London, June 27.—Brening, Earl Granville made a lengthy explanation before the English House of Lords concerning arbitration negotiations.

He announced that the injunction of Secroy had been removed from the doings of the Arbitration Tribunal, and on Friday an official declaration of the Board's intentions will be given to the public.

He considered the ratification of the withdrawal of indirect claims as certain, and repelled, with considerable warmth, the assertion of Lord Cairnes that had matters not gone thus smoothly for England at the Tribunal, the Administration would have been in danger.

His statement was regarded, by a majority of the Lords, as highly satisfactory.

In the House of Commons, Mr. Gladstone also made an explanation, and presently stated that the controversy with regard to indirect claims was ended.

He believed the Treaty of Washington was effective against the revival of indirect claims.

Paris, June 27.—The Garde Republicaine Band, now participating in the International Peace Jubilee at Boston, has been authorized by President Thiers to visit Chicago.

It is reported Count Von Arnim at Thiers will on Friday sign a Treaty providing for anticipating the time for the liberation of French territory from occupation by the German troops.

The result of negotiations will be communicated to the Assembly on Monday by the President, who will demand authority to conclude a loan necessary to make the payments provided for in the Treaty.

The London Strike—Twenty Thousand Workmen Idle.

London, June 24.—The lockout of builders (carpenters and joiners) in the result of the refusal of the men to accept the compromise offered by the employers. Twenty thousand are out of work. They have been joined by the masons and bricklayers.

The men demand fifty-one hours instead of fifty and a half hours per week, and also one shilling per day additional. The employers state that the demand does not justify the advance. The men state that the reason of the present strike is the increased expense of living, and they do not fear any interference from workmen outside of London, as the latter obtain better pay than those in the city. They say their unions are financially strong and feel confident of success. The Times says that the strike will result in England losing its present advantages in industrial production.

The Portland Knight Templars in Montreal.—On Sunday morning this city was visited by a body of Knight Templars of Portland, about eighty in number. The body, which was accompanied by its band, was under the command of Eminent Commander S. C. Gordon. On their arrival they were received by Eminent Commander Gordon and the members of the Richard Court de Lion Encampment of this city. Yesterday afternoon a great number of the body went over to LeParre to inspect our military force, and to visit the Grand Prior of Knights Templars in Canada, Col. Mead Moore, to whom Eminent Sir Knight Gordon was introduced by illustrious Sir Knight J. S. A. Lelano. The officers of the party are: Eminent Commander S. C. Gordon, Generalissimo A. M. Benson, E. G. Stone, S. W. G. Small, Recorder, Ira Berry, J. W. J. Warden, J. B. Y. Hodson, J. G. Stone, W. W. Davis, F. P. Hall, and L. C. Sharp. Yesterday morning the party ran the Lachine rapids, and subsequently camped on the Champ de Mars, where the Fire Brigade gave an exhibition. The Knights then took a drive round the mountain, and finished their tour with dinner at the Terrapin Restaurant and subsequently left for Quebec.—(Gazette.)
