The Synod assembled at 3.00 p.m., in the new Cronyn Hall, for business.

## THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

His Lordship then delivered his annual address to the Synod.

## Reverend Brethren and Brethren of the Laity:

Dear Friends, - Before entering upon my charge, I must offer you an apology for not having a prepared written address before me. The necessities of time have been too great, and opportunities too few to enable me to do so, and therefore, trusting that under the circumstances I shall have your generous forgiveness, I shall begin without

And first, I must record my deep sense of thankfulness to God for the many benefactions which both Mrs. Baldwin and myself have received at His loving hands during our long and eventful journey ; for when 1 contemplate all the stormy seas which we have crossed, and perils in distant lands which we have encountered and see how, we have been brought back in perfect peace, without injury, accident or loss, I cannot but gratefully confess how great is -His mercy and

I acknowledge also His constant care in watching over and keeping you throughout the past, and firmly do I believe, that as we advance in the work of the Synod, we shall see more and more reason to take courage for the future.

You naturally expect that I will make some reference to my late journey, and especially that I should give you some of the deeper impressions which my wanderings in foreign lands are calculated to convey.

Before entering upon particulars, and speaking now in a general way, 1 have much pleasure in making the assertion that all I have seen in the East only confirms in my mind the faith once delivered to the saints, and corroborates the conviction of many that the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

1 have gazed since I saw you last, upon the ruins of two ancient civilizations and the deep impression which these spectacles have

First D
made upon my mind will never lightly be effaced. I refer first to the ruins of mysterious Egypt, and secondly to those of Imperial Rome. Having journeyed from Alexandria to Masr the magnificent, known to us as Cairo, and from Cairo to Assouan and the first cataract of the Nile, having gazed upon the crumbling pyramids, and looked into the face of that impassive Sphinx that has watched without a tremor the rise and fall of dynasties, having wandered amid the gigantic ruins of Thebes, of Luxor and of Karnak, and penetrated the long and dusty corridors where, amid the silence of the Libyan hills, have slept for ages the mummied Pharaohs of the never-to-beforgotten nast ; having seen, I say, all these most impressive sights, I am in a position to speak of them to-day in a manner impossible for me before.

Two lessons of surpassing value I have learned from them, the recital of which may not be unprofitable to you.

The First of these is :-
The utter inability of 'man' to perpetuate a false and pernicious religion.

## The Second:--

The Divinity of Christian Religion as evidenced by its indestructability in time.

As I walked amid the ruins of luxor and Karnak. I saw, as other travellers have seen before me, the gigantic, almost incredible efforts which man has made to perpetuate his religion. All that architecture could devise, all that Cyclopian hands could execute may be found in rich and marvellous profusion here. Babylon and Assyria might build in brick, Greece and Rome in marble and limestone but Egypt would have nothing but granite and syenite. She built in time what she thought would outlive all time, and live untouched amid the ruins of all else beside.

Then having done this, on pillar and pediment, on arch and gateway, in the recesses of their tombs, and on the fronts of their bewildering temples they pictured the figures, the actions and the religion of their gods. What was temporal they deemed to be eternal, and what was only human they worshipped as Divine. All that was in the power of man they did most certainly do to perpetuate their religion. Deep in the rock their faith was cut, but all has been in vain. To-day, as the traveller wanders amid these tombs and temples, these colossal statues and obelisks, he sees the vast fissures, the gaping rents which time has made, and finds that all the pomp of

It is impossible for any one who is at all conversant with the religious opinions of his age to be ignorant of the fact that on every side men are advancing to assail the great citadel of truth-the inspired Word of God, In comparison with this, all other controversies sink into utter insignificance. Ordinary matters of dispute in the church are concerning the faith, this is whether there is any faith at all, others affect the superstructure, this the foundation itself, and if the foundation be destroyed what can the righteous do? The school of so-called "higher criticism" which has arisen in our day is one which demands more than a passing notice from the Bishops and Pastors of the flock. Proceeding on the vicious principle that the Bible is only human and fallible, but that all criticism is inspired, it seeks to subvert in one dire overthrow the faith of multitudes and to leave them hopeless in the great sea of doubt and despair

