BYE-LAWS
OF THE
INCORPORATED
DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-laws, or any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex. officio, Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to eight. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop and all Lay-members of the Church of England, subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, being members of the Society; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President,

9th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.

- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied ; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen ; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office, but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society ; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

REPORT
OF THE
EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE,
FOR 1876.

THE Executive Committee of the Diocesan Church Society present to the members of the Society the following report of their proceedings during the year 1876. They notice that the total receipts for general purposes was a little more than in the previous year. Yet in order to meet the engagements which have been entered into for the support of missionaries, it has been found necessary to draw upon our reserved funds to the extent of \$1000. This should convince churchmen, that unless the contributions to the Society are much increased, some part at least of its work must be given up.

The Committee are glad to see that a larger sum than usual has been paid toward the support of missionaries, shewing that we have fewer vacant missions than in 1875. They are firmly of opinion that in general the progress of the Society is dependent upon the activity of its missionary work.

The Committee hope that this report will shew that they have to the best of their ability administered the funds placed under their care, for the advancement of Christ's Church in this Diocese.

With reference to the year 1877, the Committee state that they begin the year with a smaller balance than usual, and that if all the grants due at the end of 1876, had then been paid, there would have been a debt of at least \$350, with which to begin the year 1877.

The missionary grants for three years from 1st of January last have been made, amounting to \$5240.00. These are under the Rules of the "Quebec Scheme." Although it has not been possible to bring the minimum stipend up to the necessary \$800, or to

increase the grants from D. C. S., yet the conditions required from the people have in several cases been made for larger amounts, and the Committee are glad to say have, in all but one case, (and that only from want of ability) been cheerfully agreed to. This we think, in a time of commercial and industrial depression, is a good sign of the right spirit of independence increasing among church people.

In addition to the above named grants under the Quebec Scheme, the following have been made, as they were regarded necessary to meet the wants of church members :—For a travelling missionary in Cape Breton \$300; to Rev. L. M. Wilkins, at Bridgetown, for two years, \$50 per annum; Rev. F. M. Young for missionary visits in Cape Breton, for one year, \$50. The total amount of grants is therefore \$5640.

The income for general purposes, received up to May 18th, is \$3958.44. There may be about \$750.00 yet to be depended upon, while casual contributions may increase the amount to \$5200.00. It is evident therefore, that it will be necessary still further to draw upon our reserves to meet the engagements which the Committee felt it necessary to make. Under these circumstances, the D. C. S. earnestly hope that every member of the church will deny himself something more, in order that the work in the Lord's Vineyard may not be hindered or hampered.

Your Committee regret that while St. Paul's, Halifax, has increased its contributions, yet St. George's and St. Mark's have not sent any return as yet. Until the claims of the Society are more decidedly advocated in some of the churches in Halifax, this want of support must be felt by our county missions.

An Act has passed the Local Assembly (which Act is printed for the information of the Church) transferring all the funds of the D. C. S. to the Diocesan Synod, with the proviso that all the objects of the Society be carried on as usual, and under the same rules and regulations. For the sake of economy of management and centralization of design, this change has been agreed to by all,

Now that the control of church funds is vested in the Synod, where all are represented, it is to be expected, and aimed at, that its Board for support of domestic missions, may become the one Church Society of the Diocese.

On the second day of July next, or as soon after as possible, the Treasurer of the D. C. S., together with its Auditors, will transfer to the Synod all funds belonging to the Society for the special and general objects for which they have been contributed.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

THE Annual General Meeting was held in Argyle Hall, July 4th, 1876, at 8 o'clock, p. m.

The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop presided. There were present a large number of Clergy and Lay Representatives.

The Bishop gave his opening address, stating the business to be brought forward and drawing attention to deficiency in the funds of the Society.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year:—

Canon Gilpin, Secretary, C. B. Bullock, Asst. Sec., and Canon Gilpin, Treasurer.

Members of the Executive Committee:—Messrs. E. D. Meynell, E. P. Archbold, T. A. Brown, R. J. Wilson and J. T. Wylde.

