The Council would sumply legislate. For example the Board of Works would decide that a crtain sewer should be built. The Council would concur and the order would be handed over to the head of that department. All thereafter would depend upon him and if he did not do his duty another man would be put in who would do: By removing the Mayor entirely from the influence of the Council and placing the veto power in his hands, Mr. Gurney no doubt hopes to not only elevate the dignity and add to the usefulness of the office, but also to provide an executive functions of the Council.


