LOOKS WARLIKE.

THE KING'S COINAGE. Advices from England state that the first issue of the coinage of King Edward will be made in about a month's time.

The designs have been settled and the dies sunk and some of the coins have already been struck.

These display very little alteration apart from the substitution of the King's profile for that of her late Majesty. Silver will be the chief metal used.

MORGAN'S LATEST TRUST. According to the London correspondent of the New York World, it is reported that J. Pierpont Morgan is engaged in arranging for the establishment of a great Anglo-American bank.

The bank is to be organized in New York and is intended to be the principal agency for the already vast and rapidly growing banking transactions between Europe and America.

Mr. Morgan is understood to have associated with him in the undertaking not only the principal capitalists who aided in the organization of the United Steel Corporation, but also the Rothschilds.

CHALLENGERS DISABLED. While dashing along off Brentons Reef Lightship, Newport, R. I., last Wednesday, with her three lower sails set, the big hollow steel mast on the Belmont syndicate cup defender Constitution collapsed.

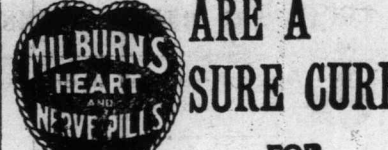
