REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

The Committee of Management of the St. George's Society have the honor to submit the following Report of the Society's proceedings during the past year.

The anniversary of St. George's Day, was celebrated by morning service at the Cathedral, when a very excellent sermon was preached by the Rev. G. V. Housman, M.A., prayers being read by Rev. M. M. Fothergill. An appropriate musical service was arranged by F. W. Mills, Esq., F. C. O., Organist of the Cathedral, to whom, with the ladies and gentlemen of the voluntary choir, the Society is much indebted.

The collection in aid of the charitable fund amounted to \$56 10.

The proceedings of the day were brought to a close by a Promenade Concert at the Music Hall, at which several ladies and gentlemen amateurs and the Band of the 53rd Regt. very kindly assisted.

A heavy drain upon the Society's funds has been caused by the forwarding of immigrants to the west, consequent on the Emigration movement in England, and also in aiding the return of some of those who were unfitted by age or infirmity for the hardships of emigrants' trials.

The expenditure by the Charitable Committee during the past year has amounted to \$524 99.

The Membership of the Society has been increased by one Ordinary Member—Mr. F. W. Mills, and two Life Members—Messrs. John Burstall and Alexander Pope; and one Ordinary has become a Life Member, viz: Mr. James Patton, jr.

The Society Las to regret the loss by death since its last meeting of Thomas Cary, Esq., at Quebec, one of the original members of the Society, John Bonner, Esq., at Staten Island, N. Y., and Mr. Thomas Hatch, at Quebec, all ordinary members, and of Mr. Henry Knight, a life member; also at Cheltenham, England, William Hedley Anderson, Esq., past President of the Society and also one of its original members.

Your Committee would strongly recommend Ordinary Members to become Life Members in order that the Society may be better able to meet the increasing démands on its funds. An effort should also be made to add to the roll of members.

The Committee cannot close this Report without again expressing their obligations to J. E. Deschamps, Esq., Agent of the Richelieu Company, and to the Manager of the Grand Trunk Railroad, as well as to the Quebec and Galf Ports S. S. Company, for forwarding at reduced rates many distressed Englishmen; also to William Rae, Esq., of the firm of Allans, Rae & Co., for his personal endeavours to promote the interests of the Society. They would also bear testimony to the continued advantages derived from the existing arrangements with those Charitable Institutions, the Finlay Asylum and the Ladies' Protestant Home.

The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first-Anglican Bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada with his father, 1793, and died after a brief illness at Barfield, his country seat, on 5th Jany, 1863. He was mineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop, 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his fook. And in the dreadful visitations of cholers in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day dreadful visitations of cholers in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847 when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the elergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec, in 1849 and 1854, he was dilligent in visiting the hespitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times he
