DISRAELI AS A PROPHET.

Those who have made themselves even superficially acquainted with the writings and speeches of Benjamin Disraeli cannot but have been struck by the insight he displayed into the significance of social and political phenomena which had not by any means become important factors in the immediate political situation at the time of his prevision.

I cannot conceive how our distant colonies can have their affairs administered except by a self-government. But self-government in my opinion, as it was conceded, ought to have been accompanied by a great policy of Imperial consolidation.

Thirty years ago this was no doubt accepted as simply an expression of the orthodox opinion of the old Imperialism, that colonies should be organized and governed for the benefit of the country whose flag they were.
