomas, from Neh. iv. 4:8.

The Holy Communion was administered to the Clergy and Lay Representatives by the Lord Bishop assisted by the Venerable J. W. Marsh, Archdeacon of London, and Revs. Canon Evans Davis, Canon J. B. Richardson and Canon W. A. Young.

The Synod assembled at 3.00 p.m., in the new Cronyn Hall, for business.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The appointed prayers were said by the Ven. Archdeacon of London.

The rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were then called when 83 Clergymen and 62 Lay Representatives answered to their names.

The ballot papers were, in accordance with the Canon, distributed to the members as their names were called.

2. That 7 Certificates give no names of Representatives but only of Church Wardens, viz :  
Port Elgin, Berkeley, Heathcote, Ravenna, Banks, Kimberley, Duncan.
3. That two Certificates give no report, viz : St. Paul's Holmedale, and Merlin.
4. That one Certificate contains only the names of Church Wardens but no signature, viz : St. Matthew's, Sydenham
5. That one Certificate returning one Representative bears the date of election, June 13th, when the constitution requires that Lay Representatives be elected annually *during Easter Week*, viz : Trinity Church, Waterford.
6. The following Congregations have sent two Representatives :—St. George's, Owen Sound, no number of registered voters ; Trivitt Memorial Church, Exeter, only 30 registered voters ; St. George's Church, Thorndale, only 14 registered voters.
7. The following congregations have applied for reduction of Assessment viz:

### THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

His Lordship then delivered his annual address to the Synod.

REVEREND BRETHREN AND BRETHREN OF THE LAITY :

DEAR FRIENDS,—Before entering upon my charge, I must offer you an apology for not having a prepared written address before me. The necessities of time have been too great, and opportunities too few to enable me to do so, and therefore, trusting that under the circumstances I shall have your generous forgiveness, I shall begin without further delay.

And *first*, I must record my deep sense of thankfulness to God for the many benefactions which both Mrs. Baldwin and myself have received at His loving hands during our long and eventful journey ; for when I contemplate all the stormy seas which we have crossed, and perils in distant lands which we have encountered and see how we have been brought back in perfect peace, without injury, accident or loss, I cannot but gratefully confess how great is His mercy and how infinite His love.

I acknowledge also His constant care in watching over and keeping you throughout the past, and firmly do I believe, that as we advance in the work of the Synod, we shall see more and more reason to take courage for the future.

You naturally expect that I will make some reference to my late journey, and especially that I should give you some of the deeper impressions which my wanderings in foreign lands are calculated to convey.

Before entering upon particulars, and speaking now in a general way, I have much pleasure in making the assertion that all I have seen in the East only confirms in my mind the faith once delivered to the saints, and corroborates the conviction of many that the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

I have gazed since I saw you last, upon the ruins of two ancient civilizations and the deep impression which these spectacles have

made upon my mind will never lightly be effaced. I refer first to the ruins of mysterious Egypt, and secondly to those of Imperial Rome. Having journeyed from Alexandria to Masr the magnificent, known to us as Cairo, and from Cairo to Assouan and the first cataract of the Nile, having gazed upon the crumbling pyramids, and looked into the face of that impassive Sphinx that has watched without a tremor the rise and fall of dynasties, having wandered amid the gigantic ruins of Thebes, of Luxor and of Karnak, and penetrated the long and dusty corridors where, amid the silence of the Libyan hills, have slept for ages the mummied Pharaohs of the never-to-be-forgotten past; having seen, I say, all these most impressive sights, I am in a position to speak of them to-day in a manner impossible for me before.

Two lessons of surpassing value I have learned from them, the recital of which may not be unprofitable to you.

The *First* of these is:—

*The utter inability of man to perpetuate a false and pernicious religion.*

The *Second*:—

*The Divinity of Christian Religion as evidenced by its indestructibility in time.*

As I walked amid the ruins of Luxor and Karnak, I saw, as other travellers have seen before me, the gigantic, almost incredible efforts which man has made to perpetuate his religion. All that architecture could devise, all that Cyclopien hands could execute may be found in rich and marvellous profusion here. Babylon and Assyria might build in brick, Greece and Rome in marble and limestone but Egypt would have nothing but granite and syenite. She built in time what she thought would outlive all time, and live untouched amid the ruins of all else beside.

Then having done this, on pillar and pediment, on arch and gateway, in the recesses of their tombs, and on the fronts of their bewildering temples they pictured the figures, the actions and the religion of their gods. What was temporal they deemed to be eternal, and what was only human they worshipped as Divine. All that was in the power of man they did most certainly do to perpetuate their religion. Deep in the rock their faith was cut, but all has been in vain. To-day, as the traveller wanders amid these tombs and temples, these colossal statues and obelisks, he sees the vast fissures, the gaping rents which time has made, and finds that all the pomp of

ancient Egypt with all its imaginary gods has crumbled to decay—a sermon of the venerable past preached to the nations and peoples of the present.

So too, as I walked amid the ruins of Imperial Rome, and saw the splintered fragments of her former glory, the attestation which her present position affords to our faith was the deepest lesson I could learn. The Colosseum is sacred with the blood of Saints who for the truth of Christ witnessed a good confession and died with their garments pure. All is now enveloped in death. The crowds that once hooted in the circus, and sought by fire and wild beast to destroy the church, are all gone—every voice is silent in the dust, but the church which they endeavored to extinguish is living in all the vigor and buoyancy of youth. The rude soldiers that followed in the triumph of Titus, bearing the sacred vessels of the temple are all gone, but Israel, whose downfall that triumph was intended to celebrate, is living still, and while the bones of the conqueror can no longer be recognized in the clods in the valley the conqueror are now sitting upon the high places of the earth.

