MINUTES OF THE MANITOBA AND NORTH-
WEST CONFERENCE.

HELD AT WINNIPEG, JUNE 3RD, 1896.

THE MINISTERIAL SESSION OF THE MANITOBA AND NORTH-WEST CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church met in Grace Church, Winnipeg, on June 3rd, 1896, at 9 a.m.

The President of Conference, Rev. Dr. Maclean, announced Hymn 559; the Secretary, Rev. G. W. Dean, read the 6th chapter of Hebrews, and Revs. A. W. Ross and Thompson Ferrier led in prayer.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF WESLEY COLLEGE.

To the President and Members of the Manitoba and North-West Conference.

GENTLEMEN,—The Board of Directors of Wesley College beg to report that the College building was completed during the year just closed. The building, though not fully completed at the beginning of 1896, was sufficiently advanced to admit of its occupation by the professors and students; and this was done on January 6th.

The formal opening, as you are aware, took place during the present session of the Conference; and this was an occasion of no ordinary interest in our educational work in this country.

The accommodations of the building include all the modern conveniences and appliances for the work of the College. The class rooms are handsomely furnished and well heated and ventilated, and comfortable lodging has been provided for about sixty-five students.

The improvement of the grounds in front, and of the campus for the recreation of the students, will receive attention as soon as the means of the Board will permit.

The erection and equipment of the building furnishes us with a college which places Wesley fully abreast of her sister colleges, both here and in eastern Canada; and ensures for it, we trust, a successful and prosperous career.

As will be seen from the report of the Bursar, which is hereto appended, the College has been able to maintain its record of closing the operations of the year without debt on current expenses account. The liberality of the Methodist people has enabled us to accomplish this, notwithstanding the commercial stringency and the increased expenditure connected with the operation of the new premises.

The report of the Faculty, which is also appended, shows gratifying progress, both in the increased attendance and in the results of the University examinations. The increase in attendance, from eighty-five to 130, was most encouraging; and the graduation of nine Wesley College students out of a total of thirty-five from all the colleges, and their gain of six out of eleven medals awarded, is an emphatic testimony to the character of the work done in the College during the year.

REPORT OF THE FACULTY.

To the Board of Directors of Wesley College.

GENTLEMEN,—Your Faculty have great pleasure in again reporting a very marked increase in the number of students attending college during the year just closed. The total registered attendance was one hundred and thirty, seventy-two of whom were new students. These students were distributed as follows:

In Senior B. A. year there were.....	9	students.

It should also be noticed in this connection that there were twenty-four students who studied Theology concurrently with Arts.

Of the students in the B. D. course, one, Mr. A. J. Tufts, B. A., has fulfilled all the requirements for that degree, and it is hereby recommended that the Board confer upon him the degree of Bachelor of Divinity.

Although this is but our eighth annual report, Wesley College can point with pride to the fact that this year, as well as for several years past, she has ranked second in the number of students sent up to the University examinations, and this year sixty-six of our students have competed with the students of the other affiliated colleges for university honors. The success achieved by some of these students at the recent University examinations is a matter of great satisfaction to your Faculty. Of the twelve medals awarded to distinguished students at the final examination, Wesley College students had the honor of carrying off six—three silver and three bronze, distributed as follows: Mr. W. T. D. Lathwell, the Governor-General's medallist of his previous year, was this year awarded the silver medal in the department of Classics. Mr. F. W. Sparling, also a scholarship winner, obtained the Governor-General's silver medal in the department of Mathematics; and Miss Teresa Kyle, the silver medal in the general B.A. course. The bronze medal of the University in Natural Science was awarded to Mr. R. J. Brown; the bronze medal in Mental and Moral Science was awarded to Mr. Jas. Woodsworth; and the bronze medal in the general B.A. course was awarded to Mr. H. V. Fieldhouse.

In addition to the above medals the following scholarships were obtained: Mr. S. T. Robson, one of \$80 in Classics; Miss L. Sparling, one of \$80 in Modern Languages; Mr. A. A. Thompson, one of \$120 in the General Course; Miss H. Smyth, \$30 in the Latin, Mathematics and Chemistry of the previous year; Mr. W. A. Sipprell and L. J. Carter, the first two Scholarships of \$80 each of the Preliminary year.

Your Faculty are pleased to learn that Rev. J. H. Riddell, who for the past three years has most efficiently discharged the duties of Classical Tutor, will for the future devote his whole time and energy to College work.

