Cheap New Process for Treating Low-Grade Copper-Gold Ores of British Columbia.

PROFITS IN MINING OF GOLD.

Toronto and Western Co.'s Stock Strong-Mining Exchange Quotations and Sales.

Among mining stocks Toronto and Western has of late been a feature. It has recently advanced from \$1.25 to over \$2 a share, and is now held at \$2.10 asked.

Low-Grade Ores in B. C. Mr. John A. Wauchop, F.R.G.S., has an article in The London, Eng., Mining Journal entitled, "The low grade ores of British Columbia, and how to make them profitable."

He starts out with the assertion that there are in British Columbia and other sections of the Dominion of Canada large bodies of low-grade ores which, owing to the cost of transportation and metallurgical treatment at present in vogue, have not been profitably treated.

Mr. Wauchop suggests that the cost of transportation would probably be about \$2 1/2 per ton, making a total cost for transportation and treatment of \$4 per ton of ore.

The process consists of reduction and thereafter by oxidation, the ore being treated in a muffle furnace, gold and silver ores are prepared in such a way that the per cent of metal value can be extracted by amalgamation.

A complete plant, with a capacity of 25 tons per diem, can be constructed for \$1500. A 25-ton per day furnace was erected at Florence, Colorado, in the beginning of February, and has been in continuous work on Cripple Creek ore with most excellent results.

The operations of the "beam process" may be briefly stated as follows: 1. Pulverizing the ore not less than 40 mesh (dry crushing).

2. Converting the sulphides to sulphates in an air-tight muffle furnace, with converting chemicals.

3. The combination of a low heat and cheap and economical chemicals to produce the result sought after, with no expense and no loss of metal.

4. Also being completely under the control of the operator: the time for reducing being lessened, cost of fuel being reduced, and the process being continuous.

5. The ease with which the operator can balance the ore as to treatment should any sudden change occur in the same.

6. The adaptability of this treatment to the high-grade ores as well as low-grade. By the cyanide process high-grade ores could not be satisfactorily treated when this process is used.

7. Its adaptability to all classes of ore. 8. It separates the gold from the silver, and a higher percentage is obtained from the ore, there being no loss by volatilization.

Comparison with smelter test: Returns by smelter... \$500 per ton of 2000 lbs. treatment... \$800 per ton of 2000 lbs.

The above difference is not due, of course, to the "beam" treatment, but simply to the fact that it prepares the ore so that the greater part of the metal can be recovered, and some other loss value by volatilization, or else it is such a complete conversion to stay in the gold.

As an example of the merits of this method of treating ores, the writer would refer to one test of a parcel of 11 tons of sulphide ore containing 100 lbs. of gold, arsenic and antimony, from the London Mine, Park, Colorado, which was treated in an exemplification of what is now being done every day at the works of Professor Beam.

Value as given by the public sampler, \$60.00 per ton. "Beam process," gold \$12.90 per ton.

Recovered by the public sampler, and demonstrating its ability to recover so much more gold (33 per cent.) to the ton than indicated by the ordinary assay is an anomaly, and directly inconsistent with all the rules of metallurgy.

But such is the case. It is well known amongst metallurgists that the present method of fire assaying is most unsatisfactory, especially for sulphide ores, the values being lost by volatilization. When the "beam process" there is no loss. The full significance of this will be understood by the hard working assayer who finds a year in and year out in the found, but too often delusive, results, "tinkling it rich," as well as by the capitalist.

THE HARBOR SCANDALERS

Who Took Tobacco Into the United States Were Rather Leniently Dealt With. JOHNSON GOT TWO YEARS AT AUBURN

Mrs. Oliver Owned Up and Got Off With a \$50 Fine—Her Daughter Was Discharged. Rochester, May 13.—The Federal Grand Jury has been in session here during the past week before Judge Cox. Among the most important actions for the court was the hearing of John S. Johnson, Mrs. Mary Oliver and the latter's daughter, Queenie, charged with smuggling leaf tobacco over the Suspension Bridge from Canada. Mrs. Oliver pleaded guilty and escaped with a fine of \$50. Johnson stood trial. On being brought up for sentence, after the jury had returned a verdict of guilty as charged, Johnson made a statement admitting that it was the second time that he had been convicted of smuggling and endeavored to exculpate the woman, but it was too late for that and he was sentenced to two years in Auburn Prison and Queenie Oliver on account of her youth and disclaimer the indictment against her. All parties are residents of Hamilton, Ontario.

