

BILL.

An Act to enlarge the Representation of the People of this Province in Parliament.

WHEREAS the increasing population of this Province and Preamble. the necessity of providing for its growing wants, and the developement of its resources, render it imperative to enlarge the Representation of the People thereof in the Legisblative Assembly, and to apportion that representation more fairly, and with this view—to alter the limits of certain Counties and other Electoral divisions—to erect certain other Counties and to adopt other Legislative provisions in the behalf aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, 10 by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Pro-15 vinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That from and after the end of this present Provincial Parliament, the Counties, Cities and Towns and Unions of Towns and Counties hereinafter mentioned, shall be the subdivisions of the Pro-20 vince upon which the Representation of the People thereof shall be based and regulated in the manner hereinafter prescribed, and such subdivisions shall, in so far as they may differ from those now existing for like purposes, be substituted for them as regards Elections of Members of the said Assembly and all matters 25 thereunto relating: That is to say:

LOWER CANADA.

2. The County of Gaspé shall be bounded on the south-west County of by a line commencing at Mackarel point, on the north side and Gaspé. near the mouth of the Bay of Chaleurs, thence running north-west forty-seven miles, thence south sixty-nine degrees west, until it 30 strikes a line drawn south-east from Cap-Chat on the River St. Lawrence, on the west by the line last mentioned, and on the north and east by the River and Gulph of St. Lawrence; including in the said County the Island of Bonaventure, and all the Islands wholly or in part opposite to the said County and nearest thereto, and also the 35 Magdalen Islands in the Gulf of St. Lawrence; the said County so bounded, comprising the Fiefs and Seigniories of Sainte Anne, Mont-Louis, La Magdaleine, Grande Vallée des Monts and Anse de l'Etang, Grand River and Pabos, and the Townships of Cap-Chat, Sydenham, Fox, Cap-Rosier, Gaspé Bay North, Gaspé Bay 10 South, York, Douglas, Malbaie, Percé and Newport, the Magdalen Islands, and the said Islands, lying opposite to the said County and nearest to it.

3. The County of Bonaventure shall be bounded on the east by County of Bothe County of Gaspé, on the north partly by the said County of naventure.

Gaspé, and partly by the prolongation of the same rear line, until it meets the County of Temiscouata hereinafter described, on the west by the County of Rimouski, and on the South by the Bay of Chaleurs and the southern limits of the Province, and shall comprise that part of the District of Gaspé lying between the 5 County of Gaspé and the District of Quebec, including all the Islands wholly or partly opposite to the said County of Bonaventure and nearest thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Shoolbred and the Townships of Port Daniel, Hope, Cox, Hamilton, New Richmond, Maria, Carleton, Nouvelle, 10 Mann, Ristigouche and Matapédia.

County of Ri-

4. The County of Rimouski shall be bounded on the east by the County of Gaspé, on the west by the north-western line of the parish of Saint Simon, prolonged to the limits of the Province, on the south-east by the County of Bonaventure, and on the north-15 west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River lying nearest to the said County of Rimouski and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded, comprising the Parishes and Settlements of Matane, Metis, Saint Joseph, Sainte Flavie, Sainte Luce, Saint Germain, Bic, Saint Fabien, Saint 20 Simon, and the Townships of MacNider, Matane, Saint Denis and the augmentation thereof, Cabot, Neigette and Macpés.

County of Temiscouata.

5. The County of Temiscouata shall be bounded on the northeast by the Counties of Rimouski and Bonaventure as hereinbefore described, on the south-west by the north-western line of the Parish 25 of River-du-Loup, and of the Parish of Saint Alexandre, to the southern angle of the said Parish of Saint Alexandre, and thence by the south-western line of the Township of Parke, and the prolongation thereof, to the Province line, on the south-east by the Province line, on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence, 30 including Green Island, and all the Islands in the said River Saint Lawrence nearest to the said County of Temiscouata, and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the parishes of Trois-Pistoles, Saint Eloi, Isle Verte, Saint George de Cacouna, Saint Arsène, Saint Patrice de la Rivière-du-Loup, 35 Saint Alexandre and the Townships of Parke, Whitworth, Viger, Des Sauvages, Begon and Hauterive.

County of Kamouraska.