Most earnestly do I desire to impress upon you, the Clergy of this vast and important Diocese, that if you wish to carry out the principles of your holy religion --and I am confident you do wish to do so-and to build up your'people in the faith, then high up in a place by itself, and invested with the awful holiness of God you must place the inspired word of Truth. It was thus God honored it in the past, it is thus you must honor it now. The ancient copy of the law was ordered by God to be placed in the very holy of holies, under the wings of the Cherubim in His immediate and awful presence. So too, our Saviour honored the Scriptures. "In the volume of the Book it is written," He said, "of me." In these same Scriptures He found the pathway His own hallowed feet were to tread from the manger-cradle in Bethlethem to Calvary, and from Calvary to Bethany and the heights of glory. When tempted or assailed either by His friends or His foes to turn aside for a moment from His inflexible purpose, He invariably refused with this answer : "How, then can the Scriptures be fulfilled ?" They were the guide and arbiter of all His ways, the solemn inscrutable limit beyond which it was impossible even for Him to pass.

Look at Him in His agony and bloody sweat, the one mysterious power which bound Him, as it were, in His position, and tied the strong arms of omnipotence; was His absolute consecration to the will of God as expressed in the volume of His book. When, therefore, we contrast this awful-this Divine dignity with which the Saviour ever invested the Holy Scriptures with the haughty, impudent, blasphemous writings of this so-called school of "higher criticism," we cannot but be amazed at the böld effrontery of professing christian men. What the Lord Jesus Christ honors, we must honor, and what he calls holy we must call holy too. Only think what these men ask. They ask that we should give up Moses,

Two most important facts must be borne in mind :-First, that the General Synod, if it is to be efficient as the great governing
body of the church in Canada, must be seised with all necessary powers, even thoügh it be at the expense of present arrangements, and secondly, that the Diocesan Synods must be allowed to retain their freedom of action and the possession of all those powers which they at present enjoy. Diocesan liberty has been exercised throughout the whole regime of the Provincial Synod, let us take good care that it be not forfeited under that of the General. For while anxious for the unity of the church in Canada, we do not want it at the expense of all that local liberty which is so essential for the proper development of the work. These two points, therefore, will of necessity constitute the gravest anxieties in connection with the proposed meeting of the General Synod. I wish also to state, that even after this large subtraction from the powers of the Provincial Synod has been made, there will still remain much that it, and it only can properly perform. Its usefulness will by no means be destroyed; it will still have a name, a visible reality and the possession of such power as may be deemed necessary for the transaction of its somewhat contracted duties.

You will be called upon to elect representatives to this our first great General Synod, and a great hohor will rest on all those who may be chosen to so distinguished an office. Confident I am that you all, desiring to maintain the unity of this our glorious and historic churchs will do all in your power to facilitate the work of the proposed Synod, and to make it by a wise and judicious legislation the supreme but not oppressive head of the church in Canada.

## HURON COLLEGE.

You are doubtless aware that the college edifice has been greatly enlarged, and that we have now the most ample accommodation for all those who desire to enroll themselves among its members, so that nothing is left to be desired as far as the building is concerned.

Our teaching staff has also been increased, there being now not gnly the honored principal, the Rev. Herbert Gordon Miller, M. A., but also the Rev. Charles Henry Andras, M. A., Sen. Opt., of Cambridge in 1860, and lately 2nd master of Royal Grammar School, Lancaster. Mr. Andras is professor in the college and a most able assistant to the principal. In addition to the above, the Rev, Simeon Gottfried Edelstein, incumbent of Glanworth, lectures twice in the week, on Hebrew, and the Rev. Arthur Rhodes acts as tutor.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE SYNOD.

I am not in a position to affirm anything as to results, yet I would like the Synod to understand that whatever the council can do, it will do for the advancement of a spirit of union and to enlist the good will of the members of the Diocese.

