

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Collector or Comptroller of the Customs, or Maval Officer, hall make any false Certificate; or if any Werchant, Trader, factoz, oz other Person, hall make any false Dath with regard to the Growth of such Staves and heading; or if any Hafter or Commander of any Ship of Aestel shall make any false Dath concerning the Certificate for or the Joentity of such Staves and Beading; or if any Person or Persons chall counterfeit any such Certificate, as is herein-befoze directed to be made, in older to obtain any Plemium of Bounty hereby extesto obtain granted; all and every such Person and Persons so to forteit 200% offending in any of the Cales afozelaid, hall forfeit the Sum of Two hundled Pounds: And if any such Person so offending shall be a Collector, Comptroller, of Maval Officer, of any other Officer of the Customs. he shall also forfeit and lose his Office, and be incapable of ferving his Hajesty, his heirs and Successors.

Person or Persons sor any Thing done in pursuance of this Ad, every such Adion og Suit, if in Great Britain, shall be commenced within Six Calendar Months next after the fact committed, and if in any of the faid Co-Ionies or Plantations, within Eighteen Calendar Months nert after the fact committed, and not afterwards; and the Defendant of Defendants, in any such Action of Suit, may plead the General Mue, and give this Act and the General Isue. Special Matter in Evidence, at any Trial to be had thereupon, and that the same was done in pursuance and by the Authority of this Act: And if it hall appear to to have been done, the Jury hall find toz the Destendant oz Dekendants; and if the Plaintiff hall be nonsuited, or discontinue his Action after the Defendant or Defendants hall have appeared; or if Judgement thall be given upon any Clerdick, og Demurrer, against the Plaintiff, the Defendant og Defendants hall and may recover Treble Costs, and have the like Remedy Treble Costs. for the same, as any Desendant of Desendants bath of have in other Cases by Law.

Staves and heading, of any Part thereof, so to be imported or exported as aforelaid, are of the Growth or Produce of any of the said Colonies or Plantations, or of any other Growth or Produce; or if any Adion hall be brought by the Owner or Claimer of such Goods. against any Officer of the Customs, or any other Person, for any Ching done in pursuance of this Act, and any Doubt of Duestion, shall thereupon arise concerning the Place of the Glowth of Product of such Goods, the