6. The County of Kamouraska shall be bounded on the northeast by the County of Temiscouata, on the south-west by the southwestern limits of the Parish of Sainte Anne and of the Township of 40 Ixworth, prolonged to the southern limits of the Province, on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River nearest to the said County of Kamouraska, and wholly or partly opposite thereto, and on the south-east by the Province line; the said County so bounded comprising the 45 Parishes of Saint André, Saint Louis of Kamouraska, Saint Paschal, Sainte Hélène, Saint Denis, Mont Carmel, Saint Pacôme, Rivière-Ouelle and Sainte Anne, and the Townships of Burgay, Woodbridge and Ixworth.

7. The County of L'Islet shall be bounded on the north-east by County of the County of Kamouraska, as above described, on the south-west L'Islet. by the south-western limits of the Parishes of L'Islet and Saint Cyrille, prolonged in a south-eastern direction to the province 5 line, on the south-east by the province line, and on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all the Islands in the said River nearest to the said County of L'Islet, and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Roch, Saint Jean, L'Islet, Saint Cyrille and the 10 Township of Ashford.

- S. The County of Bellechasse shall be bounded on the north- County of east by the County of L'Islet, as above described, on the north- Bellechasse. west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all the Islands inthe said River lying nearest to the said County of Bellechasse, and 15 wholly or partly opposite thereto, on the south-east by the province line, and on the south-west by the north-eastern and south-eastern limits of the Parish of Saint Michel, the southwestern limits of the Parish of St. Raphael, prolonged in the same direction to the Township of Buckland, the northern limits 20 of the same Township running to the east, and the north-eastern limits of the same Township prolonged to the province line; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Cap Saint Ignace, Saint Thomas, Saint Pierre, Berthier, Saint François, Saint Valier and Saint Raphael, Grosse-Isle, Crane Island, Goose-25 Island and the Township of Ashburton, Armagh, Montmini, Mailloux and Roux.
- 9. The County of Dorchester shall be bounded on the north- County of east by the County of Bellechasse, as above described, as far as the Dorchester. eastern angle of the Parish of Saint Charles, on the south-east by 30 the south-eastern limits of the Parish of Saint Charles, and of the Parishes of Saint Henri, Notre-Dame and Saint Jean Chrysostôme, on the south-west by the River Chaudière; and on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Michel, Beaumont, Saint Charles, Saint 35 Joseph, Notre-Dame, Saint Jean Chrysostôme and Saint Henri.

10. The County of Etchemin shall be bounded on the north-east County of by the County of Bellechasse, as above described, on the south-east Etchemin. by the province line, until it meets the prolongation of the northeastern line of the Township of Linière, thence, on the south-west 40 by the north-eastern and north-western line of the said Township of Linière, the south-western line of the Townships of Watford, Cranbourne and Frampton, the south-eastern limits of the Parish of Sainte Marguerite, including Sainte Hémédine, the southwestern limits of the said Parish of Sainte Marguerite, the south-45 eastern and south-western limits of the Parish of Saint Isidore, the south-eastern, south-western and north-western limits of the Parish of Saint Lambert, including that part which lies to the west of the River Chaudière, and on the north-west by part of the Parish of Saint Nicolas and by the County of Dorchester, as above des-

scribed; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Gervais, Saint Lazare, Saint Anselme, Sainte Claire, Sainte Marguerite, Saint Isidore and Saint Lambert, and the Townships of Buckland, Standon, Ware, Frampton, Cranbourne and Watford.

County of Beauce.

11. The County of Beauce shall be bounded on the north-east 5 by the County of Etchemin, on the east by the province line, on the west by the limits of the District of Quebec, and on the north-west by the southern limits of the Townships of Colraine, Thetford and Broughton, again, on the south-west by the south-eastern limits of the Township of Broughton and of the Parishes of Saint Sylvestre 10 and Saint Giles, and on the north-west by the north-western limits of the Parish of Saint Bernard and by the County of Etchemin, as above described; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Bernard, Saint Elzear, Sainte Marie, Saint Joseph, Saint Frederick, Saint François, Saint George and the 15 Townships of Jersey, Linière, Marlow, Rixborough, Spaulding, Litchfield, Woburn, Gayhurst, Dorset, Shenley, Aylmer, Price, Lambton, Forsyth, Adstock and Tring.

County of Megantic.

12. The County of Megantic shall be bounded on the south-east by the County of Beauce, on the north-west by the limits of the 20 District of Quebec, towards the augmentation of Somerset, on the north-west by the augmentation of Somerset, the south-eastern line of the Seigniory of Lotbinière, the south-western line of the Seigniory of Sainte Croix, the north-western limits of the Parishes of Sainte Agathe and Saint Sylvestre; the said County so bounded 25 comprising the Parishes of Sainte Agathe and Saint Sylvestre, and the Townships of Inverness, Nelson, Somerset, Halifax, Leeds, Broughton, Thetford, Ireland and Colraine.