The mere dry bones of ancient facts do not constitute the real history of the past. The dry bones have to be clothed with flesh, and the flesh itself animated with life before we can appreciate history and learn the lessons it is calculated to convey. From the present date to the call of Abraham we can look up through the long vista of four thousand years, and though God's designs are vast, yet surely we can discern how in that long stretch of time He has defended and conserved the truth. All the kingdoms, empires and states which existed at the beginning of this era, and which came within the range of the Word of God have been swept away, with the solitary exception of one nation in whom the truth has dwelt. The preservation of Israel is one of the mighty miracles of the past, her survival amid the wreck and overthrow of states attests God's consigning love and care, and demonstrates how enormous is the distinction which He makes between the good and the evil, between the false and the true. The church, which Christ has purchased with His own blood, after eighteen hundred years of weary pilgrimage, has to-day the freshness and vigor of youth, for amid the dislocation of all things human, God has written "eternity" upon her brow, and made her partaker of His endless life. The existence of the church throughout all the storms, persecutions and manifold trials she has had to encounter in the eighteen hundred years of her pilgrimage constitutes an irrefragable proof of her Divine origin and life.

Allow me now to refer to another subject which at this time particularly calls for our thoughtful, serious care. I refer to the present state of faith with regard to the Word of God.

It is impossible for any one who is at all conversant with the religious opinions of his age to be ignorant of the fact that on every side men are advancing to assail the great citadel of truth—the inspired Word of God. In comparison with this, all other controversies sink into utter insignificance. Ordinary matters of dispute in the church are *concerning* the faith, this is whether there is *any* faith at all, others affect the superstructure, this the foundation itself, and if the foundation be destroyed what can the righteous do? The school of so-called “higher criticism” which has arisen in our day is one which demands more than a passing notice from the Bishops and Pastors of the flock. Proceeding on the vicious principle that the Bible is only human and fallible, but that all criticism is inspired, it seeks to subvert in one dire overthrow the faith of multitudes and to leave them hopeless in the great sea of doubt and despair.

Most earnestly do I desire to impress upon you, the Clergy of this vast and important Diocese, that if you wish to carry out the principles of your holy religion—and I am confident you do wish to do so—and to build up your people in the faith, then high up in a place by itself, and invested with the awful holiness of God you must place the inspired word of Truth. It was thus God honored it in the past, it is thus you must honor it now. The ancient copy of the law was ordered by God to be placed in the very holy of holies, under the wings of the Cherubim in His immediate and awful presence. So too, our Saviour honored the Scriptures. “In the volume of the Book it is written,” He said, “of me.” In these same Scriptures He found the pathway His own hallowed feet were to tread from the manger-cradle in Bethlehem to Calvary, and from Calvary to Bethany and the heights of glory. When tempted or assailed either by His friends or His foes to turn aside for a moment from His inflexible purpose, He invariably refused with this answer: “How, then can the Scriptures be fulfilled?” They were the guide and arbiter of all His ways, the solemn inscrutable limit beyond which it was impossible even for Him to pass.

Look at Him in His agony and bloody sweat, the one mysterious power which bound Him, as it were, in His position, and tied the strong arms of omnipotence; was His absolute consecration to the will of God as expressed in the volume of His book. When, therefore, we contrast this awful—this Divine dignity with which the Saviour ever invested the Holy Scriptures with the haughty, impudent, blasphemous writings of this so-called school of “higher criticism,” we cannot but be amazed at the bold effrontery of professing christian men. What the Lord Jesus Christ honors, we must honor, and what he calls holy we must call holy too. Only think what these men ask. They ask that we should give up Moses,

David, the Prophets of the old testament and the Apostles of the new, supported by all the authority of the Lord Himself, for their own erring word. No, never! We know that our blessed Lord believed in the holy Scriptures, and we take our stand forever at His side:

THE CONFEDERATION OF THE CHURCH IN BRITISH NORTH AMERICA.

You are aware of some of the difficulties which the measure to confederate the church in Canada has already encountered, and though they are by no means as yet surmounted, some substantial progress has already been effected, and bright prospects are opening on us for the future. To quote the words of Gerald Massey:—

"We're beaten back in many a fray,  
But newer strength we borrow,  
For where the vanguard camps to-day  
The rear shall rest to-morrow."

The General Synod, summoned to meet in Toronto in September next, will be, if the Lord permit us so to gather, the most important convocation ever assembled in Canada in connection with our church. Not only are there expected to be present delegates from all parts of the vast area of British North America, but the work before the synod is no less than that of laying the foundations of the whole future polity of the church.

Of the difficulties before us, and they are many, the most serious will be that of clothing the new governing body with powers adequate to its position. Power it must of necessity have; and the only question is, from what existing body are we going to subtract it? Now, we can never create a new governing body without subtracting all its power from some select community in which it has previously resided. That select community in this instance is the Provincial Synod of Canada. Should, therefore, in the providence of God, the plan for the formation of a General Synod be brought to a successful completion, whatever the future jurisdiction of the Provincial Synod may be, one thing is certain, it can never again hold the position it does to-day. True it is, that the Provincial Synod at its last session asserted its determination not to part with any of its powers, but if this resolution were strictly adhered to, it would effectually negative any effort to form such a General Synod as the church has now in contemplation.

Two most important facts must be borne in mind:—*First*, that the General Synod, if it is to be efficient as the great governing

body of the church in Canada, must be seised with all necessary powers, even though it be at the expense of present arrangements, and *secondly*, that the Diocesan Synods must be allowed to retain their freedom of action and the possession of all those powers which they at present enjoy. Diocesan liberty has been exercised throughout the whole regime of the Provincial Synod, let us take good care that it be not forfeited under that of the General. For while anxious for the unity of the church in Canada, we do not want it at the expense of all that local liberty which is so essential for the proper development of the work. These two points, therefore, will of necessity constitute the gravest anxieties in connection with the proposed meeting of the General Synod. I wish also to state, that even after this large subtraction from the powers of the Provincial Synod has been made, there will still remain much that it, and it only can properly perform. Its usefulness will by no means be destroyed; it will still have a name, a visible reality and the possession of such power as may be deemed necessary for the transaction of its somewhat contracted duties.