J. R. DeWolfe, Esq., was appointed a member of the Church Endowment Fund Committee, to fill the vacancy caused by the removal of A. M. Uniacke, Esq., from the Diocese.

mum salary of \$800. That all the grants to missions terminate with the year 1876, and that in reconsidering these grants every effort will be made to increase the salaries of the Clergy, but that the income of the present year does not promise much success.

The Widow's and Orphans' Committee reported that they had allowed and paid the full amount of pension to the widow of the late Rev. W. H. Jamison.

The report of the Executive Committee relative to Union with the Synod, was then taken up and adopted in the following form :

1st. That all the property and funds now under the control of the Diocesan Church Society, be transferred to the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, on condition that they be held and managed by one Board, appointed by the Synod, for the various purposes for which they are now held and managed by the Diocesan Church Society ; and also that the several objects of the Society be carried on by that Board in accordance with the rules and regulations which now govern the actions of the Diocesan Church Society.

2nd. That the Board, to be called the Board of Diocesan Missions, consist of all clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, and not less than twenty laymen, to be elected by the Synod, and that the Bishop of Nova Scotia be *ex officio* Chairman, and the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia be *ex officio* Vice Chairmen of the Board ; also—that provision be made for change, from time to time, in the members of the Board.

3rd. That all special funds, such as the Widows' and Orphans' fund, the Superannuation fund, and the fund for the Endowment of Parishes, be held respectively, distinct and solely for the purposes for which they have been contributed, and no other ; and that the by-laws thereof may from time to time be amended, as has hitherto been done by the Diocesan Church Society.

4th. That recommendations 1st, 2nd and 3rd, as above, be held to be permanent conditions of the transfer.

5th. No layman shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its fund of at least one dollar, and at each regular meeting of the Synod one-half of the whole number of Lay-members of the Board shall go out of office ; but they, or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members having been proposed, seconded, and then elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list.

6th. A list of life members of the D. C. S. shall be printed in each printed record of the Synod.

7th. The "Endowment Fund" shall be governed by its present Committee, under the prospectus; and any vacancies in the Committee shall be filled up by the Diocesan Synod, to whom the Committee shall report annually.

8th. The Board shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July, or at the time of the meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the General Meeting of the members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or in case of his absence by a Vice-Chairman.

9th. The present Secretary and Treasurer shall continue (if willing) to fill those offices, until the Synod shall decide on a permanent course of action relative thereto, when it shall have full power to deal with the whole question, as may be deemed expedient.

10th. Encouragement shall be given to the formation and action of local committees in connection with the Board of Synod, as hitherto with the Diocesan Church Society.

The Bishop informed the Society that the S. P. G. grant for 1877, would be nominally the same as in 1876, but that the amount would be in reality £50 less, in consequence of an annuity to a clergyman formerly in this Diocese, but now living in England.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

OCTR. 20, 1876.—The consideration of the grants to missions for three years from the 1st January, 1877, was referred to the Quebec Scheme committee to report upon.

Several applications were submitted for aid to missionary visits. The committee felt that the funds of the Society would not admit of a favorable reply.

NOVR. 17.—An application for outfit having been preferred, it was decided that the financial condition of the Society will not admit of such grants at present.

The report of the "Quebec Scheme Committee" was presented, and subsequently adopted in the following form :

"The Committee are glad to state that the Scheme has so far worked well, and to the advantage of the missionaries. The conditions have been fulfilled by the missions up to the end of the last half year, and in almost every case the wardens have been dealt with, and they have performed their part of the contract."

The Committee expressed their regret that the income of the Society would not permit an increase of any of the grants, and that the efforts to raise the minimum salary to \$800 must be delayed. They are, however, of opinion that in several cases the people are able to contribute more than they have hitherto done.

Upon the recommendation of the Committee, the following grants, on the conditions named, were made for three years, from Jan'y 1st, 1877 :

APRIL 20, 1877.—A grant of \$50 for one year from 1st Jany. 1877, was made towards meeting the expenses of the Rev. F. M. Young, when visiting St. Peter's, C. B.

The Committee did not think itself in a position to increase the grant to Arichat, C. B.

It was agreed that the annual meeting of the Society be held on the first Tuesday in July, at 2 o'clock, p. m.

EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS.

BAYFIELD, April 10, 1877.

I take the pleasure of transmitting to you, by to-day's mail, the subscription list of this parish to the D. C. S.

