### UNIVERSITY NOTES.

The annual report of the University of Toronto and of University College for 1888-89 shows that these institutions are progressing. The numbers admitted during the year were: Law 47; in Medicine 145; in Arts 311; in Agriculture 8. Candidates for the number of 1000 were examined in the various faculties.

The changes in the staff are: the appointment of a lecturer in physiology, a professor of mathematics, this department being separated from that of physics; a professor of comparative anatomy; a professor of political economy; an additional professor of political economy; an English which has recently been added. The professor of history, Goss, was given the honor of a chair in the new university. It is expected that the new biological laboratory in the Queen's Park will be ready for occupation by the end of the month.

The School of Science shows a total attendance of 28 who are taking civil engineering. The fees received from these amounted to \$2800. An additional lecturer in mathematics, a special instructor in mechanical engineering, and a special instructor in electrical engineering, were appointed under the charge of the professor of physics.

### THE GLADSTONIANS WIN.

DEFEAT OF THE CONSERVATIVES IN WINNING.  
Mr. Beaufort's Majority in the Parliamentary Contest Yesterday 436, a Gain of 100 over the Last Election.—The Financial Policy in France.

LONDON, March 15.—An election was held in the Kensington division of Lambeth today to fill the parliamentary seat vacated by the resignation of R. G. Davis (Con). The election resulted in a victory for Mr. Beaufort, the Gladstonian candidate, who polled 409 votes against 349 for Mr. Hope, the Conservative nominee.

At the last election Davis, the retiring member, received 3222 votes and Beaufort 2792.

Today's election was hotly contested, both parties straining every nerve to achieve success.

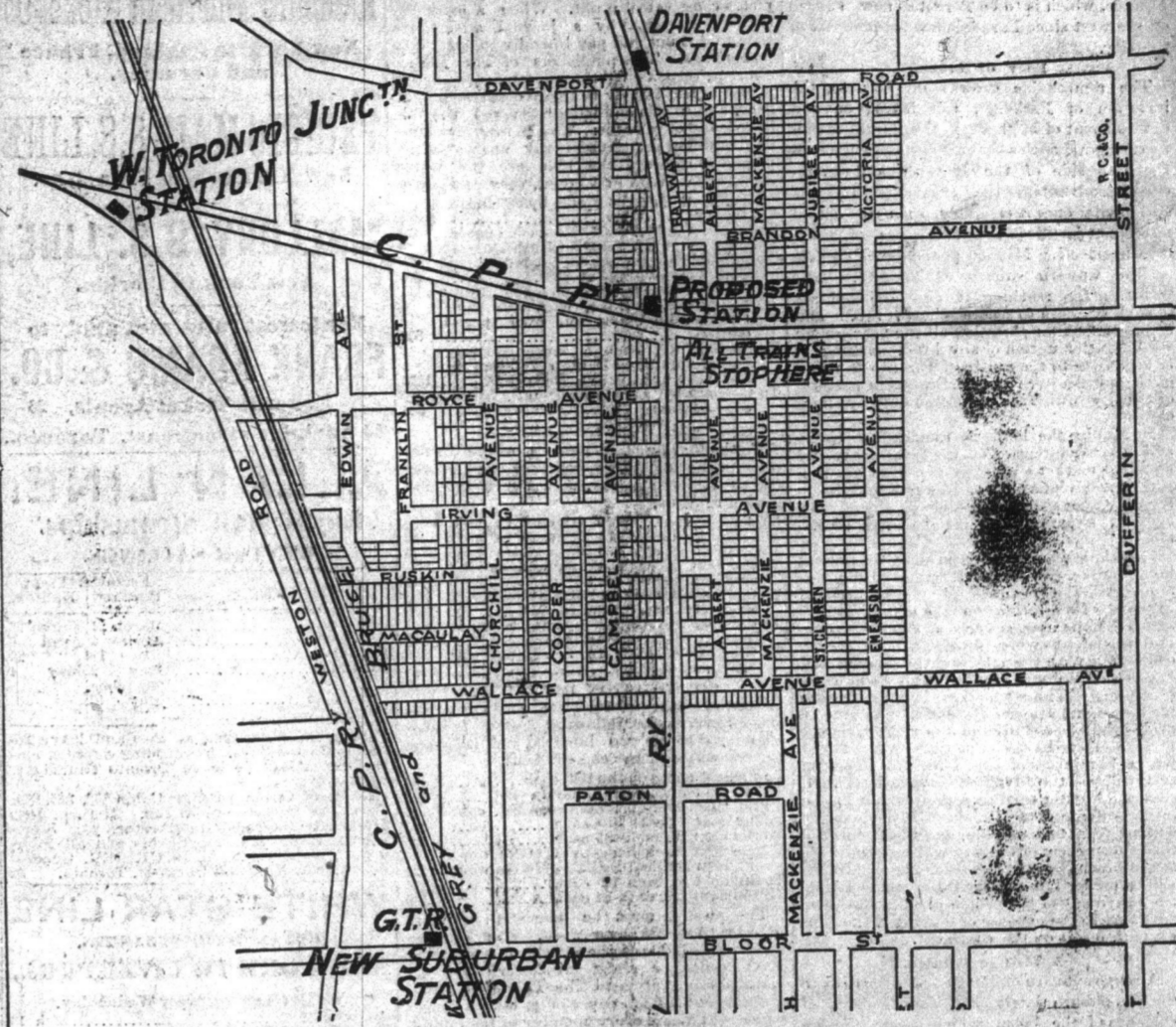
