Disastrous Fire and Loss of Property in Montreal.

It is with deep regret we call the attention of the public to the details of the late calamitous fire. The origin thereof has been traced to the carelessness of some persons, who, while smoking in a house lately by the Protestant Church, near the Gas Works, threw the matches among some shavings, which quickly ignited.

Out of the thickly populated district of Griffintown, 600 persons have been suffocated, having lost, by this wide-spread conflagration, homes, and goods, and all these able-bodied men and women, and all these children, have been reduced to beggary. If we estimate the number of persons thrown upon the world by this event, we would conclude that twice that number have been the sufferers. Nor is this statement the result of anxiety to pre-occupy the attention of our readers; it is, on the contrary, the candid statement of those who are desirous that the lamented occurrence should be portrayed in the most favorable light.

CANADIAN AFFAIRS.
