Bill Respecting the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Discussions on the Different Sections.

Winter Port Resolutions--Dr. Alward's Speech.

THURSDAY, P. M., March 15.

After dinner, Mr. Young moved a resolution, seconded by Mr. Park, in reference to Big River bridge, Bathurst, Gloucester.

Hon. Mr. McEllan, in the absence of Hon. Mr. Ryan, said the information would be furnished, as far as practicable.

Mr. Young moved his resolution, seconded by Mr. Tweedie, in reference to the building of the bridge across Little Pass, Cape Breton.

Hon. Mr. McEllan, in the absence of Hon. Mr. Ryan, said he had no doubt all documents, etc., in possession of the government would be furnished.

The rule having been suspended, Mr. White introduced a bill providing for the appointment of stipendiary magistrates with civil jurisdiction in the parishes of St. John, Norton and Haspington.

Bills were introduced by Hon. Mr. Mitchell to amend the Fabrics act of 1884; by Mr. Wilson to authorize York municipality to incur expenses to take up certain other debts.

Mr. Tweedie committed a bill to exempt certain property in the town of Chatham from taxation. Dr. Alward in the chair.

Mr. Tweedie stated that it was the pulp factory, which Mr. Fisher was manager, as well as the plant and machinery that it was proposed to exempt from taxation.

Mr. Hutchison said that while the enterprise was believed to be that which would benefit Chatham, there was an impression that the parish of Chatham should pay the taxes from which the property will be relieved.

Hon. Mr. Mitchell committed a bill to amend chap. 110 consolidated statutes of fees, trespass and poisons. Mr. Humphrey in the chair.

Hon. Mr. Mitchell said that since committing the bill, he had had a general had informed him that Mr. Killam, who was unavoidably absent, had some amendments or additions to make to this bill.

Answering Mr. Stockton, Hon. Mr. Mitchell said the bill only changed the way to shall in the duties of the pound-keeper. At present some of the pound-keepers think that they can act on their own judgment and return.


