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### REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

### NEW BRUNSWICK

## PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

On behalf of the Council of the Provincial Rifle Association, it is now my duty to present a report of the proceedings of the past year.

The usual grant of \$1,300 was received through the Dominion Association, and was devoted to the prize list of the Annual Competition and the expenses connected therewith.

The Provincial Government has again kindly contributed \$300.00, to enable this Association to send a representative team to Ottawa to compete for places in the Wimbledon Team.

The Dominion Association has granted this Association, the use of twenty Martini-Henry rifles, for which a bond had to be given guaranteeing their safe return when required.

The Council have made arrangements with the proprietor of the range at Sussex, which will enable them to have the use of it for the ensuing five years.

The Annual Competition took place at Sussex on the 24th of August, and following days.

The sum of \$1,114.00 was appropriated to the prize list, in addition to the several Cups and Medals which are the property of the Association, and a number of prizes given by individuals.

We have again to regret that the attendance of competitors was not as large as it should have been, as, notwithstanding the inducements offered, it shewed no increase over that of the previous year.

The Council would ask the earnest consideration of the members of the Association, to the best means of increasing interest in Rifle Shooting, and as to what improvements could be made in the system that would bring a larger number of marksmen to the Annual matches.

The system of Nursery Prizes or prizes from which first-class shots are excluded, would perhaps if more fully developed, produce good

results. The Monthly Competitions of the St. John County Rifle Association have had a beneficial effect on the shooting of that County, and if adopted by the other County Associations, would work a decided increase in the number of competitors at Sussex, and also an improvement in their shooting. It might also be worthy of consideration how far some of the matches might be exclusively appropriated to the non-commissioned officers, and men of the Militia force.

The subject of entrance fees and sighting shots has already attracted the attention of the Council, and it may be thought advisable to abolish both of them, thus reducing the expense of attending the matches.

The Association was represented at the meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association by a team of 15 members. It is gratifying to find that they secured, in addition to a number of individual prizes, the second place in the Provincial Match; a fact which shows, that our shooting compares favourably with that of the Dominion generally.

The Council have much pleasure in stating that, after paying all expenses for the past year and providing a prize list, quite as liberal as usual, a fair balance remains on hand, as will be seen from the Secretary-Treasurer's report, now placed before you, duly audited.

The Council wish to tender their thanks to their representatives at Ottawa, for the interest taken by them in the Association, and especially to Captain Perley and Captain Tilton, for their kind attention to the New Brunswick Team.

The Council also wish to thank the managers of the different lines of Railway, for the facilities afforded competitors of going to Sussex, at a reduced rate of fare; and the authorities who granted free passes over the Intercolonial to Riflemen in uniform.

They also have to thank the manager of the Western Union Telegraph Co., for assistance in placing a Telephone on the range; and the members of the press who made such full and accurate reports of proceedings at the Matches.