County of Lotbinière.

13. The County of Lotbinière shall be bounded on the northwest by the River Saint Lawrence, on the south-west by the limits 30 of the District of Quebec, on the south-east by the County of Megantic, as above described, and on the north-east by the Counties of Beauce, Etchemin and Dorchester, as above described; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Nicolas, Saint Giles, Saint Antoine, Saint Flavien, Sainte Croix, Lotbi-35 nière, Saint Jean Deschaillons and the augmentatiom of Somerset.

County of Bagot.

14. The County of Bagot shall be bounded on the north-west by the County of Portneut, as heremaster described, on the south by the parallel of the forty-eighth degree of north latitude, as far as the prolongation of the eastern line of the Township of Saint Johns, on 40 the Saguenay, thence, on the east by the said prolongation and the said line to the River Saguenay, and, crossing the River Saguenay, by the prolongation of the said eastern line, to the River Sainte Marguerite, on the north-east by a line to be drawn from the above point on the River Sainte Marguerite, to the limits of the Province, 45 on the north by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships and Settlements of Saint Johns, La Trinité, Harvey, Simard, Tremblay, Bagot, Chicoutimi, Laterrière, Jonquière, Kinogomi, Labarre and Metabetchouan.

15. The County of Tadoussac shall be bounded on the south- County of Taeast by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands nearest to doussac. the said County and opposite thereto, wholly or in part, on the south by the parallel of the forty-eighth degree of north latitude to the 5 Conuty of Bagot, as above described, on the west and south-west by the said County of Bagot, on the north-west by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Townships and settlements of Saguenay, Tadoussac, Little Saguenay, Sainte Marguerite, Bergeronnes, Escoumins, Herville, Laval, Latour, 10 Betsiamites, the Seigniory of Mille Vaches or Portneuf, the Terra Firma of Mingan, the Islets of Mingan, the Island and Seigniory of Anticosti, and all the other tracts of land comprised within the limits aforesaid.

16. The County of Saguenay shall be bounded on the north- County of Sa-15 west by a line to be drawn from Cap de l'Abattis on the River guenay. Saint Lawrence, towards the north-west and parallel to the northeastern line of the Seigniory of Beauport, to the County of Bagot as above described, on the north by the Counties of Bagot and Tadoussac as above described, on the south-east by the River Saint 20 Lawrence; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Little River, Baie Saint Paul, Saint Urbain, Eboulements, Saint Irénée, Malbaie, Sainte Agnès, Saint Fidèle, the Townships of Settrington and Callières, Isle-aux-Coudres, Hare Island, and all the other tracts of land comprised within the above limits, and all 25 Islands in the River Saint Lawrence, nearest to the said County, and wholly or partly opposite thereto.

17. The County of Montmorency shall be bounded on the County of west by the County of Quebec, as hereinafter described, on the Montmo. north by the parallel of the forty-eighth degree of north latitude, on rency. 30 the east by the County of Saguenay, on the south-east by the River Saint Lawrence, including the Island of Orleans and all the Islands nearest to the County of Montmoreney, and wholly or partly opposite thereto; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Pierre, Saint Jean, Sainte Famille, Saint Laurent and 35 Saint François, Isle Madame, and Isle-aux-Reaux, and the Parishes of Saint Féréol, Saint Joachim, Sainte Anne, Chateau Richer, Laval and Ange Gardien.

18. The County of Quebec shall be bounded on the south- County of west by the western limits of the Parish of Sainte-Foye, the north- Quebec. 40 ern limits of the same, the western limits of the Parishes of Saint Roch de Québec and of Saint Ambroise, and of the Seigniory of Saint Gabriel and the prolongation thereof, on the south-east by the River Saint Lawrence, on the north-east by the south-western line of the Seigniory of La Côte de Beaupré until it meets the south-45 eastern line of the Township of Tewkesbury, thence, towards the north-east by the said south-eastern line as far as the eastern corner of the said Township, thence, by the north-eastern line of the said Township to the rear thereof and by the prolongation of the said north-eastern line, on the north by the County of Bagot as above des-

cribed, excepting therefrom the City of Quebec within its present extent and limits; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes and Settlements of Beauport, Saint Edmond, Notre-Dame de Québec without the City, Saint Roch de Québec without the City, Saint Gabriel, Saint Ambroise, Charlesbourg, Sainte-Foye, Notre-5 Dame des Anges, the Townships of Stoneham and Tewkesbury, Fief Hubert, and all other tracts of land included in the above limits.