You will hear with pleasure that one of our students, Mr, A. H. Sherivood has passed the Provincial Boarrd of Preliminary Examiners which, as their papers are searching, is creditable to himself.

## THE FINANCES OF THE DIOCESE.

I am unable, having so lately returned from abroad, to dwell at any length upon this subject, but I greatly regret having to announce that there is an over-draft of $\$ 4605.71$ which we have to meet in the course of the present 发远. There is consolation in the thought that the fact of this deficiency may lead us not only to examine into all its causes but also endeavor to place the needs of the Diocese in a more clear and palpable light before the community at large. In any further consideration of the whole subject of our finances, three suggestions might be made as to deviation from our present plans.

First, the propriety, or non-propriety, of separating our Mission Fund proper from the Clergy Commutation Fund.

Secondly, the advisability of having a yearly assessment on each parish throughout the Diocese for the maintenance of the Mission

Thirdly, the need of having some descending scale in the making of grants to necessitous places.

It may possibly be that none of these suggestions may be adopted, but they at least contain some elements for serious consideration.

As a practicable method of meeting the present distress, I would suggest that we all ourselves increase our contributions to the Mission Fund at least twenty-five per cent. which will go no inconsiderable way toward meeting the debt which has just been incurred.

## THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY,

I note with the deepest gratitude the work of the Women's Auxiliary in this Diocese. Whether I look upon the noble work it is doing in the great Northwest, in relieving so many missions, and in cheering them with substantial help, or regard the reflex influence which this activity has both upon themselves and others at home, I see accumulating evidence as to the internal excellence of the
society and to the vast benefit which it is conferring upon the Diocese at lafge. 1 recognize womens' work in the church as ordained of God, and when rightly directed, certain to advance the Redeemer's glory not only at home but abroad. In the I.XVIII. Psalm David says :-- "The Lord gave the word, the women who published the glad tidings is a great host." From this we see that women have a great work in the church of Christ which they do well to fulfill, and we should ever pray that abounding grace may be given them to consecrate more and more their time and talents to the blessed service of their Lord.

## OBITUARY NOTICE.

It is my melancholyduty to record the demise of one who has been for many years a real mother in Israel. I refer to the late Mrs. Adam Elliott, of the Mohawk Reserve, whose kindness and devotion to the Indians and unbounded hospitality to all travellers, has made her name fragrant throughout the diocese. Her husband the late Rev.Adam Elliott, though born in England had studied Divinity under the first Bishop of Toronto, and was ordained by the Bishop of Quebec. Mr. Elliott was appointed Incumbent of 'St. John's Church, Tuscarora as far back as 1837 and was distinguished by his saintliness of life and great devotion to his work The memory of the just is blessed, and surely of one whose life was so beautiful with the indwelling Grace of God, and whose time was so unreservedly given to the spiritual and social developement of the Indians among whom she lived, we can say with all meetness "Blessed are the the dead that die in the Lord from henceforth; Yea, saith the Spirit that they may rest from their labors, and their works do follow them."

## Receiving Report of Executive Committee.

The annual report of the Executive Committee was then read and distributed in printed form. The printed audited accounts were also placed in the hands of the members of the Synod.

The Executive Committee present herewith their annual report :-
Your Committee beg to report that the total collections and free-will offerings for the year just closed amounted to $\$ 21448.83$, being a slight increase over that of the preceding year. It will be seen, however, by reference to the printed accounts, that while the offerings for objects outside the Diocese on the whole show a large.increase, there has been a large decrease in the offerings for our Diocesan purposes.

## parochial association collections.

The amount of these collections received was $\$ 5105.90$ as compared with $\$ 5272.11$ for the previous year, a decrease of $\$ 166.21$. Of the amount collected, various items amounting to $\$ 3128.99$ have been paid, including $\$ 484.00$ to Lay Readers, Indian Interpreters and School Teachers ; $\$ 620.00$ transferred to the Widows and Orphans 'Fund and $\$ 287.40$ for special grants, \&c., and the remainder, $\$ 2086.91$, has been carried to the credit of the Maintenance and Mission Fund.