You will be called upon to elect representatives to this our first great General Synod, and a great honor will rest on all those who may be chosen to so distinguished an office. Confident I am that you all, desiring to maintain the unity of this our glorious and historic church, will do all in your power to facilitate the work of the proposed Synod, and to make it by a wise and judicious legislation the supreme but not oppressive head of the church in Canada.

#### HURON COLLEGE.

You are doubtless aware that the college edifice has been greatly enlarged, and that we have now the most ample accommodation for all those who desire to enroll themselves among its members, so that nothing is left to be desired as far as the building is concerned.

Our teaching staff has also been increased, there being now not only the honored principal, the Rev. Herbert Gordon Miller, M. A., but also the Rev. Charles Henry Andras, M. A., Sen. Opt., of Cambridge in 1860, and lately 2nd master of Royal Grammar School, Lancaster. Mr. Andras is professor in the college and a most able assistant to the principal. In addition to the above, the Rev. Simeon Gottfried Edelstein, incumbent of Glanworth, lectures twice in the week, on Hebrew, and the Rev. Arthur Rhodes acts as tutor.

I wish to say that the Huron Council has been taking into its most serious consideration some means by which the college may enlist to a larger extent the sympathies of the Diocese, and though

I am not in a position to affirm anything as to results, yet I would like the Synod to understand that whatever the council can do, it will do for the advancement of a spirit of union and to enlist the good will of the members of the Diocese.

You will hear with pleasure that one of our students, Mr. A. H. Sherwood has passed the Provincial Board of Preliminary Examiners which, as their papers are searching, is creditable to himself.

#### THE FINANCES OF THE DIOCESE.

I am unable, having so lately returned from abroad, to dwell at any length upon this subject, but I greatly regret having to announce that there is an over-draft of \$4605.71 which we have to meet in the course of the present year. There is consolation in the thought that the fact of this deficiency may lead us not only to examine into all its causes but also endeavor to place the needs of the Diocese in a more clear and palpable light before the community at large. In any further consideration of the whole subject of our finances, three suggestions might be made as to deviation from our present plans.

*First*, the propriety, or non-propriety, of separating our Mission Fund proper from the Clergy Commutation Fund.

*Secondly*, the advisability of having a yearly assessment on each parish throughout the Diocese for the maintenance of the Mission Fund, as at present in force in the Diocese of Montreal.

*Thirdly*, the need of having some descending scale in the making of grants to necessitous places.

It may possibly be that none of these suggestions may be adopted, but they at least contain some elements for serious consideration.

As a practicable method of meeting the present distress, I would suggest that we all ourselves increase our contributions to the Mission Fund at least twenty-five per cent. which will go no inconsiderable way toward meeting the debt which has just been incurred.

#### THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

I note with the deepest gratitude the work of the Women's Auxiliary in this Diocese. Whether I look upon the noble work it is doing in the great Northwest, in relieving so many missions, and in cheering them with substantial help, or regard the reflex influence which this activity has both upon themselves and others at home, I see accumulating evidence as to the internal excellence of the

society and to the vast benefit which it is conferring upon the Diocese at large. I recognize womens' work in the church as ordained of God, and when rightly directed, certain to advance the Redeemer's glory not only at home but abroad. In the LXVIII. Psalm David says :—"The Lord gave the word, the women who published the glad tidings is a great host." From this we see that women have a great work in the church of Christ which they do well to fulfill, and we should ever pray that abounding grace may be given them to consecrate more and more their time and talents to the blessed service of their Lord.

#### OBITUARY NOTICE.

It is my melancholy duty to record the demise of one who has been for many years a real mother in Israel. I refer to the late Mrs. Adam Elliott, of the Mohawk Reserve, whose kindness and devotion to the Indians and unbounded hospitality to all travellers, has made her name fragrant throughout the diocese. Her husband, the late Rev. Adam Elliott, though born in England had studied Divinity under the first Bishop of Toronto, and was ordained by the Bishop of Quebec. Mr. Elliott was appointed Incumbent of St. John's Church, Tuscarora as far back as 1837 and was distinguished by his saintliness of life and great devotion to his work. The memory of the just is blessed, and surely of one whose life was so beautiful with the indwelling Grace of God, and whose time was so unreservedly given to the spiritual and social developement of the Indians among whom she lived, we can say with all meetness "Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord from henceforth ; Yea, saith the Spirit that they may rest from their labors, and their works do follow them."

**Receiving Report of Executive Committee.**

The annual report of the Executive Committee was then read and distributed in printed form. The printed audited accounts were also placed in the hands of the members of the Synod.

The Executive Committee present herewith their annual report :—

Your Committee beg to report that the total collections and free-will offerings for the year just closed amounted to \$21448.83, being a slight increase over that of the preceding year. It will be seen, however, by reference to the printed accounts, that while the offerings for objects outside the Diocese on the whole show a large increase, there has been a large decrease in the offerings for our Diocesan purposes.

**PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION COLLECTIONS.**

The amount of these collections received was \$5105.90 as compared with \$5272.11 for the previous year, a decrease of \$166.21. Of the amount collected, various items amounting to \$3128.99 have been paid, including \$484.00 to Lay Readers, Indian Interpreters and School Teachers; \$620.00 transferred to the Widows and Orphans' Fund and \$287.40 for special grants, &c., and the remainder, \$2086.91, has been carried to the credit of the Maintenance and Mission Fund.

The other credits include \$9766.77 from the Interest Account and \$258.45, to which your Committee refers with pleasure, from the W.A.M.A. for Lions Head Mission. The donations amount to \$80.25, of which \$75.00 was given by a Clergyman on the Fund, and being one of his quarterly cheques. The disbursements for the year amounted to \$19851.98, leaving the large overdraft of \$4605.71.

