





Synepsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

THE cole head of a family, or any stead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatche-man or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (out not Sub-Agency.) on certain conditions.