## Clergy maintenance and mission fund.

Following is a comparative statement of the collections for this fund for the past two years :-


The other credits include $\$ 9766.77$ from the Interest Account and $\$ 25^{8.45}$, to which your Committee refers with pleasure, from the W.A.M.A. for Lions Head Mission. The donations amount to $\$ 80.25$, of which $\$ 75.00$ was given by a Clergyman on the Fund, and being one of his quarterly cheques. The disbursements for the year amounted to $\$ 19851.98$, leaving the large overdraft of $\$ 4605.71$.

Your Committee would recommend that a Committee of Synod be appointed to consider the subject of the above deficiency and to suggest some means whereby the present difficulty may be met, and the fund be placed on such a basis as to prevent such recurrence in the future. Such Committee to report to the Executive Committee at its earliest convenience.

## DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

The Ascensiontide (1892) collection for Domestic Missions amounted to $\$ 1106.61$ as compared with $\$ 1445.53$ in 189 I and $\$ 919.48$ in 1890 ; but your Committee takes great pleasure in drawing your attention to the collection made in August last, after the St. John's, Newfoundland, fire, which amounted to the large sum of $\$ 1729.25$.

The collections made on Thanksgiving Day for Huron College amounted to $\$ 675.94$ as compared with $\$ 574.39$ for the previous year, being an increase of $\$ 10155$.

## WIDOWS AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This fund still continues to be in a most satisfactory position. The two half yearly collections amounted to $\$ 1293.33$ (as against $\$ 1257.32$ for the previous year); the annual subscriptions and entrance fees to $\$ 425$ and donations $\$ 3$, which with the balance from the previous year $(\$ 943.35)$, the interest on invested funds, ( $\$ 3656.79$ ) and $\$ 620$ from the General Purpose Fund, have been sufficient to pay all claims in full, amounting to $\$ 4768.50$, and to transfer $\$ 932.78$ to the Capital Account which now amounts to $\$ 65,500.00$.

Two widows have died during the year, Mrs. Smyth, widow of the late Rev. James Smyth, and Mrs, Evans, widow of the late Rev. W. B. Evans. Two or-
phans take the placesof the latter on the fund.

## SUPERANNUATION.

Three Clergymen have been superannuated during the year, the Ven. Archdeacon Mulholland, who had served 43 years within the limits of the Diocese, Whev. Wm. Daunt, who had served 27 years in the Diocese, and the Rev. R. W. Johnstone, 27 years. One other application is now before the Committee.

## SYNOD EXPENSE ACCOUNT.

The Synod assessments received during the year amounted to \$1012, and While the expenses are in some respects lower than last year-the printing account alone showing a decrease of over $\$ 300,00$-the account stood overdrawn at the from of the year, \$251.47, notwithstanding the balance of $\$ 257.46$ carried over from the past year. This overdraft has been caused for the most part by the
transfer of the See House Debt from the Capital of the Episcopal and Arch. deacons' Fund to that of the General Purposes Fund, the interest on which is credited to the Synod Expense Account.

SEE HOUSE DEBT.
This debt is the same as last year, \$14918.37. Your Committee exceedingly regret that the Rev. Canon Young has been unable to undertake the work of col lecting for this object.

## CONSOLIDATED INVESTMENT ACCOUNT.

The Consolidated Capital Account now amounts to $\$ 689450.55$, upon which interest at the rate of $5.96 \%$ has been earned for the year just closed. Payments on loans have been on the whole satisfactorily made, and although the rate is about $\mathbf{1 - 1 0 \%}$ less than that of last year, some reduction was however anticipated in view of the lower rates of interest at which money has been obtainable.

The consolidation of the funds continues to give every satisfaction and is proving not only a great convenience to the Clergy and others interested, but is working satisfactorily in every other respect.

## CONSOLIDATION OF THE CHURCH IN CANADA.

A meeting of the General Synod on the amended basis of the Winnipeg Conference has been called by the Metropolitan of this Ecclesiastical Province to meet in Toronto in September next, and it will be necessary, should this Synod approve thereof, to make some provision for meeting our share of the expenses.