The very large increase in our attendance has necessitated an increased number of classes, particularly in the primary departments, so that the present staff are altogether inadequate to meet the demand thus forced upon them, and consequently are compelled to state to the Board that assistance must be rendered them in primary work, if such work is to continue to be a feature of our College.

In closing this report, your Faculty cannot refrain from expressing its unbounded satisfaction and heartfelt thanks at the noble generosity displayed by your Board and the many warm friends of the College in placing at our disposal a building to which Methodism can point with pride, and which is so admirably suited to all the requirements of college work.

(b) *To the Annual Conference.*

The following regulations are recommended for the year 1897 :

1. Examiners shall forward to the Secretary of the Examining Board not later than the 15th of February, manuscript questions on the subjects allotted to them, which shall be printed under the supervision of the Secretary, and forwarded by him to the Chairmen of Districts not later than the 15th of March.

2. The examinations shall be conducted in each district where there are candidates, on the third Wednesday in April, by the Chairman and members of the Board resident within the District ; but in cases where the distances are very great, the President may grant permission to chairmen to arrange for examination of candidates under supervision of the nearest ordained minister.

3. Time shall be considered an element in the examinations, and in all cases shall be strictly adhered to. Each Examiner shall specify the time allowed for writing the paper set by him, and each paper shall be valued at 100 marks.

4. A time-table shall be prepared and the examination conducted according thereto, and each probationer must complete the course of any one year before presenting himself for examination upon the subjects of the following year.

5. Supplemental examinations shall be conducted on the day or days immediately preceding the date fixed for the holding of the annual examination.

* See special resolution in Conference Journal.

6. Applications for supplemental examinations must be accompanied by a fee of fifty cents for each paper required, and such application must be made to the Secretary of the Board on or before February 15th.

NOTE—Every subject upon which a candidate has failed to pass in its own specified year shall be considered supplemental.

7. Certificates issued by any Examining Board of the Methodist Church subsequent to 1894 will be accepted by this Board.

8. Candidates who purpose writing upon the Preliminary Course shall notify the Chairman of the District upon which they reside not later than the 15th of February, and shall specify the subjects upon which they desire an examination, and this information shall be immediately forwarded to the Secretary of the Board.

9. Subjects which are set for one year, and which are reviewed on a subsequent year's course, cannot under any circumstances be taken at one year's examination.

While the Christian Endeavor Department justly claims the first place, and should always be loyally sustained, the missionary, literary, and social departments should also be vigorously carried on.

In connection with the Missionary Department we commend the following suggestions of the Students' Missionary Campaign:

1. The establishment of a missionary library in all our Leagues, and the encouragement of systematic missionary reading.
2. The maintenance of regular missionary meetings.
3. The offering of systematic and definite prayer.
4. Systematic giving to missions.

We also ask that the pastors throughout our Conference co-operate with the workers of the Students' Missionary Campaign in their efforts to arouse missionary enthusiasm in our Leagues.

It is recommended that a temperance meeting be held every month in which the essential principles of total abstinence and total prohibition shall be faithfully taught.

We call attention to the instructive and helpful nature of the reading courses recommended by the General Epworth League Society, and would strongly urge upon all members of Epworth League societies to make the reading course a part of their year's work.

We would again call the attention of pastors to the importance of pushing the work of forming junior Leagues, and suggest that they be regarded as departments of the senior societies.

We would heartily commend to all the members of our Epworth Leagues the careful perusal of the "Epworth League Manual."

That the suggestions of this report may be of use to our Leagues we recommend that as soon as possible after receiving the Minutes of Conference the pastor see that this report be read in his society.

1. Your Committee note with pleasure the number of scholars in the Home Department, and would earnestly advise that strenuous efforts be made by all our schools to establish Home Departments in connection with every school, believing that in this way the parents may be reached and thus made to become more interested in the children's work in the regular Sabbath School; and believing also that in this way the Gospel may be carried into many homes that now know it not in any practical way.

2. We note 622 conversions during the year. In order that this number be increased during the coming year, let greater attention be paid to the employment, wherever possible, of converted people as teachers.

3. We would in this connection recommend the holding of a children's service at least once a quarter at the regular service hour.

4. Your Committee would lay stress on the proposition to banish all lesson helps from the school-room, no book being used but the Bible, and we would urge that the study of the catechism be enforced.

