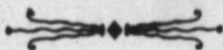

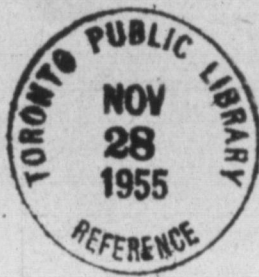

NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Annual Meeting of the Society was held on May 14th in the Lecture Room of the Young Women's Christian Association, Elm Street, His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor presiding.

The Rev. D. J. Macdonnell opened the meeting with prayer, after which the Lieutenant-Governor in a few words outlined the work done by the Society—its different methods of giving relief, its system of visiting, the labor test, and its efficiency in each department.

The minutes of preceding Annual Meeting were read by the Secretary.

The Treasurer's Statement was given by Mrs. Joseph Henderson, and adopted on motion of Rev. Dr. Parsons.

The Report of the Industrial Room Committee was given by Miss Hatton and adopted on motion of Rev Mr. Frizzell and Mr. Moore.

The Secretary's Report by Mrs. John A. Paterson was adopted on motion of Rev. D. J. Macdonnell.

The Reports of Divisions were also read by Mrs. Paterson and adopted,

The election of superintendents, officers and advisory committee closed the meeting.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1893-'94.

In reviewing the work of the Society, we find a gradual but steady increase of applications. As the city grows, poverty increases; as wealth multiplies, there is a corresponding multiplication of poverty. During the season just closed, 930 heads of families who have applied for relief have been helped in forms to suit their emergencies, by fuel, clothing, food or rent, as the case has required. Every one who applies is not helped, and it is needless to say that no assistance is given without investigation and definite information of each case brought to the fortnightly meetings of the Board.

The clever imposter with the carefully prepared tale of woe and the countenance to match appears at intervals, but with the Society's system of visiting the deception is soon discovered.

The woman whose children are taking music lessons, while she does not hesitate to ask for fuel or rent; the man who is an adept in the art of shivering with cold while asking for fuel, and who is receiving the same from several different sources, these and similar cases we enter as imposters.

Where intemperance is the cause of poverty, *unworthy*, is the adjective applied; but help cannot be refused to wives and children reduced to misery by this most potent manufacturer of pauperism.

We meet with many cases of the pauper who dispenses with the necessaries of life *only because* he is in full possession of its luxuries. The man or woman who prefers to beg because it is easier and more profitable than working.

As the rule of the Society is still enforced, that a certain amount of work (if at all possible), is required to be done by the applicant (if a woman), to show her willingness to help herself, this class soon drops out.

The highest aim of the Society is to help more particularly the respectable poor, who, on account of adverse circumstances, are in sore straits, but with temporary aid can be set on their feet once more. And just here we may say that fault has been found with the Society for its insufficient aid to many applying. It must be remembered that the Society is essentially to relieve, not *keep*, those who are in poverty. If its means would permit, the Society would be only too glad to set more firmly on their feet those to whom such assistance would prove a blessing. In the report of a charity organization in one of the largest cities in America, the following item is given:—

“After investigating many thousands of cases of pauperism, we find that less than one in 16 requires continuous aid; and less than one in 4 needs temporary help.”

Emotional charity supports hordes of hypocrites, and when it blunders into helping a worthy man, it only helps to pauperize and degrade him. Therefore the need of system. Emotional charity can find no place in the Society with its clearly defined methods of work, and with its labor test it cannot pauperize.

Railway tickets have been purchased for several families removing from the city to find work elsewhere. It has given much pleasure to the Board to hear that the change has been an improvement in their worldly position. To quote from a letter to one of the superintendents: “My husband will have steady work all summer. I can never forget your kindness and that of the ladies of the Society.” When a case is found to be particularly worthy, a combination is formed. The City Relief Officer, St. George's or St. Andrew's, or Irish Benevolent Society and the Relief will unite, and in this way more substantial aid is given than our Society alone could afford. 2,117 children are included in the 930 families assisted; of these, 1,666 are under thirteen years of age.

The sum of \$118 has been expended in rent, and the Board feels

gratified that it has removed a heavy burden from many who were unable to meet this debt. On the books are 89 widows, 40 aged couples, 117 with sickness in the family, 13 deserted wives, 3 husbands in the hospital, 4 husbands in jail, and 1 wife and 1 husband in the Asylum for the Insane. 136 of the 930 were helped last year; these were chiefly widows and families with the bread-winner unable to work on account of illness. Want of employment has been the almost universal reason given by the superintendents for the poverty of the applicants. 894 fuel orders and 500 bushels of coke have been distributed.

The Board feels most grateful that no debt will hamper the work next season, and that the small balance on hand will enable the superintendents to give help through the summer in cases of emergency and illness. For the past two seasons, owing to the cramped state of the finances, the summer expenditure had to be withheld. REPORT OF DIVISIONS.