City of Quebec.

19. The City of Quebec shall be comprised within its present limits. 10

County of Portneuf.

20. The County of Portneuf shall be bounded on the northeast by the County of Quebec as above described, and the prolongation of the south-western line thereof to the limits of the Province, on the south-east by the River Saint Lawrence, on the north-west by the limits of the Province, and on the south-west by the limits 15 of the District of Quebec; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Casimir, Grondines, Deschambault, Cap-Santé, Saint Basile, Saint Raymond, Sainte Catherine, Ecureuils, Pointeaux-Trembles, Saint Augustin, Ancienne Lorette, and the Townships of Alton and Roquemont. 20

County of Champlain.

21. The County of Champlain shall be bounded on the southwest by the River Saint Maurice until it meets the south-western line of the Seigniory of Cap de la Magdeleine, and thence by the said line prolonged to the limits of the Province, on the north-west by the limits of the Province, on the south-east by the River Saint 25 Lawrence, on the north-east by the County of Portneuf as above described; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Sainte Anne, Batiscan, Sainte Geneviève de Batiscan, Champlain, Cap de la Magdeleine, Saint Maurice, Saint Stanislas, Saint Justin, Saint Prosper, Saint Nazaire, and the Township of Radnor.

Town of

22. The Town of Three-Rivers shall be comprised within its Three Rivers. present limits.

County of St. Maurice.

23. The County of Saint Maurice shall be bounded on the north-east by the Town of Three-Rivers and the County of Champlain, on the south-east by the River Saint Lawrence, on the 35 north-west by the limits of the Province, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Parishes of Yamachiche, Saint Sévère, Saint Barnabé and the Township of Caxton, prolonged to the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Parish and Banlieue of Three-Rivers, Fief Saint Etienne, the Forges, 40 the Parishes of Pointe-du-Lac, Yamachiche, Saint Sévère, Saint Barnabé, and the Townships of Caxton and Shawinigan.

County of Maskinongé.

24. The County of Maskinongé shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Saint Maurice as above described, on the south-west by the limits of the District of Three-Rivers, on the 45 south-east by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands nearest

to the said County and wholly or partly opposite thereto, on the north-west by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Rivière-du-Loup, Saint Léon, Saint Paulin, Sainte Ursule, Saint Didace and the Township of 5 Hunterstown.

25. The County of Nicolet shall be bounded on the north- County of Nieast by the limits of the Districts of Quebec and Three-Rivers, up colet. to the distance of two miles into the Township of Blandford, thence on the south-east by a perpendicular line drawn across the Town-10 ship of Blandford, and thence by the western line thereof to the limits of the Seigniories, and by the limits between the Seigniories and the Townships, as far as the north-eastern line of the Augmentation of Aston, going to the south, thence going to the north by the south-western line of the said Augmentation, and thence by the 15 south-eastern line of the Seigniory of Nicolet, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Seigniory of Nicolet, on the northwest by the River Saint Lawrence; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Pierre, Gentilly, Sainte Gertrude, excepting the Township of Maddington, Bécancour, Saint Gré-20 goire, Nicolet, Sainte Monique, part of the Township of Blandford and the Augmentation of the Township of Aston.

26. The County of Yamaska shall be bounded on the north-County of east by the County of Nicolet as above described, on the north-west Yamaska. by the River Saint Lawrence, on the south-west by the limits of 25 the Districts of Three-Rivers and Montreal, on the south-east by the southern limits of the Parishes of Saint Zéphirin, Saint Francois and Saint David; the said County so bounded comprising the Abenaki Settlement, and the Parishes of Saint David, Saint Michel, Saint François, La Baie and Saint Zéphirin.

27. The County of Berthier shall be bounded on the south- county of east by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands nearest to Berthier. the said County and wholly or in part opposite thereto, on the northeast by the limits between the Districts of Three-Rivers and Montreal, on the north-west by the north-eastern limits of the Parishes 35 of Lanoraie, Saint Thomas and Saint Charles, on the north-west by the north-western limits of the said Parish of Saint Charles, and the south-eastern limits of the Parishes of Sainte Melanie and Saint Félix, thence by the north-eastern limits of Saint Félix, and the north-western limits of the Township of Brandon and their pro-40 longation, to the limits of the Province, on the north-west by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising Isle du Pads, Isle Saint Ignace, and the Parishes and Settlements of Berthier, Sainte Elizabeth, Saint Norbert, Saint Barthelemi, Saint Cuthbert, and Saint Gabriel.