PORT BURWELL BURNED. Business Portion of the Village Has Been Destroyed by Fire—Loss \$450,000. Tilsonburg, Ont., May 13.—The business part of Port Burwell was entirely destroyed by fire last night with the exception of Mr. Emery's store. The fire was first discovered in the rear of D. Zant's store about 10 o'clock. A stiff southwest breeze was blowing, and the fire took everything before it to the eastward for two blocks—the postoffice, telephone office, drug store, G.N.W. telegraph office, hardware store, general stores, two hotels and several other buildings. Loss about \$450,000; probable insurance, \$250,000.

27 Buildings Burned. Vienna, Ont., May 13.—A fire broke out at Port Burwell about 11 o'clock last night either in Mr. Zant's store or Mr. Brady's undertaking rooms. There was no fire in either place all day. The citizens were unable to stop its progress and it burned nearly the whole town, comprising the following buildings: Mr. Zant's general store, Mr. Brady's undertaking rooms, Barrett's livery stable, Hollywood Hotel and bar, Mr. Wright's hardware store, Mr. Logan's tailor shop, F. We feel that the city's injustice in this regard is so keenly felt that we should not allow our status to be lowered by being placed on a level with every regimental band, and we would very much prefer to stand aside and allow the city's patronage to go elsewhere, but we are unable to believe that this representation is made in no capricious mood, and we are sure that you will consider our petition and the members of our respective bands," etc., etc.

END OF THE STRIKES. Bricklayers' Agreement Signed—Work Will Be Resumed To-Day—Cheering Signs. The agreement arrived at between the bricklayers and the bosses was signed on Saturday morning at the Builders' Exchange. The agreement is at 37 1/2 cents an hour, dating from May 1, 1898. The trouble is now at an end, and all the strikers will resume work this morning. The settlement is looked upon by the other trades unions as a victory for organized labor, which will have a tendency to bring about a general strike. The bricklayers and iron molders. At a meeting of the union, held Saturday evening, the members of the union voted to accept the agreement, and it was agreed to present souvenirs to the strikers. The strikers were: Thomas Izard, the men who composed the committee are: Messrs. J. B. Dixon (chairman), H. Lyell, G. C. Chiswick, William Gillies, G. Hill, William Steen, R. Johnston, J. S. Moore, Thos. Izard (secretary). Several communications were received from American cities, asking that the union send men over to their side, as work was plentiful at good pay.

The committee appointed by the Carpenters' Section of the Builders' Exchange, to consider the demands of the men for an increase in their wages, will report at a meeting of this section to-night. It is the general opinion that there will be no increase, and rather than have any trouble the bosses will come to an agreement. Both sides are willing to compromise, and all are unpleasants. The men expect to receive the advance asked for.

DEATH OF EX-GOV. FLOWER. His End Was Sudden and Unexpected, Following an Acute Attack of Indigestion.

HE DIED AT EASTPORT CLUB, L.I. Members of His Family Were Quickly Summoned and Arrived Before the End Came.

New York, May 13.—Former Governor Roswell P. Flower died last night at 10:30 at the Eastport Country Club, at Eastport, L.I. Mr. Flower was taken ill early in the day with a severe attack of acute indigestion. In the afternoon symptoms of heart-failure supervened, and he grew steadily worse until the time of his death.

Mr. Flower went to New York in that year to take charge of the estate of Henry Keep, whose widow was Mrs. Flower's sister. Mr. Flower owned a great many railroad and other stocks, and during the months before his death he spent time instructing Mr. Flower about them. Having thus gained an insight into Wall-street and its methods, Mr. Flower went to London, where he organized the Flower & Co., which has since been a power in Wall-street. Mr. Flower always was a Democrat, and in 1872 he helped Samuel J. Tilden to develop the famous organization which exposed Tweed and his associates. Mr. Flower was chosen chairman of the Democratic State Committee in 1877 and 1882, and was elected Governor of the State in 1891.