5. The attention of the Committee having been drawn to the fact that some Sabbath Schools bring into their entertainments too much of the world, leaving out in large measure the religious idea, we would recommend that great care be taken in preparing programmes for Sunday School entertainments, always keeping in mind the fact that the Sabbath School entertainment should be in strict keeping with the purpose of the Sabbath School, which is to lead the boys and girls to Christ.

6. We would advise all superintendents of circuits to see to it that, wherever possible, Methodist Sabbath Schools should be organized, and to discourage the organizing of Union Schools where Methodist schools are possible.

7. We note with pleasure the setting apart of one evening of the Conference session for Sabbath School and Epworth League work, and hope this will continue.

8. We would recommend that this report be read in all our Methodist schools.

2. That we urge our people everywhere to firmly oppose the sale of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes by refusing to sign petitions for licenses and by using every legal means to prevent the granting of licenses.

3. That we rejoice to learn that according to the recent decision of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council certain powers with regard to Prohibition are vested in our Provincial Legislature, and as a Conference we would hereby petition the Legislature to exercise those powers with all convenient speed, and enact a law prohibiting the traffic in intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes in the Province of Manitoba to the full extent of their jurisdiction, and that the President and Secretary of Conference be requested to at once prepare, sign and forward a memorial to the Attorney-General embodying the substance of this resolution, asking him to present it at the first favorable opportunity to the Government and Legislature of the Province of Manitoba; and that a similar memorial be forwarded to the Lieutenant-Governor of the North-West Territories, petitioning him to take such action as may restore a prohibitory law to the North-West Territories.

4. That we would remind our people that we can obtain and enforce a prohibitory law only as we elect prohibitionists to public office, and suggest that they publicly pledge every candidate for parliamentary honors to the support of laws prohibiting the liquor traffic in the Province and the Dominion; that we suggest to our people the duty of using all their influence to secure the nomination and election of known prohibitionists.

5. That we would through the Secretary of Conference request the Indian Department to more strictly enforce the regulations against the selling, giving or drinking of spirituous liquors on Indian reservations, and as far as possible to appoint as employees on such reservations only total abstainers.

6. That the Chairman and Financial Secretary of each District are hereby appointed as a Temperance Committee for their district, with power to add to their number in each district, and we request them to carry into effect the recommendations of this Conference with regard to the Temperance Reform in their district, and report to the next Annual Conference concerning the temperance work done in their district.

7. That in our opinion the franchise should be granted to women on the same terms as to men, and that such equal suffrage would be in the interests of temperance and public morality.

8. With regard to the memorial of the Neepawa District concerning the great evil done by the brewery at Neepawa, we would recommend that the temperance people of that locality lay the subject before the Government, and take such steps as may be necessary to secure the cancellation of the brewery license.

9. With regard to the memorial from Carman concerning text-books on temperance in our public schools, we find that the law already covers all points of instruction referred to by the memorial.

REPORT OF SABBATH OBSERVANCE COMMITTEE.

A memorial from the Port Arthur and Fort William Ministerial Association to the Annual Conference Special Committee, *re* desecration of the Sabbath in these towns, which memorial was handed on to the Annual Conference for action, was referred to your Committee.

We desire to express our entire sympathy with the above-named memorial, and our hearty endorsement of its purpose.

Your Committee would recommend that the prayer of the memorial be granted, and that two ministers and two laymen be appointed to act with representatives appointed by other churches, as a standing committee on Sabbath observance, whose province it shall be to take such action and make such representations to those concerned as may by it be deemed advisable, from time to time, for the due and reverential observance of the sanctity of the Lord's Day.

Your Committee would recommend the names of the Revs. J. Maclean, Ph.D., and Leo. Gaetz, with Hon. J. W. Sifton and Mr. W. D. Pettigrew, as the representatives of this Conference upon such standing committee.

Re the communication from the Laymen's Convention on the subject of Sunday parades in the city, we recommend that this Conference discourage, as far as possible, the use of brass bands and uniforms, in the case of such parades, as having a tendency to disturb the regular Sabbath School work, and request that such services be held at an hour which shall not conflict with the regular services of the day.

That while we regret the fact that along the line of railroad and steamboat traffic there is a desecration of the Sabbath by those engaged in the said traffic, we also desire to express our gratitude to Almighty God that as a province the observance of the Lord's Day in the cessation from manual labor is general; and also the recognition of the principle of the sanctity of the Sabbath by the Provincial Legislature in its enactments.

Nevertheless, we would urge the members of our Church, ministerial and lay, to unite in maintaining a high standard in this respect, and that the importance of the subject be kept prominently before the minds of our people by our ministers.