28. The County of Joliette shall be bounded on the north-County of east by the County of Berthier as above described, on the south-east Joliette. by the River Saint Lawrence, on the north-west by the limits of the Province, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the

Seigniory of Lavaltrie, and thence by the northern limits thereof, and the south-western limits of the Seigniory of Daillebout prolonged to the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes and Settlements of St. Félix, Sainte Melanie, Ramsay, Lanoraie, Lavaltrie, Saint Thomas, Saint Charles and 5 Saint Paul, and part of the Township of Cathcart.

County of Leinster. 29. The County of Leinster shall be bounded on the northeast by the County of Joliette, on the south-east by the north-western limits of the Parishes of L'Assomption, Saint Roch and Saint Lin, and of the Seigniory of Terrebonne, to the south-western line of the Township of Kilkenny, on the south-west by the south-western line of the Township of Kilkenny, prolonged to the limits of the Province, on the north-west by the limits of the Province; the said County so bounded comprising part of the Township of Cathcart, the Parishes of Saint Ambroise de Kildare, Saint Alphonse, Saint 15 Jacques, Saint Alexis, Saint Esprit, and the Townships of Rawdon, Chertsey, Kilkenny, Wexford, Chilton, Carrick and Doncaster.

County of L'Assomption.

30. The County of L'Assomption shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Joliette as above described, on the south-20 east by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite the same, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Parishes of Lachenaie, Saint Henri de Mascouche and Saint Lin, on the north-west by the County of Leinster as above described; the said County so 25 bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Sulpice, including Isle Bouchard, Repentigny, L'Assomption, Saint Roch, Lachenaie, Saint Henri and Saint Lin.

County of Terrebonne.

31. The County of Terrebonne shall be bounded on the south-east by the northern branch of the Ottawa River, including 30 all Islands in the said River nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite the same; on the north-east by the Counties of L'Assomption and Leinster, as above described; on the northwest by the north-western limits of the Parishes of Sainte Thérèse and Saint Janvier, and of that part of the Parish of Saint Jérôme 95 which is in the continuation of the Seigniory of Mille Isles, as far as the cordon between the Côte de la Rivière à Gagnon and the Cote Saint Joseph, then, following the said line or cordon, to that part of the continuation of Mille-Isles called the Seigniory Dumont, thence along the division line between the Seigniories Dumont and an Bellefeuille, thence along the south-eastern line of the Township of Morin to the line between numbers twenty-six and twenty-five thereof, thence along the line between the said numbers to the Township of Howard, thence along the eastern line of the Township of Howard, the southern and the western line of the Town-45 ship of Beresford, and the prolongation of this latter line to the County of Leinster; the said County, so bounded, comprising the Parishes of Terrebonne, Sainte Thérèse, Sainte Anne. Saint Janvier, Lacorne, part of the Parish of Saint Jérôme, the Townships of Abercrombie and Beresford, and part of the Township of Morin.

32. The County of Two-Mountains shall be bounded on the County of east by the County of Terrebonne as above described, on the south Two-Moun-5 by the River Ottawa and the Lake of Two-Mountains, including tains. all Islands nearest to the said county and wholly or in part opposite thereto, on the west by the western limits of the Parishes of Saint Benoit, Sainte Scholastique and Saint Columban, and the northern limits of the Township of Gore, thence by the eastern limits of the 10 Townships of Wentworth and Howard, to the County of Terrebonne, as above described; the said County, so bounded, comprising the Parishes of Saint Eustache, Saint Augustin, Saint Benoit, Sainte Scholastique, Saint Columban, the Mission of the Lake of Two-Mountains, that part of the Parish of Saint Jérôme 15 which is in the Seigniory of Two-Mountains, that part of the same Parish of Saint Jérôme which comprises the Côtes Saint Joseph, Saint Eustache, Sainte Marguerite, Sainte Angelique, and part of the Township of Morin.

33. The County of Argenteuil shall be bounded on the east County of Ar-20 by the County of Two-Mountains as above described, and genteuil. the northern portion of the County of Terrebonne as above described, on the north-east by the northern portion of the County of Leinster as above described, on the south by the River Ottawa and the Lake of Two-Mountains, including all Islands nearest to the 25 said County and wholly or in part opposite thereto, on the west by the eastern limits of the Seigniory of Petite Nation and the prolongation thereof, to the County of Leinster; the said County so bounded comprising the Parihes of Sainte Placide, Saint Hermas, Saint Andrews, Saint Jérusalem, and the Townships of Chatham, 30 Wentworth, Grenville and Augmentation, Harrington, Gore, Howard, Arundel, Montcalm, Wolfe, Salaberry and Grandisson.