FIRST DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Elliott. 41 families helped, including 60 children under 13; English and Canadian applicants in the majority. Four women deserted by their husbands. 96 orders for fuel were given, and \$8 paid for rent. Principal cause of distress want of work. The work test very successful; 200 garments were made of which 188 were sold.

SECOND DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Summerfeldt. 90 families assisted, with 93 children under thirteen; majority English. 392 bushels of coke distributed and 61 orders for fuel given; \$18 paid for rent. Chief causes of distress sickness and want of work. Work test very successful.

THIRD DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. McCuaig. 71 families helped, with 159 children under thirteen; majority English. 87 orders for fuel given and \$16 for rent. Causes of distress poverty and want of work. Thanks are tendered Dr. Hastings for attendance on the poor.

FOURTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Brett. 51 families helped, with 22 children under 13; 10 fuel orders given, and \$12 for rent. Causes of distress destitution, want of employment and old age.

FIFTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Morrison. 90 families helped, with 133 children under 13. Majority English and Irish. 70 orders given for fuel, and \$20 for rent. Cause of distress want of work.

SIXTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. St. Croix. 181 families helped, with 293 children under 13. Majority English and Irish. 166 orders given for fuel, and \$19 for rent. Causes of distress want of work, and in several cases intemperance. Work test very successful.

SEVENTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Page. 12 families helped, with 19 children under 13. Majority English. 21 fuel orders given, and \$10 paid for rent. Want of work cause of poverty. Work test satisfactory.

EIGHTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Owen. 60 families helped, with 114 children under 13. English and Canadian in the majority. 81 fuel orders given, and \$40 for rent. Illness and want of work causes of poverty.

NINTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Davis. 72 families helped, with 149 children under 13. 52 fuel orders given, and \$5 for rent. English and Irish predominating. Chief cause of distress want of work.

TENTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Christie. 77 families helped, with 154 children under 13. English and Canadian in the majority. 107 coal orders given, and \$3 for rent. Causes of distress want of work, and in a few cases intemperance.

ELEVENTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Shaw. 80 families helped, with 178 children under 13. English and Irish in the majority. 100 orders for fuel given, and no rent paid. Chief causes of distress lack of work, laziness and intemperance. Thanks are tendered Dr. Hart and Dr. McKenzie for gratuitous services.

TWELFTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Browne. 39 families helped, with 100 children under 13. All English with the exception of three Irish and two Scotch families. 19 fuel orders given, and \$3 for rent. Causes of poverty, want of work and in a few cases intemperance.

THIRTEENTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Valiant. 29 families helped, with 90 children under 13. English and Irish in the majority. 15 orders for fuel given, no rent paid. Work test most successful, in several cases the sewing done has been equal to the relief received. Cause of distress "no work."

FIFTEENTH DIVISION.—Superintendent, Mrs. Forbes. 48 families helped, with 97 children under 13. Majority English. 30 fuel orders given, no rent paid. Causes of distress want of work, old age and sickness. Work test most successful.

INDUSTRIAL ROOM REPORT

Your Committee is pleased to report very encouraging results from the work of supplying needy and deserving women with sewing during the past winter.

There are one hundred and forty names on the list, with an average attendance of fifty, every Thursday morning. Twelve hundred garments have been made, so one can fancy what a task the cutting out and preparing of this work is.

In addition to the money these women receive, many have benefited and improved greatly in their sewing, under the careful supervision and explanations of the workers.

The workroom closed on the 29th March; each woman was given some articles of clothing for herself or children, and all seemed grateful for the help they had received, enabling them to help provide food for their families during the "hard times and no work" cry, through which Toronto has passed.

Work was also given out in the Depositories, to those who received assistance in fuel or food, and a number of garments were returned from some divisions, in others the superintendents disposed of them privately, or allowed the women to sell them.

A sale has been held every Saturday afternoon from 2 to 6 p.m., and it is to be continued during the summer, in order to increase the funds for next year.

The annual sale, held on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd of May, was fairly successful, considering the many appeals made to charitably disposed people.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

TORONTO RELIEF SOCIETY.

ARTICLE I.—This Society shall be called the "TORONTO RELIEF SOCIETY," and it shall be in connection with the "YOUNG WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION."

ARTICLE II.—The object of this Society shall be to obtain and dispense assistance for the really needy; it shall investigate all cases of distress reported to it; it shall endeavor, by consultation and co-operation with other societies, to prevent imposture; it shall seek to discourage a pauper spirit by helping people to help themselves, and it shall aim at the moral and spiritual improvement of those assisted.

ARTICLE III.—For the furtherance of above object, the city shall be divided into Divisions, each of which shall be under the care of a Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent. Each Division shall be divided into not more than twelve districts, each of which shall be under the care of a presiding lady. There shall be also a Secretary for each Division. These shall constitute the Committee of the Division.

