# THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF The Nova Scotia Rifle Association.

#### 1900,

The Council of the N. S. R. A., begs to submit to the members the Thirty-seventh Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held on Bedford Range, commencing on Tuesday, July 3rd.

Tuesday and Thursday were beautiful days, Wednesday morning it rained, but cleared off about noon. Friday was fine, but the wind blew very hard, making high scoring impossible, and rendering it very difficult to work the large first-class targets, one of which finally became disabled.

There were 172 entries, an increase of 44 over last year. The increase was entirely in the number of affiliated competitors, the full membership remaining exactly the same as in 1899; viz., 113 : while the affiliated members numbered 54.

Your Council is glad to be able to report this large accession of new men, and if any considerable number of them attend subsequent matches, one of the objects of the Association will have been attained.

T  $\circ$  Association is indebted to the Hon. Minister of Militia for the grading of free ammunition for the matches. This is a great boon and your Council hopes that the Department will see its way to continue the privilege.

Your Council has now to report a case in which "the unexpected has happened."

#### COUNCIL REPORT.

At the last Annual Meeting petitions were read from three of the Rural Corps', signed by a large number of men, praying to have the date of the Annual Competitions changed to the first week in July, which would insure a much larger representation from those regiments and from the country districts generally.

Acting on this request, and by the advice of the Annual Meeting, the Council decided to hold the matches on the 3rd July and following days. In addition to this, considerable expense was incurred in advertising, printing posters and circulars, and distributing same throughout the Province, and yet there was practically no increase in the attendance from the Rural Corps." One of the petitioning regiments did not send a single representative. All this too in spite of the fact that free ammunition had been granted, "Tyro" prizes introduced, and that unusal attention had been attracted to the Militia and to Rifle shooting on account of the war in South Africa.

On the other hand, the City of Halifax, which would have preferred the old dates, sent a number of new men to the meet.

Notwithstanding the fact of a larger number of competitors being present, the entries for the Ladies' Match were only 81, as against 103 last year, and the entries to the Long Range fell from 51 to 45. The entries for the Ottawa Team only numbered 23, a falling off of 12 from last year.

This was probably owing to the unusual length of time between the two meets, as we had fifty-two representatives at Ottawa, possibly the largest number ever sent by this Association.

The Ottawa Team was in command of Lt.-Col. Macdonald, with Capt. Suckling as Adjutant, and 'by the accompanying report it will be seen that our men were very successful.

The N. S. R. A. won the second prize in the London Merchants' Match and came very near to winning the cup. British Columbia beating our men by only one point.

The Association is indebted to the Dominion and Local Governments for the usual grants to our funds.

The Intermaritime Match was shot at Bedford this year, and was again won by P. E. Island, with 725 points. This is the highest score ever made in this match. New Brunswick was second with 695, and Nova Scotia last with 690.

The Treasurer's report herewith shows our funds to be in a very satisfactory condition. The balance at the credit of the general account is about \$150.00 less than it was last year, but this is owing to the unusual expenditure of some \$165.00 for Binoculars and Revolvers, the ordinary expenses having been met by the income.

It was a very great help to the Register Keepers to be supplied with glasses. While the increased number of entries in the Revolver Match shows the good results of this outlay. Still further increase is looked for in this much.

The accounts of the Intermaritime fund have been duly audited and show a substantial increase of the balance at the credit of this account.

Your Council wishes to place on record the deep sympathy felt for the Hon. Minister of Militia in the death of his son, Major Borden, a former member of this Council, while engaged in action in the Transvaal.

The presentation of prizes took place on Thursday evening, July 5th, at the Drill Hall, Halifax, in presence of a portion of the City Brigade.

The prizes were presented by General Lord William Seymour, Commander of the Forces, who addressed the competitors and expressed his interest in the work of the Association.

Your Council is pleased to report that the work of improving and extending the Bedford Range has been commenced. When completed we will have one of the best Rifle Ranges in Canada.

### MEETING of COUNCIL, August 16th, 1900.

Lieut.-Col. Irving, president, (in the chair); Lieut. Wilson, Capt Marshall, Major Garrison, Lieut. Hills, Lieut.-Col. F. H. Oxley, Lieut.-Col, Walsh, Lieut.-Col. Crane, and the Secretary.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

A letter from Lieut. Blair, relative to allowance to Bisley men, was read but no action was taken thereon.

A letter was read from Lieut. Jas. W. Day requesting to have his name placed on the Ottawa team as first waiting man, his score entitling him to that position had his aggregate card been handed in on time. It was decided that Lieut. Day could not be awarded 21st place, but that in the event of no more than nineteen men (of the 22) proceeding to Ottawa, then he should have the 20th place.

The meeting then proceeded to discuss the awarding of the Aggregate Medals. The report of the Executive Committee, two letters from Major Bishop claiming two of the medals, and a letter from the G. G.'s Secretary were read.

On motion of Lieut.-Cole Crane, seconded by Lieut. Wilson, it was unanimously resolved that the Governor-General's medals be awarded the two "active" militiamen having the highest scores, as provided for in the programme.

Lieut. Wilson moved, and Lieut.-Col. Crane seconded the following resolution :

"Whereas, the N. R. A. Medal was not won in accordance with the programme.

"Therefore resolved, that it be given to the active militiaman of Nova Scotia proceeding to Bisley in 1901 who stands highest on the team. Should the highest man already possess a N. R. A. Medal, then to go to the next qualified man, and so on. Failing to dispose of the medal in this way, then to be included in next year's prize list."

It was moved in amendment to the above by Lieut. Hills, seconded by Lieut.-Col. Walsh, "the D. R. A. Medal be given, along with the Badge, as a first prize, and the N. R. A. Medal, as second prize, the second highest man being an active militiaman." This was in the nature of a compromise, as probably the best way to get out of a peculiar difficulty.