34. The County of Ottawa shall be bounded on the east by County of the County of Argenteuil, on the north-east by the northern Ottawa. portion of the County of Leinster, on the south, south-west and 35 west by the Grand or Ottawa River throughout its whole length as far as Lake Temiscamingue, and from the head of the said Lake by a true north line to the limits of the Hudson's Bay Territory, including all the Islands in the Grand or Ottawa River and Lake Temiscamingue wholly or partly opposite to the County of Ottawa, 40 on the north-west by the limits of the province; the said County so bounded comprising the Seigniory of Petite Nation, the Townships of Lochaber and its augmentation, Buckingham, Templeton, Hull, Eardly, Onslow, Bristol, Clarendon, Litchfield, Mansfield, Grand Calumet and Alumette Island, the Townships Ponsonby, Amherst, 45 Rippon, Derry, Portland, Wakefield, Masham, Aldfield, Thorne, Waltham, Chichester, Sheen, Esher, Aberdeen, Hastings, Aberford, Kirkiby, Labouchere, Gladstone, Graham, Low, Denholm, Bowman, Picanoka, Hincks, Bigelow, Aylwin, Wright, Northfield, Blake, Bouchette, Wabassee, Dudley, Notowese, Kensington,

Bouthillier, Kiamica, Egan, Aumond, Merritt, Campbell, Pontefract and Suffolk, and all the Townships included by the boundaries aforesaid, and north of the Grand or Ottawa River.

County of Drummond.

35. The County of Drummond shall be bounded on the northwest by the Counties of Nicolet and Yamaska, as above des-5 cribed, on the north-east by the north-eastern and eastern limits of the Township of Aston, the north-eastern and south-eastern limits of the Township of Horton, and the north-eastern limits of the Townships of Simpson and Kingsey, on the south-west by the north-western line of the Township of Upton to the line between the 10 eighth and ninth range thereof, thence along the said line and along the north-eastern line of the said Township of Upton and ot the Township of Acton, and the south-western line of the Township of Durham, on the south-east by the south-eastern limits of the Townships of Durham and Kingsey; the said County so bounded com-15 prising the Township of Aston without the Augmentation, part of the Township of Upton, and the Townships of Durham, Grantham, Wendover, Horton, Simpson, Wickham and Kingsey.

County of Arthabaska.

36. The County of Arthabaska shall be bounded on the north-west by the County of Nicolet as above described, on the north-20 east by the County of Megantic as above described, on the south-west by the County of Drummond as above described, and the western limits of the Townships of Tingwick and Wotton, and on the south-east by the south-eastern limits of the Township of Wolfstown, the Augmentation of Ham and the Township of Wotton; the 25 said County so bounded comprising the Townships of Maddington, part of Blandford, Warwick, Stanfold, Arthabaska, Bulstrode and Augmentation, Chester and Tingwick.

County of Dudswell. 37. The County of Dudswell shall be bounded on the east by the Counties of Megantic and Beauce as above described, on the 30 south-west by the north-eastern limits of the Townships of Stoke and Westbury, the north-western and eastern limits of the Township of Newport, and the north-eastern limits of the Township of Auckland, on the north-west by the County of Arthabaska as above described, on the south-east by the limits of the Province; the said 35 County so bounded comprising the Townships of Wolfstown, Ham and its Augmentation, Wotton, Garthby, Stratford, Weedon, Dudswell, Winslow, Lingwick and Bury.

County of Sherbrooke.

38. The County of Sherbrooke shall be bounded on the northwest by the County of Drummond as above described, on the 40 north-east by the Counties of Arthabaska and Dudswell as above described, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Townships of Melbourne, Brompton, Orford, the south-eastern limits of the said Township of Orford, the south-western and south-eastern limits of the Township of Compton, part of the south-eastern limits of the Township of Clifton, and by the north-eastern limits of the Township of Barford, on the south-east by the limits of the Province, the said County so bounded comprising the Townships of

Newport, Auckland, Shipton, Melbourne, Windsor, Brompton, Orford, Ascot, Compton, Eaton, Clifton, Hereford and Westbury, with the exception of the parts of the Townships of Orford and Ascot comprised in the Town of Sherbrooke.