## DEPACTTORY.

The Depository continues to be hergely made use of by our Sunday Schools and others for the purchase of selected books and supplies at reduced rates. The sales for the year amounted to $\$ 1686.17$.

## ST. JAMES' CHURCH, WILMOT.

Your Committee beg to acknowledge the receipt from the Executors of the late Wm . Illingworth, of the sum of $\$ 400$, the income thereof to be paid towards the stipend of the Incumbent of St. James' Church, Wilmot, an example which it is to be hoped will be more generally and largely followed.

## ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL.

In consideration of the excellent security offered on the St. Paul's Church property for the loan of $\$ 10,000$ to be advanced for the purpose of erecting new buildings to be used by the Synod, and other improvements, and the interest which the Diocese takes in the same, an application for an increase of the loan to $\$ 15,000$ by the Rector and Churchwardens of St. Paul's, at the same rate of interest as the original loan, has been made.

Your Committee take pleasure in being able to congratulate the Synod in meeting for the first time in this new and comfortable hall. The building when completed, it is hoped, will meet every requirement and be both convenient and suitable.

## Report of Committee on Temperance.

1. The Committee is pleased to bef able to report that Temperance matters are ofcupying a large share of pubiic attention and that there is a growing recognition of their importance. Voluntary efforts and organizations are being recognized and acknowledged more than ever by the Church, and the work is not wholly relegated to paid agents and agencies, however much in earnest they may be. It is the duty of the church to rescue the perishing; and this she is striving to do in many ways, notably by means of the "Church of England Temperance Society," which is doing great work in England under the patronage of the Queen, and by the aid of Archbishops, Bishops, Clergy and Laity. It has agents at many of the Police Courts to resclic and help the victims of drink and to befriend them in their attempts to lead a virtuous life.
2. In this diocese (though for divers reasons it has not been found possible to do a great deal under the Society's banner) there are several branches of the C. E. T. S., and sermons have been preached and lectures have been delivered by its friends, while some of the literature of the parent society has been distributed. The Rev. W. M. Seaborn, East London P.O., and Rev. W. J. Taylor, Diocesan Secretary C. E. T. S., St. Marys P. O., (members of the committee) may be communicated with at any time as to the delivery of sermons or addresses on temperance topics. The last named (who has done most earnest service in his position of Diocesan Secretary) or Rev. Canon Smith, also a Diocesan Secretary, will be pleased to answer any questions as to the work of the Society.

I. -CONSOLIDATION OF CANADIAN DIOCESES.

By Mr. Charles Jenkins.
I. This Synod re-affirms its conviction that the consolidation of the several Dioceses of the Anglican Church in the Dominion of Canada and Newfoundland is in accordance with the highest interests of the Church, and that it is expedient there should be a general Synod consisting of the Bishops of the several Dioceses and representatives chosen from the Clergy and Laity by the Diocesan Synods. Such Synods to meet periodically for the consideration of matters affecting the Church's welfare and legislating thereon.
2. That with certain amendments in details, which it is hoped may commend themselves to the judgment of the General Synod, the plan of consolidation agreed to by the conference held in Winnipeg in August, 1890, affords a just and comprehensive basis for the constitution of the General Synod.
3. This Synod will accordingly proceed to elect four Clergymen and four Laymen, with as many substitutes of the respective orders, to represent this Synod at the General Synod to be held in Toronto in the month of September next ensuing.
4. That the representatives so elected be requested to present the following amendments to the Winnipeg scheme as being necessary and proper for incorporation in the constitution of the General Synod.
(q) A larger numerical representation of the Clergy and Laity.
(b) Meetings of the Gencral Synod at shorter intervals than five years.

## Annual Report of the Sunday School Committee.

The Sunday School Committee submit to the Synod the following report:-
The condition and prospects of the Depository are such as to afford ground for thankfulness and satisfaction as it enters a new year of usefulness with a halance to its credit, the deficit of some years past having been finally extinguished. It is not only self-supporting, but also, we hope, proving an advantage to the Clergy and Sunday Schools of the Diocese.