COMMITTEE ON STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee beg to report that, having surveyed the various departments of our church work as reported to this Conference, we are pleased to notice that there is continual expansion and development.

It is not necessary to repeat the facts laid before the Conference by the Statistical Committee. The net increase in membership being 556, is not as large as might be reasonably expected, and the large number of 595 reported as dropped, shows a practice of the doctrine of backsliding which is much to be deplored. We would urge our people to sustain vigorously our class-meetings and Epworth Leagues, as well as the other means of grace, as a preventive of so large a falling back of those who once commenced to follow Christ.

The very large increase in the amount of money contributed for all purposes reveals the fact that our people will loyally and liberally sustain our institutions in proportion to their prosperity. It is, however, to be deeply regretted that during this period of our development the average salary of our ministers is only \$670, and of our probationers only \$308, which is entirely inadequate, and considering the small number of complaints that are made, manifests a remarkable degree of self-sacrifice and devotion among great numbers of our pastors. We find, for example, that eighteen probationers have received less than \$200, and three ministers less than \$300, exclusive of horse-keep. While this, as we say, is to be regretted and remedied as soon as possible, yet the fact of such Christian self-sacrifice is prophetic of great progress and power in the Church.

We would recommend strongly the formation of catechumen classes or Junior Epworth Leagues to prepare the children for membership in the Church.

We recognize the great value of the Indian Industrial Schools, and are pleased to learn of their success in not only teaching the native tribes the

truths of the Gospel, but also the arts of civilization by which we trust many of our Indian missions will be brought to be self-sustaining circuits.

The Epworth Leagues have been doing excellent work among the young people, and should with the Sunday Schools be sustained and increased. We are glad to note substantial increases in both.

We find that on many weak circuits and missions under the care of probationers or local preachers, considerable difficulty is experienced in raising the finances. We would urge upon all chairmen of districts the importance of visiting as frequently as possible the official boards of such circuits or missions under their charge.

We record with deep satisfaction the progress and work of Wesley College for the yast year. It is an institution full of promise for the future, and should be enthusiastically supported by all our own people.

We find that the *Christian Guardian* is not received by over one-fifth of the families in connection with this Conference, and would emphasize the desirability of at least doubling the circulation during the next year, as one of the most valuable agencies of our Church.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CHURCH PROPERTY.

Your Committee recommend that the consent of Conference be granted to the Trustees of Oak Lake congregation of the Methodist Church, to sell their parsonage property, being described as the westerly twenty feet in width of lot number 36, and the whole of lots 37, 38, 39 and 40, in Block 13, in the reputed village or township of Oak Lake, in the County of Dennis, in Manitoba, according to a plan of subdivision of part of the north half of Sec. 23, Township 9, Range 24, west of the principal meridian in Manitoba, registered in the Brandon Land Titles Office as Plan 2,621, excepting therefrom a strip of land twenty feet wide, along the north side of the above-mentioned lots and part of lot, which excepted portion is used as a lane; provided, that the price for which the same shall be sold shall not be less than one thousand dollars, and that the proceeds be applied partly in liquidation of the debt, and the remainder to the building of a church.

That the consent of Conference be granted to the Trustees of Ebenezer Church, Thornhill Circuit of the Methodist Church, to sell their old church property described as in the deed of conveyance thereof to such Trustees, and being composed of one-quarter acre at the north-east corner of the north-east quarter of Sec. 26, Township 12, Range 7, west of the principal meridian in Manitoba, and that the proceeds be applied to the debt on the new church; and that the consent of Conference be granted to the Trustees of the Morden Methodist Church, at Morden, Manitoba, to sell their church property, being Lot A, Block C, on Seventh Street, in the village of Morden, in Manitoba, as shown on the registered plan of such village, and that the proceeds be applied to the erection of a new church.

REPORT OF MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

To the President and members of the Manitoba and North-West Conference.

Your Committee on Memorials beg leave to present the following report:

In response to a communication received from the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the Equal Suffrage Club of Winnipeg, asking the Conference to consider the justice and desirability of the granting of full suffrage to the women of Manitoba, your Committee recommend that no action be taken until it can be shown to the Conference that the women of this country are found to be generally united on the matter mentioned in said communication.

