DUBLIN, April 18, 1850.

The contemplated abolition of the Lord Lieutenantry, and the Vice-Regal Court, still occupies much of the attention of the citizens of Dublin. A large and respectable meeting, convened by requisition to the Lord Mayor, was held at the Rotunda, on the 8th ultimo, for the purpose of protesting against the measure. The meeting was addressed by Messrs. Long. J. O'Connell, Latouche, H. Grattan, Alderman Kirshaw, Ferguson, &c. Some very good speeches were made, and, although the politics of the speakers were in many instances diametrically opposite, the greatest unanimity prevailed. A Mr. Shea Lalor endeavored to disturb this, and was with some difficulty restrained by the Chairman. The Resolutions, which were adopted unanimously, were similar, if not in words, in sense, to those of the previous meeting, presided over by the High Sheriff of the City.

If the Ministry carry this measure, a breach of faith towards the citizens of Dublin will certainly be committed, but this will not probably trouble the Whigs much.
