#### **PUTS JAPAN'S LOSSES UNDER** \$1.000.000.000

First Estimate Exaggerated Says Insurance Expert

Experts now agree that the maeral losses in Japan, estimates of which have ranged as high as \$5,000,000,000 were grossly exaggerat ed in the first reports of the disster which reached New York.

Secretary of Commerce Hoover has characterized a \$5,000,000,000 loss as "absurd" pointing out that industrial Japan was largely outside the devasted area. He propheises that the great mercantile firms in Tokio and Yokohama will probably be in a position to re-establish their business within ten days.