Your Committee would recommend that a Committee of Synod be appointed to consider the subject of the above deficiency and to suggest some means whereby the present difficulty may be met, and the fund be placed on such a basis as to prevent such recurrence in the future. Such Committee to report to the Executive Committee at its earliest convenience.

**DOMESTIC MISSIONS.**

The Ascensiontide (1892) collection for Domestic Missions amounted to \$1106.61 as compared with \$1445.53 in 1891 and \$919.48 in 1890; but your Committee takes great pleasure in drawing your attention to the collection made in August last, after the St. John's, Newfoundland, fire, which amounted to the large sum of \$1729.25.

## HURON COLLEGE

The collections made on Thanksgiving Day for Huron College amounted to \$675.94 as compared with \$574.39 for the previous year, being an increase of \$101.55.

## WIDOWS AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This fund still continues to be in a most satisfactory position. The two half yearly collections amounted to \$1293.33 (as against \$1257.32 for the previous year); the annual subscriptions and entrance fees to \$425 and donations \$3, which with the balance from the previous year (\$943.35), the interest on invested funds, (\$3656.79) and \$620 from the General Purpose Fund, have been sufficient to pay all claims in full, amounting to \$4768.50, and to transfer \$932.78 to the Capital Account which now amounts to \$65,500.00.

Two widows have died during the year, Mrs. Smyth, widow of the late Rev. James Smyth, and Mrs. Evans, widow of the late Rev. W. B. Evans. Two orphans take the place of the latter on the fund.

## SUPERANNUATION.

Three Clergymen have been superannuated during the year, the Ven. Archdeacon Mulholland, who had served 43 years within the limits of the Diocese, the Rev. Wm. Daunt, who had served 27 years in the Diocese, and the Rev. R. W. Johnstone, 27 years. One other application is now before the Committee.

## SYNOD EXPENSE ACCOUNT.

The Synod assessments received during the year amounted to \$1012, and while the expenses are in some respects lower than last year—the printing account alone showing a decrease of over \$300.00—the account stood overdrawn at the end of the year, \$251.47, notwithstanding the balance of \$257.46 carried over from the past year. This overdraft has been caused for the most part by the

transfer of the See House Debt from the Capital of the Episcopal and Archdeacons' Fund to that of the General Purposes Fund, the interest on which is credited to the Synod Expense Account.

#### SEE HOUSE DEBT.

This debt is the same as last year, \$14918.37. Your Committee exceedingly regret that the Rev. Canon Young has been unable to undertake the work of collecting for this object.

#### CONSOLIDATED INVESTMENT ACCOUNT.

The Consolidated Capital Account now amounts to \$689450.55, upon which interest at the rate of 5.96% has been earned for the year just closed. Payments on loans have been on the whole satisfactorily made, and although the rate is about 1-10% less than that of last year, some reduction was however anticipated in view of the lower rates of interest at which money has been obtainable.

The consolidation of the funds continues to give every satisfaction and is proving not only a great convenience to the Clergy and others interested, but is working satisfactorily in every other respect.

#### CONSOLIDATION OF THE CHURCH IN CANADA.

A meeting of the General Synod on the amended basis of the Winnipeg Conference has been called by the Metropolitan of this Ecclesiastical Province to meet in Toronto in September next, and it will be necessary, should this Synod approve thereof, to make some provision for meeting our share of the expenses.

#### DEPOSITORY.

The Depository continues to be largely made use of by our Sunday Schools and others for the purchase of selected books and supplies at reduced rates. The sales for the year amounted to \$1686.17.

#### ST. JAMES' CHURCH, WILMOT.

Your Committee beg to acknowledge the receipt from the Executors of the late Wm. Illingworth, of the sum of \$400, the income thereof to be paid towards the stipend of the Incumbent of St. James' Church, Wilmot, an example which it is to be hoped will be more generally and largely followed.

#### ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL.

In consideration of the excellent security offered on the St. Paul's Church property for the loan of \$10,000 to be advanced for the purpose of erecting new buildings to be used by the Synod, and other improvements, and the interest which the Diocese takes in the same, an application for an increase of the loan to \$15,000 by the Rector and Churchwardens of St. Paul's, at the same rate of interest as the original loan, has been made.

Your Committee take pleasure in being able to congratulate the Synod in meeting for the first time in this new and comfortable hall. The building when completed, it is hoped, will meet every requirement and be both convenient and suitable.

### Report of Committee on Temperance.

1. The Committee is pleased to be able to report that Temperance matters are occupying a large share of public attention and that there is a growing recognition of their importance. Voluntary efforts and organizations are being recognized and acknowledged more than ever by the Church, and the work is not wholly relegated to paid agents and agencies, however much in earnest they may be. It is the duty of the church to rescue the perishing; and this she is striving to do in many ways, notably by means of the "Church of England Temperance Society," which is doing great work in England under the patronage of the Queen, and by the aid of Archbishops, Bishops, Clergy and Laity. It has agents at many of the Police Courts to rescue and help the victims of drink and to befriend them in their attempts to lead a virtuous life.

2. In this diocese (though for divers reasons it has not been found possible to do a great deal under the Society's banner) there are several branches of the C. E. T. S., and sermons have been preached and lectures have been delivered by its friends, while some of the literature of the parent society has been distributed. The Rev. W. M. Seaborn, East London P.O., and Rev. W. J. Taylor, Diocesan Secretary C. E. T. S., St. Marys P. O., (members of the committee) may be communicated with at any time as to the delivery of sermons or addresses on temperance topics. The last named (who has done most earnest service in his position of Diocesan Secretary) or Rev. Canon Smith, also a Diocesan Secretary, will be pleased to answer any questions as to the work of the Society.

#### Report of Committee of Management of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association.

The Committee of Management of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association, beg to report :

The Committee thankfully recognise the steady progress in the Diocese of Huron and elsewhere, of the movement in the favor of the more general employment of the Laity in the work and services of the Church.

