KING HAARON AND HIS QUEEN WERE CROWNED WITH MUCH POMP TODAY

Ceremony at Trondhjem Was Carried Out Successfully in the Presence of Representatives of the World's Powers ---A Gorgeous and Impressive Scene Not Soon to be Forgotten.

TRONDHJEM, June 22, 12:35 p. m. — King Haakon and Queen Maud were to-day crowned respectively King and Queen of Norway in the cathedral here. The royal party entered the cathedral at 11:10 a. m. The coronation ceremony began almost immediately after their arrival.

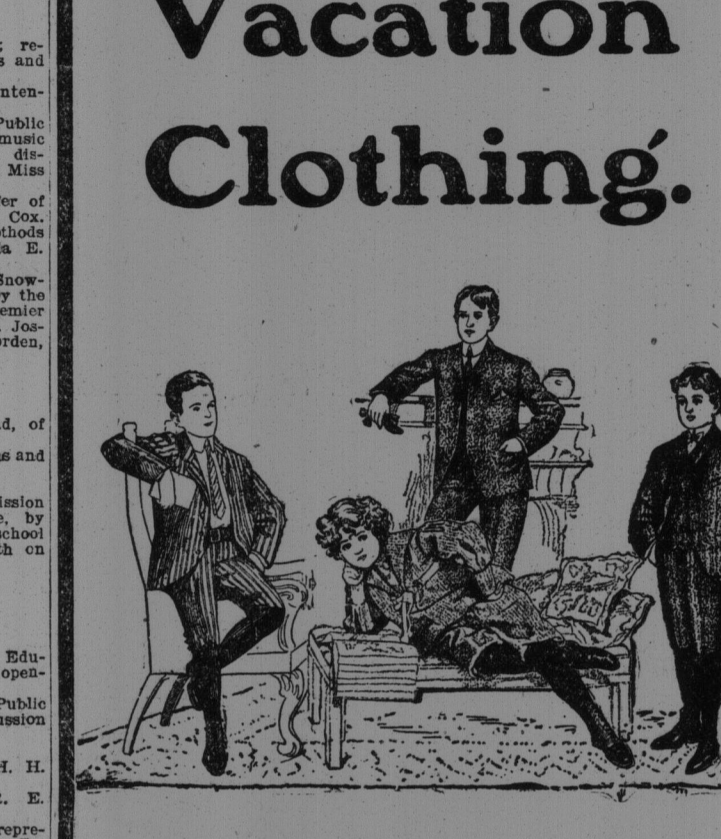

THE VOICE OF WARNING

President Schurman of Cornell University, in his address at the commencement exercises, announced in the strongest terms the evils arising from the mad rush for easy wealth and the indifference with which the owners of vast wealth regard the toil and suffering of the very poor.

This address by Dr. Schurman was fittingly supplementary to the baccalaureate sermon preached on Sunday last at Cornell by Rev. Dr. Moxom of Springfield, Mass. This speaker pointed out that "there are times when the knowledge of the world has increased more rapidly than the power of assimilation, when the sources of material wealth have been exploited beyond the capacity of the moral nature to utilize riches for the highest ends."

