

EDUCATION REPORT.

From the report of the Superintendent of Education, we glean a few statistics, and facts in regard to education that will be of interest to our readers.

The number of schools, teachers and pupils, over the last year, while the registration of pupils has been exceeded in our educational history, under the present system, and surpasses that of '82-'83 by nearly 3000.

The proportion of the entire population at school during some part of the first term, was 42.12 per cent. In 1884 the proportion was 41.44 per cent.

The average salary throughout the province for male teachers of the first class, was \$432.10 in 1884, and \$406.70 in 1885.

The three highest averages were in Halifax county, \$472.35; Yarmouth, \$459.23; Kings, \$465.62.
