


- 96—"Sunrise and Sunset," a pair of views painted from nature by Gori Angelo, a pupil of Michael Angelo.—The scenes are in Ciserta, Italy, and were painted in 1860. These pictures were brought to Canada in 1880 by Bishop Hellmuth, and were exhibited in London, Ont., at the Anglican ladies' college in Canada.—When the college closed 20 years ago the pictures came with everything else to auction rooms. They were bought for \$350 by Mrs. Rosalie, Sr., London. Since then \$2,000 has been refused for them.