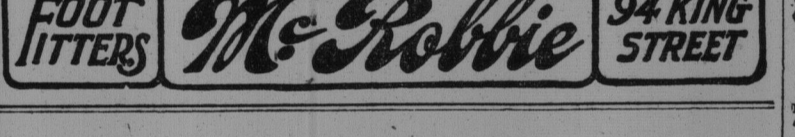

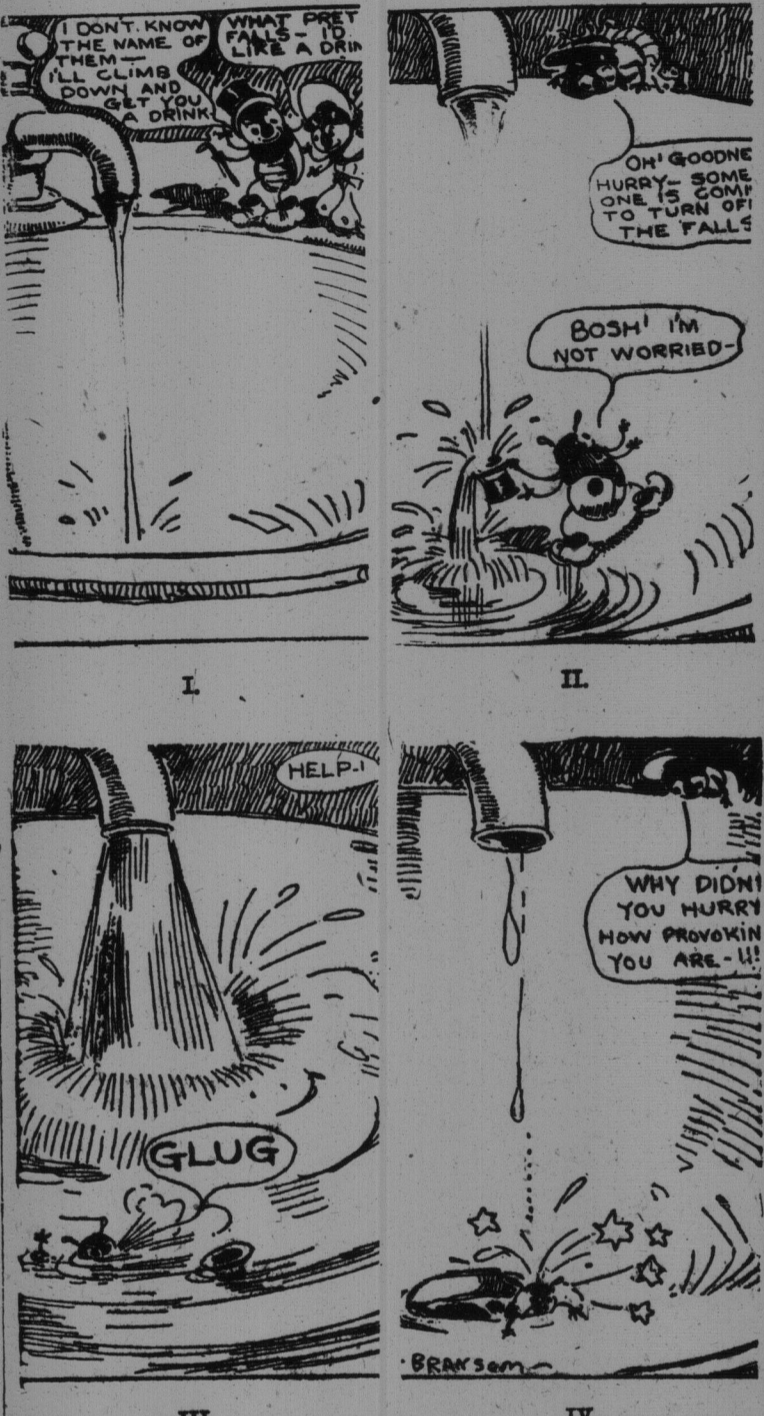

SUSPICIOUS OF CANADA
Recent Immigration Scandal has Placed This Country in Bad Odor with Britain.

MONTREAL, June 2 (Special)—A London cable says:—The British parliament hears today an echo of the Canadian immigration scandal through the publication of an official white paper containing the correspondence of the English printer, who were induced to emigrate to Winnipeg by false reports. The white paper closes with a reproduction of the Canadian common sense of May 22d last, in which allegations respecting the association of Preston and Leopold and the labor bureau in the government building at Charing Cross were discussed. It now rests with the British government to decide whether to pass a British act similar to the Canadian act of 1905 legislating prosecutions for false representations to induce or deter immigration. The published details from Canada have been too meagre and confused to enable the public to say distinctly what has been proved and what merely suspected, but it is pronounced that it is felt that the Canadian government, or, failing them, the Canadian High Commissioner on his own responsibility, must take some decisive action to restore public confidence.

COMPANIES AMALGAMATE
The Corporations Promoted to Develop Grand Falls Power Will Unite Their Interests.

It is reported that the big rival companies formed for the development of the water power of Grand Falls, and the establishment of large industries there, have arranged to amalgamate their interests, and that this project was advanced towards completion at a meeting held in St. John yesterday afternoon.
Of the two companies, one was incorporated by act of the provincial legislature, and the other under the Dominion legislature. There have been some differences between the companies regarding the right to use the same name, etc., but now it is said that all has been satisfactorily arranged and they will amalgamate. It is the intention of the amalgamated companies to establish pulp and paper mills, a plant for the reduction of ferro manganese from bog ore and to produce electrical power from the falls, which would be sold all the way down the St. John river to this city. It is expected that the work will be under way inside of two months.

MORNING NEWS
LOCAL.

Rev. Mr. Johnson, the general pastor of St. Philip's A. M. E. Church, was Wednesday night treated to a pleasant surprise, when forty members of the congregation dropped into the parsonage and helped him celebrate his forty-ninth birthday. During the evening he was presented with a purse.
J. Sidney Rogers, the young English representative of the Singer Manufacturing Company, who was arrested a few months ago at the instigation of J. J. McDonald, of the local agency, alleging irregularities, appeared yesterday afternoon, and after a half hour and a half of examination the case was adjourned until Wednesday next. Mr. McDonald was the only witness examined.

A salmon weighing 44 pounds and measuring four feet four inches long was brought to the fish market by Walter McGuire, of Sea View. The big fellow was caught off Freshtown in a net and was a subject of much interest to many people yesterday. It was on exhibition for a time at the warehouse of the St. John Mercantile Company and was afterwards taken to Smith's fish market, Sydney street, where it will undergo a surgical operation to prepare it for the market.
Capt. B. R. Armstrong, of the 3rd Regiment, Canadian Artillery, has received word to the effect that the annual inspection of the regiment will be held on July 10. It is not known definitely who the inspecting officer will be, but it will be either Col. Wilson, of Quebec, or Rutherford of Ottawa. It is not yet known when the regiment will go into camp at Petawawa, but it will probably be in September.
Concerning the sums for the I. C. R. in the supplementary estimates at Ottawa, \$10,000 for increased accommodation at St. John and \$1,000 for improvements at Rothesay, L. R. Rose, the I. C. R. territorial superintendent at Ottawa, stated that he believed the first amount is to build carpenter shops at the new round house, and that the other amount will be used in improving the Rothesay station building.

The case was a complicated one and the jurors over the long list of questions presented to them. His honor entered a verdict for the plaintiff for \$1,188.38, the full amount claimed, but reserved to the defendants the right to move to set aside or for a new trial and costs.
