A By-law to regulate the proceedings in the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto and the Committees thereof.

l'ASSED 26TH NOVEMBER, 1869.

W HEREAS it is expedient to amend the By-law now in force, to regulate the proceedings in Municipal Conneil, and in Committees of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, enacts as follows :

MEETINGS AND ADJOURNMENTS OF COUNCIL.
