



TO PURIFY SEWAGE. A SCIENTIFIC METHOD OF TREATING

It might be expected that so small a filter would soon become choked, and that a nuisance would be created. But Dr. Houston states that the reverse of this happens, the effluent up to a certain point actually improving in quality as time goes on, and the whole process continuing to work satisfactorily and uninterruptedly for months together. Hence it is argued that, inasmuch as the solid matters disappear, the process must be something more than one of mere mechanical filtration. The explanation is given by attributing the result to the beneficial action of nonpathogenic micro-organisms, which peptonize the organic matter in the sewage, and so bring about its purification.

PROGRESSIVE IDEAS.

Notes of the Forward Mevement in the Useful Arts.

This list of new uses of aluminium as of electricity, continues to rapidly extend. The metal is said to serve excellently as a tooth-stopping medium. It does not darken, as do other materials used for this purpose. Whole sets of teeth, indeed, have, it is averred, been experimentally made of aluminium, the result of which has been to place before the dentist for solution the problem of rendering the metal grinder the color of the natural molar.

BETAILS OF THE SYSTEM.

Recognizing these principles Mr.
Scott-Moncrieff has so applied them as to constitute a plan for the bacteriological treatment of sewage. The main feature of the apparatus is that of a filter bed; but this is intended to act also in the cultivation of the microbes, and is, therefore, a "cultivation filter-bed." The operation, so far as present information extends, is limited to the treatment of the sewage from a single house, though fresh materials for investigations are now coming to hand from a town where the "cultivation filter-beds" are at work. These later facts will be published as soon as possible.

Dr. Houston specifies the results which have been abtained on a singler scale at Ashstead. The Ashstead filter-bed is simply 10 feet in length, by 2½ feet in width, and 3 feet in depth. This receives the entire sewage discharge from a household of 10 or 12 persons, with the exception of the grease, which is held back as far as possible by a grease trap. The filtration is upward, the liquid rising through a false bottom, and then passing through successive layers of flint, coke and gravel, till it reaches the level of the outflow pipe. The depth of the filtering material is only about 14 inches.