They have deemed it advisable to repeat the efforts successfully made two years since to obtain the returns of the Male Lay Workers of the Diocese, and gratefully acknowledge the kindness and promptness with which, by a large majority of the Clergy, their applications have been met. Since their circular was issued about one hundred returns have been received, and the committee attribute the delay in the appearance of others to an absorbed attention to current parochial duties, rather than to any reluctance to comply with a request made solely in the interest of the Church and its work. The reports will be carefully analysed, and the results will be laid before the annual meeting of the Association in October next.

In connection with that meeting will also be held the third convention of Lay Workers and Sunday School Teachers of the Diocese. In response to a very cordial invitation from the Clergy and Congregations of the Churches of Woodstock, the convention will meet in that town this year. The Committee appeal to the Clergy and Laity of Huron, to assist them and their co-laborers of the Sunday School Committee, in making the Convention of 1893, not less successful than its two predecessors. The Committee will be grateful for any suggestions tending in that direction with which they may be favored.

The circulation in printed form, somewhat extensively, of the reports of the Association and of the Convention's proceedings, accompanied with information obtained from other sources in relation to the Lay Help cause, has been a prominent feature in our work hitherto. Applications, both from other Canadian Dioceses and from the United States, enquiring as to our organization and constitution, have afforded pleasant indications of some good being done by our movement beyond our own borders.

The Committee are now receiving reports, in reply to a circular issued by them in regard to the utilization of Lay agency in colonial and missionary dioceses under the Anglican Episcopate. Many of these are of much interest.

The charges on Synod incurred by the Committee in the year ending April 30th, 1893, amount to seventy-five dollars and two cents.

#### RESOLUTION RE WIDOWS OF COMMUTED CLERGY

Adopted by the Executive Committee and presented to them by the Subcommittee appointed to consider whether any addition could be made to the income of the widow of the late Canon Patterson, a commuted clergyman, over and above the amount to which she is entitled from the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

*Resolved*—That in view of the excellent and disinterested spirit exhibited by the Clergy in connection with the Commutation Fund Settlement, and the sacrifices cheerfully borne by the wives of such clergy under the altered circumstances in which they were thereby placed, the Synod directs: That the widow of any commuted clergyman of the Diocese of Huron who shall have been married to such clergyman at the time of the said settlement, shall be entitled, over and above her allowance from the Widows and Orphan's Fund, to an allowance for life of one hundred dollars per annum from the General Purposes Fund, on the claims to such payments being established to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee.

### Business Sent to the Executive Committee.

#### I. —CONSOLIDATION OF CANADIAN DIOCESES.

By Mr. Charles Jenkins.

1. This Synod re-affirms its conviction that the consolidation of the several Dioceses of the Anglican Church in the Dominion of Canada and Newfoundland is in accordance with the highest interests of the Church, and that it is expedient there should be a general Synod consisting of the Bishops of the several Dioceses and representatives chosen from the Clergy and Laity by the Diocesan Synods. Such Synods to meet periodically for the consideration of matters affecting the Church's welfare and legislating thereon.

2. That with certain amendments in details, which it is hoped may commend themselves to the judgment of the General Synod, the plan of consolidation agreed to by the conference held in Winnipeg in August, 1890, affords a just and comprehensive basis for the constitution of the General Synod.

3. This Synod will accordingly proceed to elect four Clergymen and four Laymen, with as many substitutes of the respective orders, to represent this Synod at the General Synod to be held in Toronto in the month of September next ensuing.

4. That the representatives so elected be requested to present the following amendments to the Winnipeg scheme as being necessary and proper for incorporation in the constitution of the General Synod.

- (a) A larger numerical representation of the Clergy and Laity.
- (b) Meetings of the General Synod at shorter intervals than five years.
- (c) Provision for the joint deliberation of the two Houses whenever demanded by a majority of either House.

5. This Synod prays that the presence of the Great Head of the Church may be felt in all the deliberations of the General Synod, and that under the guidance of the Holy Spirit the Anglican Church in Canada and Newfoundland may as the result of consolidation present a closer bond of union among its members, an unbroken front to the enemies of truth, and a more aggressive attitude in all things appertaining to the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom.

On motion the resolution was considered clause by clause.

Clauses 1 and 2 carried.

Clause 3 amended by the words "by ballot" after the word "elect."

Clause 4 amended by the addition of the following words, "That the draft of the Constitution which shall be prepared by the proposed General Synod, shall be submitted to the Diocesan Synods for their approval before such constitution shall become binding on said Synod."

The Synod adjourned at one o'clock.

#### Annual Report of the Sunday School Committee.

The Sunday School Committee submit to the Synod the following report:—

The condition and prospects of the Depository are such as to afford ground for thankfulness and satisfaction as it enters a new year of usefulness with a balance to its credit, the deficit of some years past having been finally extinguished. It is not only self-supporting, but also, we hope, proving an advantage to the Clergy and Sunday Schools of the Diocese.

As experience is gained its power for good will be increased, and the hearty interest taken in its management by the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod and his Assistant gives assurance that every possible means will be taken to ensure success.

The Committee has new and valuable information as to the state and working of our Sunday Schools, and what they are willing to undertake now and in the near future.

The question of the support by our Sunday Schools of a foreign missionary to work in connection with our own Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions was broached last year, the Committee in its report to the Synod stating that this matter had been favorably entertained by many of our Sunday Schools. The S.S. Committee is glad to be able to state that 34 Parishes are willing to enter on this work at once, and that many others would do so but for prior engagements. Nine of the above 34 parishes have promised to contribute between them \$183 for this object, and 200 scholars are willing to take collecting cards for the same.

Twenty-three parishes have Juvenile Mission Bands with a membership of 900, and 17 Clergymen in charge of parishes where none exist promise to form them.

There are 383 members of our Sunday Schools reported as connected with the Junior Branches of the W.A.M.A. These added to the 900 in the Mission Bands form a young army of 1283 members of our schools engaged in supporting mission work.