ARTICLE IV.—As it is one of the objects of this Society to discourage a pauper spirit by helping people to help themselves, there shall be an Industrial Department, its object being to provide work (in so far as possible) for women who are receiving aid from the Society. This branch of the work shall be placed under the care of a Committee (to be known as "The Industrial Room Committee") composed of a Convener, Secretary, Treasurer, the Superintendents and a representative from each Division.

ARTICLE V.—All members of the Board and workers in the Industrial Room, and all persons contributing \$1.00 to the funds of the Society, shall be considered members.

ARTICLE VI.—The business of the Society shall be conducted by a Board of Managers, composed of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and an Assistant Treasurer, if necessary, (who shall be members of the "Young Women's Christian Association,") the Superintendents and Secretaries of Divisions, the Presiding Ladies of Districts and the Convener, Secretary and Treasurer of the Industrial Room Committee. Of these Managers, the General Officers, the Superintendents of Divisions and the Convener of the Industrial Room Committee shall be elected, by ballot, at a public meeting to be called annually for the transaction of business in the beginning of May. (The Board shall have power to fill any of these offices not filled at the said annual business meeting, or any vacancies occurring in their number during the year.) Each Superintendent shall nominate her Assistant Superintendent and Presiding Ladies for appointment by the Board. The Secretaries of Divisions and the Representatives shall be chosen by the Division to which they belong. An Advisory Committee of gentlemen shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE VII.—There shall be an Executive Committee composed of the General Officers, the Superintendents of Divisions and the Convener of the Industrial Room

Committee. One Presiding Lady shall vote from each Division at the Executive Meetings, in the absence of the Superintendent. This Committee shall have power to transact such business as may require attention in the intervals between the stated meetings of the Board of Management. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII.—As this Society is in connection with the Young Women's Christian Association, the annual report shall be read at the annual public meeting of that Association.

ARTICLE IX.—A special meeting of the Society may be called, by advertisement in the daily papers, at such time and place as shall be agreed upon by the Executive Committee, notice of the object of such meeting to be given. A special meeting of the Managers may be called by the President at the request of three of the Superintendents of Divisions, each member of the Board of Management to be notified of the object of such meeting.

ARTICLE X.—Notice of any proposed addition to, or amendment of, the Constitution or By-laws, or the By-laws of the Industrial Room Committee, must be given in writing at the meeting of the Board in April. These proposed additions, or amendments, must pass the Board by a two-thirds majority of those present at the monthly meeting in May, and must then be brought before the Society for ratification at the ensuing Annual Meeting.

BY-LAWS.

ARTICLE I.—The Board of Managers shall hold its stated meetings on the first Monday of the month, at 2.30 p.m., or at such time and place as it shall appoint. Seven members shall constitute a quorum. Weekly meetings shall be held in the Divisions, at such time and place as shall be agreed upon.

ARTICLE II.—The President shall have general supervision of the work, and be *ex-officio* a member of all committees. She shall preside at all meetings of the Society and Board of Managers, and shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office.

ARTICLE III.—In the absence of the President and two Vice-Presidents, the Superintendent of a Division shall be appointed to preside, and shall perform all the duties of the office.

ARTICLE IV.—The Treasurer shall receive and keep in some chartered bank, all the moneys collected, and shall disburse them as the Board of Management shall direct. She shall report the state of the treasury at each monthly meeting. Her accounts shall be examined by an auditor appointed by the Board of Managers. She shall, at the proper time, each year, provide the Superintendents with the collecting books required, and with the necessary number of reports and cards. The books shall have "Toronto Relief Society" printed on the cover, and be numbered according to Division and District, with the boundaries of the District clearly defined in each book; these shall be endorsed by the President, and the Superintendent of the Division. The Treasurer shall keep a list of these books, and the boundaries of Districts, and shall receipt each book as it is returned to her.

ARTICLE V.—The Secretary shall send notice of all meetings to the General Officers and Superintendents of Divisions, keep the minutes of the same, and prepare the Annual Report of the Board of Managers. She shall also keep an alphabetical book in which each case, with such details as are considered necessary, shall be recorded.

ARTICLE VI.—DUTIES OF A SUPERINTENDENT :

SEC. 1. She shall divide the Division into Districts, and if possible obtain one Presiding Lady for each District.

SEC. 2. She shall secure a room for the Depository, and see that it is properly supplied with such things as are necessary for the relief of the needy.

SEC. 3. She shall attend each week at the Depository when it is open, and superintend the relief there given.

SEC. 4. She shall, whenever practicable, require each applicant to undertake some work from the Industrial Room.