Your Committee referred the memorial from the Birtle District to the Rev. T. E. Morden for an explanation, and he reported to your Committee that all items of news received by him from brethren in that district, as well as all others, were regularly forwarded at the earliest date, along with other news that he had been able to gather from other sources. It is, therefore, evident to your Committee that no blame can be attached to Bro. Morden, for, as he further states, he would be glad to accumulate enough readable matter to fill the whole page which is at the disposal of our Conference.

The resolution on the School Question, from the Crystal City District, which was referred to your Committee, was taken up in connection with

the motion of Bros. Turk and Taylor, which was laid over by vote of the Conference, and as the whole matter has in the interim been satisfactorily settled by the passing of a resolution from this Committee, we are not called upon to take any further notice of the said question.

Your Committee received a memorial from the Calgary District on the relation of children to the Church. As this matter is in the opinion of your Committee fully provided for in the Discipline, we do not deem it necessary to make any recommendation thereon. With respect to the reference by the same district of the importance of having a book provided for the permanent record of baptisms and marriages in the Territories, your Committee recommend that the President of the Conference confer with the Legislative Assembly of the Territories, and respectfully request them to provide a book similar to that provided by the Provincial Governments of the rest of the Dominion.

A resolution from the Winnipeg District was received by your Committee, in which it is stated that certain persons in the employ of the Methodist Church have been baptizing and solemnizing the marriage ceremony. Your Committee not having had such direct information before them as would enable them to come to a conclusion as to the best method to adopt to prevent the recurrence of so serious a matter, refer the said resolution to the Conference for such action as they deem wise to take.

The memorial from Bros. Chegwin and E. B. Taylor, *re* equalization of travelling expenses to Conference, which was submitted to the consideration of your Committee, has been carefully considered, and after due thought we recommend that no action be taken thereon.

Your Committee would respectfully draw the attention of this Conference to the very unsatisfactory state of the Book Room account, amounting this year to \$625.51 ; also to the fact that \$23.44 was paid this year in interest ; and in view of these facts would recommend that the Conference instruct the Treasurer of this Fund to issue a circular, asking the Quarterly Official Boards of Circuits and Missions to make a special effort this year to raise the income of this Fund by at least 100 per cent., in order that this account may be wiped out altogether, and a more generous help given to the cases of pressing need coming before the Committee from year to year.

We recommend that the Rev. A. Andrews be reappointed as Conference Treasurer of this Fund, for the coming year.

REPORT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS ON CIRCULATING LIBRARY.

Immediately on the rise of Conference last year the Secretary began communicating with different distinguished persons in the United States and Canada asking for information *re* Circulating Library. In each communication a very brief outline of what we hoped to do was given. To all these communications we received about the same answer, namely, that the writer knew of no such scheme, but commended it very highly, and requested that I should give an outline of the work when we had put our plan into operation. There was only one place where anything approaching what we desired could be found. A few miles from the city of Boston the ministers of the Church of England, on Merton Diocese, had formed a library somewhat similar to the one proposed by this Conference. The report from them concerning it was that such an attempt had been, to some extent, a failure owing to two causes: 1. The proximity of the diocese to the best libraries. 2. Because the class of books selected had been too much of one kind. A copy of their rules and regulations was sent me, and taking it as a basis I wrote out and submitted to the Committee a set of rules and regulations which shall be submitted to the Conference presently. Owing to the unfinished condition of the College library room at the beginning of the year we did not push the canvass for books. But almost all those approached on the matter gave donations, saying to us, "You buy two or three books which you think will be helpful and I will pay for them." The next difficulty which met us was, "What books should we buy?" At this time I wrote Dr. Briggs asking to send me a list of books which he would think suitable for such a library. In reply he said that he would be only too glad to furnish me with such a list after the expiration of a few weeks. As I had not received the list, I wrote again but have not as yet received it. The library at Wesley College being now ready, may be utilized by the Board of Directors. It is earnestly hoped that all the members will feel free not only to present books for the use of the library, but to suggest the names of books. The success of this work will depend upon the loyal and enthusiastic support of the brethren. It is quite evident that we need not expect to get very large returns from this venture at first, but I feel confident that it will meet a felt want, and the ready response of our laymen when interviewed assures me of their help in this work.

NAME.

The Library shall be known as the Circulating Library of the Manitoba and North-West Conference.

MANAGEMENT.

It shall be under the management of a Board of Directors, composed of members of the Manitoba and North-West Conference, half of whom shall be elected annually. The Board of Directors shall give a report to the annual Conference of the work done during each year.

MEMBERS.