The amendment on being put to the vote was lost—five to three and the original resolution was then carried by the casting vote of the chairman as the only alternative.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

## CONSTITUTION AND BYE-LAWS OF THE Nova Scotia Rifle Association.

### (CONSTITUTION AS REVISED, DEC. 1898.)

1. This Association shall be called the Nova Scotia Rifle Association.

2. Any British subject subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which subscription shall be made.

3. A contribution of twenty-five dollars, or of the value thereof, to the Association, shall entitle the donor to become a life member. 4. The Annual Matches shall be open to all members of the Association, but only residents of Nova Scotia being members of the Active Militia, Retired Officers and Non-Coms. or men who have served three years in any one Corps and have a discharge from their commanding officer to that effect, can become winners of medals, cups or badges. The N. R. A. medal, however, can only be won by a member of the Active Militia.

5. Any Regiment of Militia in Nova Scotia may affiliate with this Association upon payment of ten dollars annually, and shall be entitled to send representatives to the number of fifteen to compete at the Annual Matches, provided such members have never won a prize at any meeting of this Association. Any Independent Company or Troop paying five dollars affiliation fee may send eight representatives on the same terms as above.

6. The affairs of the Association shall be under the control of a Council, consisting Ex-Officio of the Secretary and Treasurer for the time being, and also of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty members, tifteen of whom shall be elected annually at the general not and an lead a log(49) and a read that a market

meeting, and five subsequently by the Council-five to form a quorum.

7. The Annual Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of a Council and other matters, shall be held in the month of December in each year, or as soon thereafter as the Council consider judicious. Special meetings of the Association can be called at any time by the President, upon the written requisition of five or more members. A meeting of members may be held on the Rifle Range, if practicable, during the Annual Competition to dis cuss shooting and other matters, and to make suggestions for the guidance of the Association and Council.

8. The Council-elect will meet and assume office in the month of January, or shortly after the Annual Meeting, and subsequent meetings will be held from time to time as the President may deem necessary. The President shall call a meeting of the Council at any time, if so requested by three members, such request to be submitted to the Secretary in writing.

9. At the first meeting of the Council a President and two Vice-Presidents shali be elected from the members of the Council elected at the Annual Meeting.

A Secretary-Treasurer and five additional members of Council shall also be elected and the necessary Officers and Committees appointed

10. Any gentlemen elected to the Council shall qualify by payment of his subscription at any time prior to the next meeting of the Council, and if the same shall not be then paid, the place of such member may be declared vacant, and shall be filled by the Council, who shall have power to fill all vacancies which may exist in the number of its members or officers.

11. The Council may grant such salary as shall be deemed fit to any officer of the Association. It may enact such Bye-laws and form such rules as may be found necessary for conducting the Annual Competitions, and for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association. Such Bye-Laws to have effect until the next Annual meeting of the Association, then to be affirmed or repealed.

13. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and (having been submitted to the Council) shall be published previous to the holding of the General Annual Meeting of the Association.

14. The President shall appoint two Auditors, who shall carefully examine and compare all vouchers with the Secretary-Treasurer's account and certify to the correctness of the same.

15. No alteration of this Constitution shall be made, except by a resolution duiy passed at the Annual Meeting, and notice in writing of the terms of such resolution must be handed the Secretary at least one month previous to the meeting. Said notice of resolution to be printed in the Annual Report.

## BYE-LAWS.

## (AS AMENDED, DECEMBER, 1898.)

1. The Election of all Officers of the Council shall be by ballot, upon nomination duly made and seconded, and no vote shall count for any person not so nominated.

2. Written notice of time and place of meeting of Council, shall be sent to the members thereof by the Secretary.

3. The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of Council, such minutes, as well as the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Association, to be published in the Annual Report.

4. At least fourteen days' notice of the time and place appointed for the Annual Competition, shall be given by the Secretary, in not less than two of the Halifax papers.

### CONSTITUTION AND BYE-LAWS:

5. Notice of the Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be published in, at least, two Halifax newspapers.

6. Bisley rules shall be followed as nearly as is practicable in all matters, such as Uniforms, Targets, Marking, Ties, Penalties, etc.

. 7. The Prize Meeting will be conducted by a Committee of five, elected by the Council from its members, three to form a quorum, to whom shall be referred all questions relating to the infringement of the rules, disputed scores, etc., arising at the meeting, and their decision shall be final and binding.

8. A Range Officer or Officers shall be appointed by the Council, or Executive to take command of the Competitors and Register Keepers, and to maintain order and discipline on the field.

9. No change shall be made in these Bye-Laws, except by a majority vote of the members of Council present at any meeting. Notice of such change having been given the Secretary in writing at least two weeks previously.

Notice of resolutions given by Captain E. D. Adams, October 13th, 1900. To be moved at the annual meeting.

Resolved, "That section four of the constitution be amended to read as follows, viz: The Annual Matches shall be open to all members of the Association, but only permanent residents of Nova Scotia shall be qualified to compete for Cups, and all medals and badges shall be confined to the Active Militia, unless otherwise stipulated by the doner."

Resolved,, "That the word 'Independent' be omitted from section five. Making the last clause of that section to read, 'any company or troop etc."

#### HALIFAX, Nova Scotia,

#### Oct. 19th, 1900.

Resolved, "That section 2 of the Constitution be amended to read as follows: Any member of the Active, Reserve, or Retired Militia (or man who has served three years and holds a discharge), of Nova Scotia, subscribing \$2.00 to the funds of the Association, shall be a member thereof, for the year in which subscription shall be made."