Missionary Services are held occasionally in the S.S. of 32 parishes, proving an effectual way of stirring up and keeping alive the work of missions:

Nine new Sunday Schools have been opened in the Diocese during the year. Fifty-three Clergymen report an increase in attendance of 981. The last statistical report of the Committee gave the total membership of our Sunday Schools as 20,076, which by the above increase is brought up to 21,057—a larger number than is reported by any Diocese in Canada. There are sixteen places reported where new Sunday Schools ought to be opened.

The Committee would draw attention to the importance of furnishing accurate statistical reports based on properly kept records, and advise an annual revision of such records.

Also the importance of scholars bringing Bibles and Prayer Books with them, as it is found that the leaflet has been to a great extent occupying their place in the Sunday School.

The banner Sunday School of the Diocese for missionary work is that of the Memorial Church, London. It leads all others and promises the largest contribution for the support of a foreign missionary.

The Annual Lay Helpers and Sunday School Convention which was held in Stratford last October, in numbers and in the spirit which pervaded its sessions, gave evidence of increased interest on the part of the church workers of the Diocese.

If Deanery S. S. Conventions are to form an important factor in the education of our teachers, they must become more general in the Diocese than they are at present, as only five Deaneries report having held them during the past year, namely: Middlesex, Bruce, Waterloo, Perth and Lambton. Middlesex seems to be thoroughly organized. Conventions are held every three months, and at the last meeting 300 officers and teachers were in attendance. Bruce also holds Quarterly Conventions, which, considering the extent of the Deanery, are well attended. At the Waterloo Convention held in January every Parish in the Deanery was represented, with indications of increased and increasing interest. Of the Conventions held in Perth and Lambton the Committee have no special particulars more than that the attendance and interest were satisfactory. Successful in the highest sense these Conventions must have been if those teachers and others attending them put in practice what they then learned.

Neither Conventions nor Sunday Schools, however perfectly organized, will fulfil their mission until Clergy and Laity of every degree recognising their great possibilities put into them the sanctified energy and wisdom which the Spirit of God will use for His glory.

The S. S. Committee desires to emphasize the necessity of having a higher standard of teaching in our Sunday Schools. When the work of teaching in a Sunday School is undertaken it should be with such a solemn sense of its importance and responsibility as will lead to self-denying and prayerful preparation. Individual study of the lesson (and of the scholar) is an imperative necessity, and the teacher cannot neglect it without being guilty of unfaithfulness and breach of trust. United study and mutual conference—in Teacher's Meetings, Ruri-Decanal and Diocesan Conventions—give enlarged acquaintance with fellow workers and the methods which they have successfully practiced, and an inspiration of which the teacher who studies alone (however faithfully) is deprived.

Only those who have given themselves to this work know its self-educating power or how much the teachers miss who wrong their classes and themselves by a perfunctory discharge of their duties.

#### CANON ON PAROCHIAL DIFFICULTIES.

The proposed Canon, as follows, was presented for consideration.

1. In cases of difficulties existing between a clergyman and his parishioners, it is hereby provided that at the request of the clergyman, or in response to the resolution of a special vestry meeting, or on the requisition in writing of not less than parishioners, members of any congregation or congregations in the parish concerned, or at the request by resolution of the Executive Committee, the Bishop shall appoint, or he may in his discretion, on his own motion, appoint three Mediators, two of whom shall be clerical members, and one a lay member of the Executive Committee, who shall proceed to enquire into the alleged difficulty, and to endeavor to bring about a peaceful settlement and termination thereof, and who shall, in any case, report the result to the Bishop in writing.

2. If the Mediators report that they have not been able to bring about a settlement between the clergyman and parishioners, the Bishop shall forthwith notify the respective parties to submit the difficulties between them to the decision of the Arbitrators to be appointed as hereinafter provided.

Vestry or the parishioners, as the case may be, and one by the Executive Committee, the last mentioned Arbitrator being always a clergyman, and all three members of the Executive Committee.

Provided, that, if either of the parties to the arbitration shall not within fourteen days after such notification nominate an Arbitrator, the Executive Committee shall nominate such Arbitrator.

4. The order of reference shall be framed by the Chancellor.

5. The Arbitrators shall give, in writing, not less than fourteen days' notice of their meeting to the clergyman, to the wardens of the congregation or congregations of the parish concerned, and to such other persons in the parish as the Mediators may name.

6. The Arbitrators shall receive and hear all evidence tendered relative to the matters at issue. They shall make their report in writing to the Bishop, which report, or the report of a majority of them, shall be final, subject to the clergyman's right of appeal as provided in Sec. 7.

7. If the Arbitrators' report be not acquiesced in by the clergyman interested, he may give notice of appeal at the next ensuing meeting of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall then forthwith elect by ballot from among themselves a Board of Appeal, to consist of three clergymen and two laymen, none of whom shall already have acted as Mediators or Arbitrators in the case appealed. The Board of Appeal shall appoint one of its members to act as Chairman. The Chairman shall give at least fourteen days' notice in writing to the appellant, to the wardens of the congregation or congregations of the parish interested, and to such other persons as they may deem it expedient to notify, of the place and time of meeting. It shall be the duty of the Board of Appeal to review any evidence taken by the Arbitrators, and to hear such further evidence or argument as shall be relevant to the enquiry. Their decision, or the decision of the majority of the Board, shall be reported to the Bishop, and shall be final and conclusive.

8. When the proceedings originate in a resolution of the Executive Committee, the Executive Committee shall appoint a committee of two of its members, one a clergyman and one a layman, to represent it before the Arbitrators or Board of Appeal.

9. If the Mediators or Arbitrators shall report that it is in the interest of the Church that the relations existing between the clergyman and the parishioners be discontinued, and the clergyman, on being duly notified by the Bishop thereof, shall forthwith accept the terms of such report, he shall be entitled to receive such a sum of money as, on the recommendation of the Bishop, the Executive Committee may grant from the General Purposes Fund as compensation for any actual temporary loss of stipend occasioned by his retirement, but such grant shall not exceed in amount such clergyman's three months' stipend as canonically provided.