Although somewhat tardy in sending you the list, I beg to assure you that I made my appeal to parishioners for offerings towards this object, this year as last, on the anniversary of the Epiphany, in order that thus we might be shewing forth our thankfulness for the light which now shines on them that once sat in darkness. Since that time, I have on several occasions spoken of the nature, objects, and the blessings which have attended this society's operations; for this purpose canvassing the greater number of the contributors personally, so as to enable them better to appreciate the obligations we are under to uphold and maintain the same. That we can justly expect a blessing to accompany and follow the faithful application of the means at its disposal, when it is made for upholding Christ's ambassadors, that they may proclaim the living voice of this church to those to whom they are sent.

When my parishioners, in the past year, have contributed nearly \$500.00 towards Church building, raised the full amount promised the incumbent, along with their quota herewith subscribed to the D. C. S., and all at a time when so general a commercial depression prevails, I think I am justified in saying that we have not failed in taking a lively interest in promoting the welfare of Christ's body. Evidence of earnest solicitude, if not of self-denial, was exhibited in one case at least by a contributor, who having no cash brought a quantity of grain to the Rectory, the proceeds of which he desired to give to the society. I gladly granted his request, and I do not hesitate to say, that he is entitled to all honor for such an exhibition of interest in the society. I have been enabled, through the assistance of an active church-woman, who was merely a visitor in Antigonish, to increase our contributions there, and feel some satisfaction as to the position occupied by the church people of that place, as when with the subscriptions herewith transmitted, they have also raised through the offertory over \$60.00 within the year for other church purposes, and there being but a handful of members, there is tangible evidence afforded of their attachment to the church. With these things to cheer and comfort me, I am sorry to say that one or two, communicants too, in the parish, cannot see it their duty to contribute to the society. I cannot but assure you, in conclusion, that my people and myself heartily trust that the society will at all times be sustained by the liberal contributions of all interested in the dissemination of the doctrines of the Catholic Church, and that the danger which threatened an interference with its operations, from want of a more liberal support, may be averted.

BRIDGEWATER, April 1876.

The mission of Bridgewater is still in its infancy, and its list of names and amounts far from what it ought to be; but our business, lumbering, is at a discount, while our local wants have demanded all we could spare.

For a poor year, our people have done a great deal; they found a sum of \$100 towards their clergyman's visit to the old country to see his aged parents; they have added a new chancel to their church, and paid to the clergyman more than is required by the society.

The chancel is 20 x 27 ft. and seats about thirty persons. The windows were presented by a member of the congregation, they are five in number, were made in England of cathedral glass, and are much admired. The ladies have supplied the banners and carpet; so that our new chancel, now free from debt, is a marked improvement.

A new parsonage has been lately built; the grounds and fences require attention; the church requires new pews, and we have yet our wants. Still, the people have been doing what they could.

But now that local wants have been in some degree removed, I hope we may, next year, do more for the society.

The Missionary has two services in Holy Trinity Church every Sunday, save the third Sunday, when, in the morning, he is at Conquerall. There we have a neat church and good congregation; it is nine miles off. We have also a third of the Union building at the Bank, where no real progress will be made until we have a church. There they have one Sunday service in the month. The church at Conquerall has two Sunday services each month.

The clergyman, also, attends one Sunday afternoon each month at a school house five miles off, which is generally full of people, and the services are hearty, but the room is too small.

At the Branches, ten miles off, they have alternate services on Sunday afternoon once a month. The people remember the time and place very well, but we have only a few members of our church in these places, and many attend who use no prayer book. The services are consequently very dull. They teach the clergyman the great beauty and glory of our church by the absence of these things which every good churchman loves. Our church recognizes the royal priesthood of the people and expects their voices to be heard in the worship of God, that they are not simply spectators at an exhibition, but fellow-worshippers with the clergyman at the throne of grace.

The Sunday school in Bridgewater has now 86 scholars and a good staff of hard working teachers. The interest taken in the school is one of the most healthy signs of the mission. The number of pupils is about fourfold of a few years ago.

Hitherto the clergyman's pay from the people has been much more than the sum required by the society, but the hard times of this winter have made a change in this respect, and the clergyman has had to suffer with his people. Hope, however, bnoys us up. We expect a railroad, and if so the hard times may become good times.

