LONDON, March 9.—A unique work in many ways will be the volumes of Queen Victoria's letters which A. C. Benson and Viscount Esher have been aditing for the last four or five years. It is unique firstly because of the ma-ture of the book—it will consist chiefly of letters, with an introductory preface to each group, outlining the history of the period—and, secondly, because it is the first time that a reigning mon-arch has sanctioned the publication of the correspondence of his predecessor; and, thirdly, because King Edward WII has supervised the proofs.