All ministers and probationers of the Manitoba and North-West Conference who shall pay the fee and observe the rules and regulations hereinafter described.

FEE.

The fee for the first year shall be \$2.50, and for each successive year, \$2.00. The fifty cents extra of the first year to be returned, if not used up by fines at the expiration of membership.

LIBRARIAN.

There shall be a librarian appointed by the Board of Directors, whose duty it shall be to supervise the issue and return of books and the collection of fees, and who shall make regular reports of the condition of the library and fees to the directors.

CARRIAGE.

The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the cost of carriage on outgoing books, and the receiver for return carriage.

LIMIT OF RETENTION.

The limit of retention for each book shall be one day for each twenty pages; a fine of one-half cent a day to be levied for each day beyond the limited time. Time to date from arrival of the book at the receiver's home. Number of books allowed to each subscriber in a year The library shall be located in Wesley College.

SUGGESTIONS.

All ministers and probationers shall have the right to suggest the names of books to be placed on the catalogue of books in the library, and to present books to the library, but all such books shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

Any member violating the rules shall be liable to have his name struck from the list of membership.

DAMAGES.

All persons to whom books are sent shall be responsible to the Board for the damage done to any book, or for the loss of any book sent to his address.

It is earnestly hoped that all members of the Conference shall feel free to suggest books, and to contribute books for the use of the members of the library.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

Re PAYING PROBATIONERS.

That the suggestion from Wesley College District Meeting be urged upon the various chairmen interested, the desirability of such prompt payment as is indicated.

In reference to the memorial *re* self-support on Indian Missions in this Conference, your Committee are impressed with the desirableness of the object contemplated, as well as with the practical difficulties involved in the case ; and whereas, an educational process will be necessary in order that our Indian members may see and realize their duty and privileges in this matter, and act accordingly, we recommend that each and every missionary to the Indians be requested to instruct the Indians in the duty of systematic beneficence, and to take up either collections or subscriptions, or both, though the returns at first may be small ; and further, whereas most of our Indian friends entertain great respect for opinions or recommendations issuing from the General Board of Missions, we also recommend that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to said Board with a request for their co-operation in the matter.

Re communication from General Secretary of Missionary Society, urging the importance of concentrating all efforts towards the raising of money for missionary work through the regularly organized channels for the disposition thereof, this Committee urge upon this Conference the wisdom of its giving hearty support to the suggestion.

Re memorial from Victoria asking for aid towards establishing a boarding school, this Committee while sympathizing with this request, in view of the state of the funds of our Missionary Society recommend that no action be taken at this time.

With reference to an application in the case of Rev. J. W. Dickinson, we recommend that application be made to the Executive of the General Board of Missions in the regular way, through the District Meetings.

In reference to the memorial of T. E. Morden, B.A., *re* the establishment of a mission to incoming foreigners, we recommend the reference of the memorial to the Stationing Committee.

G. McKittrick and W. G. Blewett, ordination to take place in the Methodist Church in the town of Edmonton, on some date fixed by the Commission early in the ensuing Conference year. The same Commission were appointed to examine Bro. J. A. Dean, and such examination being satisfactory, to ordain him for the purpose of administering the sacraments and solemnizing the marriage ceremony, and in connection with our work on Indian mission fields.

TEMPERANCE MEETING.