Whatever may be in the future, may there be an extension of the church which teaches her children to pray, and how to behave in the house of God, and so to live as to be an epistle known and read of all men.

Your missionary would press upon the society the advantages of collecting cards for the annual offerings of the D. C. S. By such cards left at each house by the clergyman our funds would be increased.

May the D. C. S. long continue to be the missionary society in Nova Scotia.

SHELBOURNE, April 3, 1877.

I beg to hand you a list of the contributors to the D. C. S. for 1877, and also enclose a draft for the amount contributed—\$117.83; an advance upon last year, which is more than I expected. Last year the names or places, Lower Jordan and Sandy Point, were not inserted in the report. This was a great disappointment. I also enclose a P. O. Order for \$53, in trust for the church at Port La Tour.

I am grieved to say we have been shut out of our church during the lenten season and have been obliged to hold our services in a "hall." We missed the week-day services, how much I cannot tell, but very sadly. I am thankful to say we shall, about Ascension day, be again in our own house of prayer. It has been all but re-built and will, I think, look well,—at any rate it will be more church-like in all its arrangements. The cost will be some \$5000, the greater part of which has been raised among ourselves, with a few handsome donations from abroad. We also pay our worthy Curate \$600 exclusive of supplying him with a good house, stable, garden, &c. Taking these things into consideration, and remembering there is not a rich man in the parish, I think our contribution to the D. C. S. is very fair. Although I am free to confess that many among us do very little and, perhaps, all might do more than they have yet done. May the Lord put it into the hearts of His people to serve Him better for His sake to whose love for us we owe everything.

WEYMOUTH, April 16, 1877.

I have much pleasure in remitting you \$100 in aid of the general objects of the D. C. S. The offertories for the W. & O. F., and for the superannuated clergy, were sent you early in January. In the course of the next fortnight you will receive the balance of contributions, \$17, which will make the total amount from Weymouth \$135, or about \$7 more than last year's remittance. This may appear but a small sum to those unacquainted with the circumstances under which the whole has been raised. Let me then state, that several gentlemen connected with the railway in course of erection here, and who generously contributed \$24 in 1876, have left us; two other persons, each of whom gave \$1, have also removed from the parish; some who have lost largely by the peculiar railway troubles here, have felt themselves unable

to make their usual contribution; and a few, owing to the extreme hardness of the times, are utterly unable to do as in former years. Still, in face of the drawbacks, we have not only been spared the pain of sending a smaller remittance than last year, but of increasing our ordinary amount. Indeed, what will be sent by those whose names appear on the subscription list, may, in one sense, be said to be \$24 more than were sent you in 1876, since, from the causes referred to, there are fewer persons to contribute the \$185.

Now, when I state that on Ascension day, in response to the Bishop of Algoma's appeal, the offertory was \$8.71; that on St. Andrew's day we gave \$6.17 towards sending a missionary to heathen lands; that during the year \$80 were raised towards defraying the improvements on the parsonage; besides contributing liberally to various local objects, I think it will appear that, in a parish in which it cannot be said that there are many persons in easy circumstances, and where also the members of the church are not very numerous, those duties "with which God is well pleased," are not altogether neglected.

I read the well-timed appeal of the executive committee to my congregation in this mission; and I also distributed it freely. The people who cordially respond, according to their ability, to every call made on them in aid of the church and her institutions, know that we commence working for the society towards the end of January, and that during the next three months, the holy objects which it contemplates are constantly kept before them.

APPENDIX.

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society :

" It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for the object to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom ; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and no other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this Fund, subject to an appeal to the whole Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application ; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8.00, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year :

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment become due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this Sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any clergyman shall go beyond the limits of Europe, or of North America 35° North latitude, without the leave of the Sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of Every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension under the above limitation of ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form * * * * under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

~~At~~ At the general meeting of the Society, Oct. 4th, 1865—"It was the opinion of the meeting that, for purposes of insurance in the W. and O. Fund, Bermuda should not be considered within the limits of British North America."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

*Extract from the 11th object of the D. C. S.—It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.*

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to

the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think expedient. But should the sub-Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D.C.S.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension

The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Missions, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub-Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

The Endowment Sub-Committee, in a Report to the Executive Committee, dated May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

"That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its '*Reserved Fourths*,' and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Society and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

"With reference to the control of the Society over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Society to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment.

