An Act to restrain the Trade and Commerce of the Provinces of Massachuset's Bay, and New Hampsbire, and Colonies of Connecticut, and Rhode Island, and Providence Plantation, in North America, to Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Islands in the West Indies, and to prohibit such Provinces and Colonies from carrying on any Fishery on the Banks of Newfoundland, or other Places therein mentioned, under certain Conditions and Limitations.

DEREAS by an Ad, made in the Preamble.

are now in Force, it is, amongsi other Chings, enaced, That for every Ship or Aestel which shall to an any Com-4 E 2 modities, modities, in those Acks particularly enumerated, at any British Plantation, being the Gjowth, Pjoduck, og Ma-

That the feveral Fogfeitures and Penalties inflicted by this At, thall and may be profecuted, fued for, and recovered, and be divided, paid, and applied, in like Manner as other Penalties and Fogfeitures infliced by any Act of Acts of Parliament, relating to the Trade or Revenues of the British Colonies of Plantations in America, are directed to be profecuted, sued for, or recovered, divided, paid, and applied, by Two several Ads of Parliament, the Dne passed in the fourth pear of his pielent Bajelly, intituled, An Act for granting certain Duties in the British Colonies and Plantations in America; for continuing, amending, and making perpetual, an Act passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for the better securing and encouraging the Trade of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America; for applying the Produce of such Duties, and of the Duties to arise by virtue of the faid Act, towards defraying the Expences of defending, protecting, and fecuring, the faid Colonies and Plantations; for explaining an Act made in the Twentyfifth Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, intituled, An Ast for the Encouragement of the Greenland