- 39. The Town of Sherbrooke shall be comprised within its Town of Sherpresent limits. brooke.
 - 40. The County of Stanstead shall comprise the Townships County of of Stanstead, Barnston, Hatley, Barford, and that part of the Town-Stanstead. ship of Magog which is to the east of Lake Magog.
- 41. The County of Brome shall comprise that part of the County of Township of Magog which is to the west of Lake Magog, and the Brome. Townships of Bolton, Potton, Sutton, Brome and Farnham.
 - 42. The County of Shefford shall comprise the Townships of County of Milton, Roxton, Ely, Granby, Shefford and Stukely,
- 43. The County of Missisquoi shall be bounded on the north- County of east by the County of Brome, on the south-east by the limits of the Missisquoi. Province, on the south-west by the western limits of the parishes of Saint Thomas and Clarenceville on the River Richelieu, the northwestern limits of the said parish of Clarenceville, and the south-20 western limits of the Township of Stanbridge, on the north-west by the north-western limits of the Townships of Stanbridge and Dunham; the said County so bounded comprising the parishes of Saint Thomas, Clarenceville, Saint Armand East and West, the Village of Philipsburg and the Townships of Dunham and Stan-25 bridge.

44. The County of Richelieu shall be bounded on the north- County of Rieast by the County of Yamaska as above described, on the chelieu. south-east by the River Yamaska and the south-eastern limits of the parish of Saint Jude, on the south-west by the south-western limits 30 of the parishes of Saint Jude and Saint Ours, on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence; the said County so bounded comprising the Town of William Henry and the parishes of Saint Ours, Sorel, Sainte Victoire, Saint Jude and Saint Aimé.

45. The County of Rouville shall be bounded on the north- County of 35 east by the north-eastern limits of the Parishes of Saint Hilaire, Rouville. Saint Jean Baptiste, Sainte Marie, Saint Césaire and L'Ange Gardien, on the south-east partly by the Counties of Shefford and Brome as above described, and partly by the north-western limits of the Parishes of Sainte Brigitte, Saint Grégoire and Saint Athanase, County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Saint Mathias,

40 on the west and north-west by the River Richelieu; the said Sainte Marie, Saint Hilaire, Saint Jean Baptiste, Saint Césaire and L'Ange-Gardien.

County of St. Hyacinth. 46. The County of Saint Hyacinth shall be bounded on the north-west and north-east by the Counties of Richelieu, Yamaska and Drummond as above described, on the south-west by the County of Rouville as above described, and on the east and south-east by the County of Shefford as above descrided; which said 5 County so bounded shall comprise the Township of Acton, part of the Township of Upton, and the Parishes of Saint Denis, Saint Charles, Saint Barnabé, Saint Hyacinthe, La Présentation, Saint Damase, Abbotsford, Saint Pie, Saint Dominique, Sainte Rosalie, Saint Simon, Saint Hugues and the Town of Saint Hyacinthe.

County of Henryville. 47. The County of Henryville shall be bounded on the north-west by the County of Rouville as above described, on the north-east by the Counties of Brome and Missisquoi as above described, on the south-east by the said County of Missisquoi, and on the south-west by the River Richelieu; the said County so bounded 15 comprising the Parishes of Henryville, Saint Alexandre, Saint Athanase, Saint Grégoire and Sainte Brigitte.

County of Vercheres. 48. The County of Verchères shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Richelieu as above described, on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands 20 nearest to the said County, and wholly or in part opposite to the same, on the south-east by the River Richelieu, and on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Parishes of Belæil, Sainte Julie and Varennes; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Varennes, Verchères, Contrecœur, Belæil, Saint Marc, 25 Saint Antoine and Sainte Julie.

County of Chambly.

49. The County of Chambly shall be bounded on the northeast by the County of Verchères as above described, on the north-west by the River Saint Lawrence, including all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite to the same, 30 on the east and south-east by the River Richelieu, and on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Parishes of Longueuil; Chambly, Saint Luc and Saint Johns; the said County so bounded comprising the Parishes of Longueuil, Boucherville, Saint Bruno, Chambly, Saint Luc and Saint Johns, and the Town of Dorchester. 35

County of Lacolle.

50. The County of Lacolle shall be bounded on the east by the River Richelieu, on the south-east by the Province Line, on the north-east by the County of Chambly as above described, on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Parish of Saint Bernard de Lacolle, the Township of Sherrington and the Parish 40 of Saint Edouard, and on the north-west by the north-western limits of the Parishes of Saint Edouard, Saint Cyprien, and Saint Valentin prolonged to the County of Chambly; the said County so bounded comprising the Township of Sherrington and the Parishes of Saint Bernard, Saint Cyprien, Saint Edouard and Saint 45 Valentin.