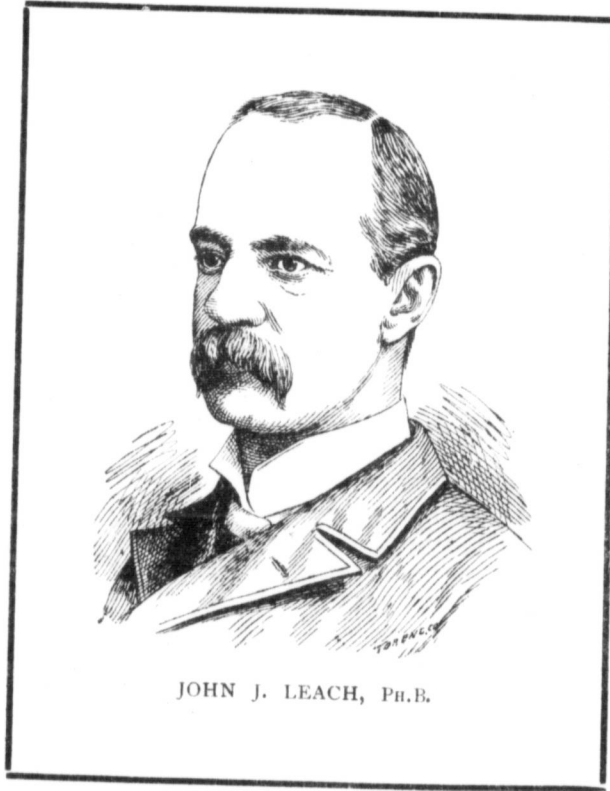

On the evening of December 2nd, 1895, our esteemed Brother Leach preached a most effective missionary sermon in the Gladstone Church from the text, "David, after he had served his own generation by the will of God, fell on sleep, and was laid unto his fathers." (Acts xiii. 36.) This seemed prophetic, for never more was our dear brother permitted to fill the pulpit, although on the following evening he lectured in the same church in the interests of the Trustee Fund. He had been in delicate health for some months, far worse in fact than he suspected. In spite of the best medical skill and the unremitting attention of his family and friends, disease blighted the hopes of all, and on Sabbath evening, February 9th, he passed quietly away.

Bro. Leach was born at Sackville, N.B., March 30th, 1852. At two years of age his father, Robert Leach, died, and the training of the lad

devolved mainly upon his devoted mother. He early gave evidence of strong religious convictions; at fifteen years of age he professed faith in Christ as his personal Saviour. At eighteen years of age he entered the ministry, being ordained in 1874 by Rev. S. D. Rice, D.D. He has labored with great profit at Wilton, Bath, Pittsburg, Amherst Isle, Arnprior, Carp, Odessa, Newburgh, Brighton in Ontario, and in this Conference at Calgary, Moosomin (where he was Chairman of the District) and Neepawa, where he finished the service of his generation, and by the will of God fell on sleep. His record is written in the hearts of many people, and his reward in the salvation of many souls. In addition to other duties he economized time so as to enable him to graduate as Bachelor of Philosophy in the Wesleyan University, Illinois. His preaching was characterized by more than ordinary intelligence and rhetorical finish, and his congregations listened to his sermons with great pleasure and profit. As a pastor he was always gladly welcomed in the homes of his people. One of his church officers says, "He was an all-round man; he excelled as a preacher and his social life was pre-eminently good." Another said, "His relations with his Church were most amiable, and he lived in the hearts of all who associated with him in Christian effort." A brother in the ministry says, "I have known Bro. Leach all his ministerial life, and I can say he was a faithful minister of the Lord Jesus Christ, a hard worker, a true friend, and a man greatly beloved by all who knew him."

He was married shortly after ordination to Miss Emma Purkiss, of Thornhill, Ont. She died after eleven years of happy union. Subsequently he married Miss Emma Lapum, of Wilton. His widow, three children of the former marriage and two of the latter, mourn their loss.

During his last illness, deep gratitude to God and appreciation of what friends were doing for him, seemed ever in his mind. He frequently expressed himself in these words, "Oh, how good the Lord is, how He comforts me! His arms are about me. Oh, that men would praise the Lord for His goodness!" His sick-room was a sanctuary of God to visitors, attendants and friends; all felt the inspiration of a godly power proceeding from his presence. On his death-bed he preached Christ with great effect.

Rev. Dr. Maclean, President of Conference, preached a most appropriate sermon from the text, Romans i. 16, "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek," which text was selected by Bro. Leach himself, who also expressed a desire that Dr. Maclean should preach his funeral sermon. Rev. T. Argue, a former pastor of the Neepawa congregation, and Rev. A. Andrews, Chairman of the District, spoke briefly, and Rev. Messrs. Laycock, Dyke, Osterhout, Carter, Reid and Allen assisted in the solemn service.

His remains were buried in the beautiful cemetery lying on the east slope of the town of Neepawa. He has made a good record, and will be ever remembered by what he has done.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

Our hearts are filled with anxious desire for your spiritual and temporal welfare; and our prayers ascend to the great Head of the Church for continued and multiplied blessing upon the families of our Israel.

While laden with the care of the churches, and busied with many plans for the advancement of their financial interests, we have not forgotten at stated and appropriate seasons to beseech our heavenly Father for His blessing upon you in your homes and upon us in our deliberations here.

The review of the past year gives us much cause for rejoicing. The various District returns indicate continued prosperity and satisfactory growth. While we regret our many shortcomings, and feel humbled by a knowledge of our numerous failures, yet we desire to ascribe praise to our God for the victories we have been enabled by His grace to achieve over the enemy. The great commission comes down to us over the centuries, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature;" and remembering His promise, "Lo I am with you alway, even to the end," we press forward to fresh and glorious conquests.