10. A settlement affected by mediation or by the report of the Arbitrators, or of the Board of Appeal, as the case may be, may include any such financial arrangements between retiring clergyman and his parishioners as, in their opinion, may be just and equitable; always provided that such arrangements shall not directly or indirectly entail any charge upon the Maintenance and Missions Fund.

11. If a clergyman, whose retirement is reported by the Arbitrators or by the Board of Appeal to be in the interests of the Church, shall refuse to resign, his claim to any further parochial stipend or emoluments or on the Mission Fund shall *ipso facto* terminate from the date of his notification to that effect by the Bishop.

12. If the parishioners shall refuse or fail to act on the terms of the Arbitrators' report, the Bishop may with his consent remove the clergyman and leave the parish or congregation concerned without ministerial services until the parishioners have agreed to accept the report and to act according to the terms thereof, and no such parish or congregation shall be entitled during such vacancy to representation in the Synod.

13. A clergyman removed by the Bishop by reason of the parishioners' contumacy, shall be entitled to a compensatory grant as provided by section 9 of this Canon.

14. Any expenses incurred by proceedings under this Canon shall be paid out of the General Purposes Fund on the order of the Executive Committee.

Canon XX. is hereby repealed and the foregoing Canon, which shall be known as Canon XX. substituted therefor.

In the absence of Mr. Dymond, and with consent of the Synod—*withdrawn*.

#### CANON ON LAY READERS.

By Mr. A. H. Dymond, for Synod Committee on Canon IX.

AMENDED CANON :—(1) Lay readers may be appointed and licenced by the Bishop on the recommendation of any clergyman who may require assistance in his parish or mission, or who, from illness, may be unable to perform all his duties.

(2) A lay reader duly appointed and licenced may discharge such duties in a vacant parish as the Bishop may direct ; or he may render temporary assistance to the clergymen of any parish or mission in the deanery in which he holds his licence, or in any parish or mission in any deanery contiguous to such deanery on the invitation of such clergyman.

(3) No lay reader shall hold services in any parish or mission without the consent of the clergyman in charge thereof, or in any vacant parish or mission except as above provided.

(4) Subject to the provisions of Clause 3, the Bishop may license any person as lay reader for special service within the limits of the Diocese.

(5) The form of licence for a parochial lay reader shall be that provided by Provincial Canon XVII.

(6) Canon IX. is hereby repealed and the foregoing (which shall be known as Canon IX) substituted in lieu thereof.

AMENDMENT TO CANON XXVI. (OR XXV. IN REVISED CANONS) ON  
EPISCOPAL AND ARCHDEACON'S FUND.

By *Rev. J. C. Farthing*.

To add to this Canon (as it appears in the revised Canon) the following :

That whenever the Venerable Archdeacon Sandys shall cease to be entitled to draw the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) per annum at present paid to him from the Episcopal and Archdeacon's Funds, this sum shall no longer be paid to an Archdeacon. But whenever the present Diocese of Huron shall be divided, the said sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) per annum shall be paid to the Bishop of the new Diocese then formed.

In the event of the present recipient ceasing to draw the aforesaid sum of four hundred dollars per annum before such new Diocese is formed, then this sum shall be paid each year toward an Episcopal Endowment Fund for the proposed new Diocese.

cases very divergent. He hoped succeeding Synods would follow the example of this one in that respect. He counselled them to put the subject of giving on a higher basis as a solemn and joyful service to God Himself. He rejoiced at the movement set on foot in many places in Canada of giving one-tenth. It was cried out against it that it was legal. It might be that, but he was unable to find a name for the man who did not give a tenth. The clergy should come nearer to the laity, and the laity should come nearer to the clergy. Let them sympathize with each other in their trials and in their work, and if a minister told his people about the work and his needs for it they would sympathize with and help him. Omitting anything that has been said here about the cause of failures except one, he said the Church of England in the past had been intensely conservative even in her mistakes. She had looked with doubt and distrust on the employments of lay agency which had been used with such successful results by other religious bodies in Canada. This diocese comprised sixteen counties and was the largest in all Canada. He could not accuse himself of indolence since coming here; he had tried with faltering steps to accomplish the work, and if some judicious scheme were involved for lightening the charge he would rejoice to see it. It would not do to proceed with such a movement without great deliberation, care and thought as the interests and financial matters involved were very great and important. With regard to Huron College he was hampered in the work of the Diocese by want of men. He hoped that the College's interests would be looked after, and that it would be placed in a better position in the way of supplying this great want in the Diocese. Finally commending all present to the blessing of God he asked them to pray for the success of its work.

The doxology was sung and the Bishop dismissed the Synod with the benediction.

## Report of Committee on Behalf of Council of Huron College.

LONDON, ONT., June, 1894.

To the Members of the Synod of Huron :

GENTLEMEN,—In accordance with the expressed desire of the Synod of Huron for full information as to the progress and financial position of Huron College, we are instructed to state :

That the College is in possession of an unencumbered property, in Real Estate, College Buildings, Furniture, and Library, estimated to be worth forty thousand dollars.

That the Trust Funds for the benefit of the College are:—The Peache Trust, with an Endowment Fund of \$24,817 63; the Boomer Scholarship Endowment of \$3,636.05, and the Scholarship Endowment Fund of \$5,000.00, all of which funds are fully invested, and the income derived thereupon is applied to the purposes designated in the creation of the trusts; the proceeds of the Peache Trust providing for the stipend of the Rev. Principal and Divinity Professor.

For the general purposes of the College there remained, upon the 1st instant, the sum of \$3604 37 in Cash and Investments, less \$300.00, the capital of the Haensel Trust, not separately invested.