- 51. The County of Laprairie shall be bounded on the north-east by the County of Chambly as before described, on the south-east by prairie. the County of Lacolle, on the north-west by the River Saint Lawlence, including all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly 5 or in part opposite to the same, and on the south-west by the south-western limits of the Indian lands of Sault Saint Louis and of the Parish of Saint Constant; the said County so bounded comprising the Indian lands of Sault Saint Louis and the Parishes of Laprairie, Saint Constant, Saint Philippe, Saint Jacques le Mineur 10 and Sainte Marguerite de Blairfindie.
- 52. The County of Beauharnois shall comprise the Seigniory County of of Beauharnois and the Parishes of Sainte Philomène, Saint Isidore, Beauharnois. Chateauguay, and Saint Rémi, with all Islands in the River Saint Lawrence, nearest to the said County and wholly or in part oppo-15 site to the same.
- 53. The County of Huntingdon shall be bounded on the south-County of east by the Province line, on the north-east by the County of Huntingdon. Lacolle, on the north-west and north-east by the County of Beauharnois, and on the north-west again by the River Saint Lawrence, 20 including all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite to the same; the said County so bounded comprising the Indian Lands of Saint Regis, the Village of Huntingdon, and the Townships of Godmanchester, Elgin, Dundee, Hinchinbrooke and Hemmingford.
- 25 54. The County of Vaudreuil shall be bounded on the south-county of east by the River Saint Lawrence, on the north by the River Vaudreuil. Ottawa, and on the south-west by the Division line between Upper and Lower Canada, including Isle Perrot, and all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite to the same; the 30 said County so bounded comprising the Township of Newton, and the Parishes of Isle Perrot, Vaudreuil, Rigaud, Sainte Marthe, Saint Polycarpe, Saint Ignace, Soulanges, Saint Clet and Saint Zotique.
- 55. The County of Montreal shall consist of the Island of County of 35 Montreal with the exception of the City of Montreal, and of Isle Montreal. Jésus and Isle Bizard, with all Islands nearest to the said County and wholly or in part opposite to the same.
 - 56. The City of Montreal shall be comprised within its present City of Montlimits.

- 6. The Towns of Simcoe, Niagara, St. Catherines and Cayuga, shall be united for the purpose of representation, and shall form an Electoral Division by the name of *The Niagara Towns*:
- 7. The Towns of Brantford, Paris, Galt, Guelph and Berlin, shall be united for the purpose of representation, and shall form 20 an Electoral Division by the name of *The Brant Towns*:
- S. The City of Hamilton and the Town of Dundas shall be united for the purpose of representation, and shall form an Electoral Division by the name of *Hamilton and Dundas*:
- 9. The Towns of Belleville, Cobourg, Port Hope and Peterbo-25 rough, shall be united for the purpose of representation, and shall form an Electoral Division by the name of *The Lake Towns*:
- 10. The City of Kingston and the Town of Picton shall be united for the purpose of representation, and shall form an 30 Electoral Division by the name of *Kingston and Picton*:
- 11. The Towns of Brockville, Prescott and Cornwall, shall be united for the purposes of representation, and shall form an Electoral Division by the name of *The River Towns*:

And be it enacted, That the provision of this Act uniting 10 any Town in Lower Canada with any County or Counties therein, as an Electoral Division, shall not be understood to alter the quali-. cation of Elec- fication of Electors in such Town; but notwithstanding such Union, every person who, without this Act would, either as a Proprietor or as a Tenant, be entitled to vote at the Election of a Member to 15 represent such Town in the Legislative Assembly, shall, under this Act, be entitled to vote at any Election of a Member to represent the Electoral Division formed by the union of such Town with any County or Counties.

IX. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Act of the 20 Legislature of the late Province of Lower Canada, passed in the ninth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, and intituled, An Act to make a new and more convenient subdivision of the Province into Counties, for the purpose of effecting a more equal Representation thereof in the Assembly 25 than heretofore; and so much of the Act passed in the Session held in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty's 14 & 15 V. c. Reign, and intituled, An Act to make certain alterations in the

Territorial Divisions of Upper Canada, or of any other Act or Law in force in this Province, or in any part thereof, as may be 30 inconsistent with this Act, shall be superseded and repealed from the time this Act shall come into force and effect.

Commencement of Act.

X. And be it enacted, That this Act shall have force and effect from and after the end of the present Provincial Parliament, and not before.