Not less important than missionary enterprise is the spiritual training of the youth of the Church. Methodism has ever been found in the van of the churches in Sabbath School effort, and we are glad to know that in this new land our beloved Church has lost none of its zeal for the salvation of the children. "Feed my lambs" was the command given to the penitent and restored Apostle, and we believe no work lies nearer the Master's heart than the preservation of the little ones from the many snares and temptations that beset the pathway of youth.

Intimately associated with Sabbath School work is the Epworth League; it is a connecting link between the school and the Church. Too often have we seen our youth during that critical period between the age of Sunday School attendance and young manhood, drift away from the Church. Under God we believe the League will be a blessed agency in the guidance of our children homeward, and their retention within our Church. We hail with sincere congratulation the arrival of our former fellow-laborer, Rev. A. C. Crews, in his official capacity as General Secretary of the young people's societies. We rejoice that his peculiar talents are thus to be utilized for the glory of God and the good of the Church; and we would bespeak for him the cordial sympathy and the active co-operation of our people on the various fields he may visit.

It is with profound gratitude to God that we gaze upon that stately monument of the zeal and liberality of our people towards the cause of higher education, the new "Wesley College." Methodism from the first has been the friend of education, and in this new land she is loyal to her early traditions. We congratulate the Church at large, as well as the indefatigable Principal and his devoted associates, upon the triumphant results of their efforts to erect a college worthy of North-Western Methodism.

Our connexional interests have been nobly sustained during the past year, and we gladly recognize the disposition of our people to honor God with their substance, and stand enthusiastically by the institutions of the Church.

Death loves a shining mark, and while our hearts are sorely wounded by the loss of one of our most honored and successful ministers, at an age when we had hoped for yet many years of successful labor, yet we rejoice in the grace that crowned a faithful life with a triumphant death. The memory of Bro. Leach will long be cherished in the annals of our Zion.

We need scarcely urge Methodist people to a strenuous and courageous warfare against that monstrous blot on our civilization, the licensed liquor traffic. Without one redeeming feature, the business is only evil and that continually. Passing strange it is that while statesmen, divines, philosophers; that while judges on the bench, and juries in their presentments; that while the press and the electorate have repeatedly and emphatically denounced the traffic as the enemy of morals, religion, legitimate commerce, and the highest and holiest interests of society; still our Government is a partner in the infamy by legalizing the trade, and accepting a revenue from the degradation of the people. Let us labor, and pray, and vote for the abolition of the unholy saloon.

Our country has been and still is passing through a momentous political crisis in connection with our school system. The General Conference of our Church, as well as the various annual Conferences, including our own, have placed upon record their unalterable opposition to any endowment by the State of sectarian schools, and we cannot but view with anxiety the persistent and determined efforts to force upon our Province an obnoxious and detrimental system of separate Roman Catholic schools. It is hoped that our people will stand as a wall of adamant against any attempt to coerce this Province in the matter of education, no matter by what political party the attempt may be made.

Let us vigilantly guard our common school system against every attack; let us strenuously maintain the traditional policy of Methodism, the absolute separation of Church and State; let us go forward in the fear of God and in dependence upon His omnipotent arm, building up a great Christian and British civilization in this splendid heritage He has given us. Let us ever honor and reverence the Bible as the "Magna Charta" of our civil and religious freedom.

In addition to these great and vital questions we would press upon our people the importance of Sabbath observance. We must protest against every invasion of its sanctity by every form of secular labor, unnecessary traffic, and week-day recreations. Let us carefully refrain from all Sabbath travel; let us by example as well as precept "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy."

We cannot close, dear brethren, without exhorting you to pursue after holiness "without which no man shall see the Lord." Family religion is the strength of the Church. May every home be a very Bethel. May the domestic altar be found under every roof of our people. "Little children, love one another." We need fear no external foe if we are true to these great essentials of a pure and vigorous church life. It is ours by well-doing to silence unholy cavil and witness to the power of holy living. Let us be loyal to truth in every circumstance of life, and we need fear no foe. The future is bright with promise. The past is glorious with the triumphs of faith. With our hearts fixed upon God, and our hands clasped in blessed fellowship, let us move forward with holy anticipation of triumph and unflinching faith in the ultimate victory of righteousness and truth over every foe.

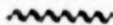