SEC. 5. She shall run only monthly bills, these she shall check over, certify to their correctness by her signature, and hand them to the Treasurer before the ensuing monthly meeting. All payments for rent must be paid directly to the landlord, and these and all other receipts must be returned to the Treasurer without delay. She shall not overdraw her appropriation without the sanction of the Board.

SEC. 6. She shall receive reports of their Districts from her Presiding Ladies, and make a synopsis of these, with a list of those found undeserving, for the monthly meeting of the Board of Managers.

SEC. 7. She shall arrange for a sufficient number of collectors in the Division, and see that the collecting is done *systematically and promptly*.

ARTICLE VII.—DUTIES OF A SECRETARY OF A DIVISION :

SEC. 1. She shall attend at the Depository weekly, see that the books of registration there are properly kept, and take notes of any orders sent in by Presiding Ladies since last meeting. She shall also keep a list of the names and addresses of those out of work, and of the kind of work they can do.

SEC. 2. She shall render to the Superintendent a monthly account of goods received and distributed, with remarks as to character of recipient, etc.

ARTICLE VIII.—DUTIES OF A PRESIDING LADY :

SEC. 1. She shall thoroughly investigate all cases of distress in her District, and report them to the Superintendent. None but those visited shall receive systematic aid.

SEC. 2. She shall collect, or provide a collector, in the District assigned to her, and render to the Superintendent the moneys collected, with a list, prepared for the printer, of donations and subscriptions. Contributions from "Friends" and amounts under 25c. being added together as "Friends" and "small sums." In collecting, each person subscribing 25c. or over should be furnished with a report.

ARTICLE IX.—Appropriations shall be made by the Board of Management to each Division in proportion to the number reported as requiring relief.

ARTICLE X.—Care shall be taken to find out whether applicants for relief are receiving aid from any other sources, and no one receiving aid from this Society shall be permitted to beg from door to door.

ARTICLE XI.—As it shall be the object of this Society to dispense charity on the same basis throughout the city, *delicacies* shall not be given from the funds collected, except in cases of sickness, which must be specially reported; also the Society shall, as far as possible, avoid undertaking maintenance of applicants seeking rather to obtain permanent assistance for those needing it, among the charitable institutions of the city.

BY-LAWS

OF THE INDUSTRIAL ROOM COMMITTEE.

ARTICLE I.—The Convener shall call regular monthly meetings of the Committee during the winter months, the first meeting of the season to be held not later than the last week in October. She shall take the superintendence of all work done by the Committee. She shall present a monthly report to the Board.

ARTICLE II.—The Secretary shall send notices, in the name of the Convener, of all meetings of the Committee to each member, keep the minutes, and prepare the annual report for the Board. She shall also keep lists of the names and addresses of women receiving work, and present a copy of such lists with her monthly report to the Board.

ARTICLE III.—The Treasurer shall receive and keep in some chartered Bank, all moneys connected with this branch of the work, and shall disburse them as the Committee (subject to the veto of the Board) shall direct. She shall report each month the state of the treasury to the Committee, and present a copy of this report at the monthly Board meeting. Her accounts shall be examined by an auditor appointed by the Committee.

ARTICLE IV.—During the winter the Committee shall meet for the transaction of business on a stated day in the last week of each month. Five members shall form a quorum. The Committee shall have power (subject to the approval of the Board), to make its own arrangements as to methods, or rules of work, and as to the disposal of the garments made, so long as the object of this branch of the work is kept steadily in view. The Board shall, however, have power to change, by a vote of the majority of those present, these methods, or rules, should it seem best to do so, notice of such changes having been given one month previously both to the Committee and the Board.

ARTICLE V.—A special meeting of the Committee shall be called by the Convener, or by the Board, at the written request of three of its members.

ARTICLE VI.—The Committee may annually add to its membership such other ladies as it shall consider necessary for the work under its care, by submitting the names of such ladies to the Board for appointment. The ladies so appointed shall not be members of the Board, but shall have in every other way the same privileges as the other members of the Committee.

ARTICLE VII.—All moneys raised by, or donated to, this part of the Society's work, shall be under the control of the Board, and shall be used for the object set forth in these by-laws.

ARTICLE VIII.—The rooms shall be as nearly as possible in the central part of the city.

ARTICLE IX.—Work shall be supplied only to those who are really destitute, and each applicant for work must bring a voucher as to need from some member of the Board in the Division to which she belongs. The Committee may give work to women whose names are not on the books of the Society, on the recommendation of one of the Superintendents.

ARTICLE X.—A scale of prices for work shall be fixed by the Committee.

ARTICLE XI.—As each Depository Committee will insist, when practicable, on some work being done by all applicants for assistance, the Industrial Committee shall not refuse work to inferior workers.

ARTICLE XII.—The annual report of the Committee shall be published in the annual report of the Society, so that the public may know that this Society is, while relieving distress, also striving, by means of its Industrial Committee, to avoid pauperizing those who are the recipients of its aid.