As experience is gained its power for good will be increased, and the hearty interest taken in its management by the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod and his Assistant gives assurance that every possible means will be taken to ensure success.

The Committee has new and valuable information as to the state and working of our Sunday Schools, and what they are willing to undertake now and in the near future.

The question of the support by our Sunday Schools of a foreign missionary to work in connection with our own Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions was broached last year, the Committee in its report to the Synod stating that this matter had been favorably entertained by many of our Sunday Schools. The S.S. Committee is glad to be able to state that 34 Parishes are willing to enter on this work at once, and that many others would do so but for prior engagements. Nine of the above 34 parishes have promised to contribute between them $\$ 183$ for this object, and 2 co scholars are willing to take collecting cards for the same.

Twenty-three parishes have Juvenile Mission Bands with a membership of 900 , and 17 Clergymen in charge of parishes where none exist promise to form them.

There are 383 members of our Sunday Schools reported as connected with the Junior Branches of the W.A.M.A. These added to the 900 in the Mission Bands form a young army of 1283 members of our schools engaged in supporting mission work.

Missionary Services are held occasionally in the S.S. of 32 parishes, proving an effectual way of stirring up and keeping alive the work of missions.

Nine new Sunday Schools have been opened in the Diocese during the year. Fifty-three Clergymen report an increase in attendance of 98 I . The last statistical report of the Committee gave the total membership of our Sunday Schools as 20,076, which by the above increase is brought up to 21.057-a larger number than is reported by any Diocese in Canada. There are sixteen places reported where new Sunday Schools ought to be opened.

The Committee would draw attention to the importance of furnishing accurate statistical reports based on properly kept records, and advise an annual revision of such records.

Also the importance of scholars bringing Bibles and Prayer Books with them, as it is found that the leaflet has been to a great extent occupying their place in the Sunday School.

Amended Canon :-(I) Lay readers may be appointed and licenced by the Bishop on the recommendation of any clergyman who may require assistance in his parish or mission, or who, from illness, may be unable to perform all his duties.
(2) A lay reader duly appointed and licenced may discharge such duties in a vacant parish as the Bishop may direct ; or he may render temporary assistance to the clergymen of any parish or mission in the deanery in which he holds his licence, or in any parish or mission in any deanery contiguous to such deanery on the invitation of such clergyman.
(3) No lay reader shall hold services in any parish or mission without the consent of the clergyman in charge thereof, or in any vacant parish or mission except as above provided.

cases very divergent. He hoped succeeding Synods would follow the example of this one in that respect. He counselled them to put the subject of giving on a higher basis as a solemn and joyful service to God Himself. He rejoiced at the movement set on fort in many places in Canada of giving one-tenth. It was cried out against it that it was legal. It might be that, but he was unable to find a name for the man who did not give a tenth. The clergy should come nearer to the laity, and the laity should come nearer to the clergy. Let them sympathize with each other in their trials and in their work, and if a minister told his people about the work and his needs for it they would sympathize with and help him. Omitting anything that has been said here about the cause of failures except one, he said the Chur h of England in the past had been intensely conservative even in her mistakes. She had looked with doubt and distrust on the employments of lay agency which had been used with such successful results by other religious bodies in Canada. This diocese comprised sixteen counties and was the largest in all Canada. He could not accuse himself of indolence since coming here; he had tried with faltering steps to accomplish the work, and if some judicious scheme were involved for lightening the charge he would rejoice to see it. It would not do to proceed with such a movement without great deliberation, care and thought as the interests and financial matters involved were very great and important. With regard to Huron College he was hampered in the work of the Diocese by want of men. He hoped that the College's interests would be looked after, and that it would be placed in a better position in the way of supplying this great want in the Diocese. Finally commending all present to the blessing of God he asked them to pray for the success of its work.

The doxology was sung and the Bishop dismissed the Synod with the benediction.