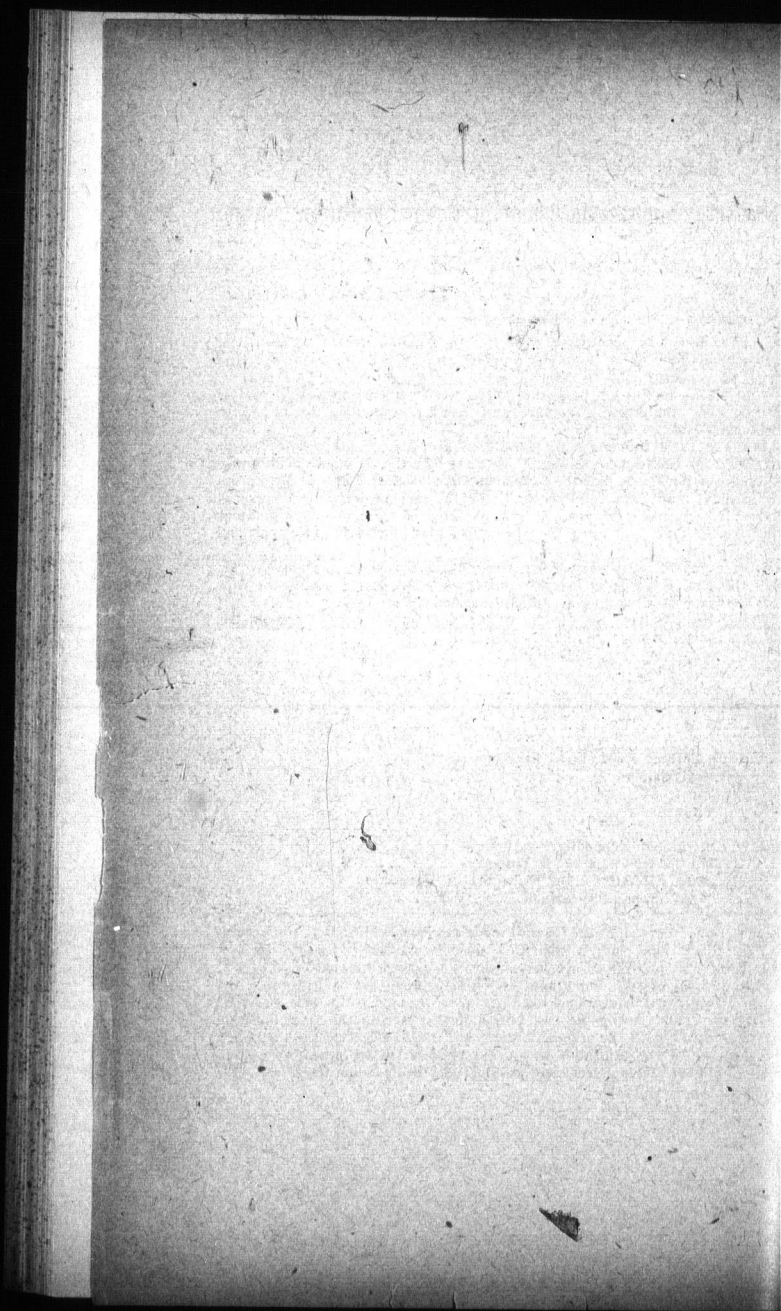

Some three years since the Council made extensive additions to the College Buildings, which have largely increased their convenience for the general college work, and will afford accommodation for a large number of students, and were deemed of vital importance, in order to keep the College up to the standard of increased educational facilities now so universally acknowledged to be necessary; and during the past year a further step in the same direction and in accordance with the original intentions of the founders of the institution has been made by the utilization of the old residence as a Preparatory School, under the diligent and most efficient conduct of the Headmaster, Mr. J. W. G. Andras.



The effect of these undertakings has been necessarily, in the first place, a reduction of the general invested funds, and a consequent diminution in the receipts of interest thereon, and it will readily be seen that unless the present income can be largely supplemented, the College, although otherwise in excellent position for its work, will be obliged to discontinue it. The Council have, however, been strong in the opinion that it was only necessary for the exigencies of the College to be sufficiently understood throughout the Diocese to draw therefrom such a voluntary measure of support as is well known to be enjoyed by kindred institutions in other dioceses; and in this conviction they have been confirmed by the effort made amongst the Alumni of the College, with a promise of aid from them which will be very acceptable, and the increased interest manifested in their work by the Synod of the Diocese. And during the past year the Council have made considerable effort to obtain a larger degree of support by the circulation of an "Appeal" to the churchmen of the Diocese (copies of which, and of the Constitution and By-Laws of the College, may be procured at the offices of the Synod), trusting that they would be materially aided by the sympathetic and kindly assistance of some 72 clergymen now on the Synod list, who were educated for the ministry within the College walls.

It is necessary to the efficient working of the College that its current income shall be increased by from \$1,200 to \$1,500 per annum, which does not seem a large sum to be raised in the Diocese for a purpose so important and so essential to diocesan interests, and we trust that upon your careful consideration of the matter a means may be suggested by which this desired result may be reached. No portion of this additional amount is required to pay debts of the College, for none exist, and the property is entirely unencumbered, but all contributions will be directly applicable to its active work.

The Rev. Principal Miller has reported to the Educational Committee of the Synod as to the work and progress of the students who have been under his training; it is therefore unnecessary to further refer to this department than to bear willing testimony to the indefatigable zeal and energy displayed by the Rev. Principal in the fulfilment of the duties of his position.

Huron College School, under the headmastership of Mr. J. W. Gay Andras, has been most satisfactorily conducted, and the attendance, though small, has steadily increased. We have much pleasure in submitting herewith the Headmaster's report, and would add that under the terms of his arrangement with the College, the School has not thus far been remunerative to him on account of the comparatively small number of pupils in attendance. Not only in his interests, but in those of the College generally, we commend the School to the patronage of the Churchmen of the City and Diocese. Mr. Andras is a gentleman of exceptional ability as a teacher, and the School provides that preliminary training in classical and general studies which is so important a foundation for a liberal education, and of vital consequence to those entering upon a Divinity course.