The first recommendation was adopted by the Executive Committee,—the second is still under consideration.

3rd.—That all parishes and missions receiving aid from the D. C. S. toward the salary of their minister, shall by their wardens, or other representatives, pay to the Secretary of the Society half-yearly, on or before the 30th of June and 31st December in each year, such proportions of the required salary as may be arranged by mutual consent of themselves and the Diocesan Church Society.

4th.—On receipt of the stipulated half-yearly amount from the parish or mission, the Secretary shall accept the order of the minister for the full half year's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties.

5th.—Should the minister accept part of the amount payable by the parish or mission in kind at *cash* prices, his receipt for the sum in the form of a Bill of items, may be counted by the wardens or representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the parish or mission.

6th.—Should the sums agreed to be paid by the wardens or representatives not be paid when due, or within thirty days after falling due, the proportion agreed to be paid by the D.C.S. may be continued for six months, and the Executive Committee shall enquire into the cause of such deficiency, and consider the subject at the ensuing meeting.

7th.—The receipt of the Clergyman for money given at the offertory may be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Society from the people.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

"All subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

"If reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

 The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

"All applications for aid from this Society are proposed at one meeting of the Committee and considered at the next."

"No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted :—

"The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers, upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for purposes of salary during his incumbency ; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz., one by the parish, one by the Executive Committee of D. C. S., and another by these two."

UNION WITH THE SYNOD.

The following is the basis of union proposed by the Executive Committee of D. C. S. :—

1st. That all the property and funds now under the control of the Diocesan Church Society, be transferred to the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, on condition that they be held and managed by one Board, appointed by the Synod, for the various purposes for which they are now held and managed by the Diocesan Church Society; and also that the several objects of the Society be carried on by that Board in accordance with the rules and regulations which now govern the actions of the Diocesan Church Society.

2nd. That the Board consist of all clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, and not less than twenty lay-men, to be elected by the Synod, and that the Bishop of Nova Scotia be *ex-officio* Chairman, and the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia be *ex-officio* Vice Chairmen of the Board; also—that provision be made for change, from time to time, in the members of the Board.

3rd. That all special funds, such as the Widows' and Orphans' fund, the Superannuation fund, and the fund for the Endowment of Parishes, be held, respectively, distinct and solely for the purposes for which they have been contributed, and no other; and that the by-laws thereof may from time to time be amended, as has hitherto been done by the Diocesan Church Society.

4th. That recommendations 1st, 2nd and 3rd, as above, be held to be permanent conditions of the transfer.

5th. That the Vice Presidents of the D. C. S., now appointed, occupy the same position for life, on the above named Board.

6th. That a list of life members of the D. C. S. be inserted in each printed record of the Synod.

7th. That the "Endowment Fund" be governed by its present Committee, under the prospectus; and that any vacancies in the Committee be filled up by the Diocesan Synod, to whom the Committee shall report annually.

8th. That the present Secretary and Treasurer continue (if willing) to fill those offices, until the Synod shall decide on a permanent course of action relative thereto, when it shall have full power to deal with the whole question, as may be deemed expedient.

9th. That encouragement should be given to the formation and action of local committees in connection with the Board of Synod, as hitherto with the Diocesan Church Society.

The following suggestions have been made by the Executive Committee of the Synod :—

In Clause 11, add after "Board" the words "to be called the Board of Diocesan Missions."

That the 5th Clause be "No layman shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its funds of at least one dollar, and at each annual meeting of the Synod the first five, or if there are more than twenty, then one fourth of the whole number of lay members of the Board shall go out of office but they or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members having been proposed, seconded and then elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list."

That the 8th Clause be "The Board shall meet monthly during the year with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July or at the time of the meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the general meeting of members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or in his absence by a Vice Chairman.

*AN ACT to vest in the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia the
Funds held by the D. C. S.*

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the D. C. S. held in the month of July, 1876, it was resolved, &c. &.

And whereas, at the General Session of the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia held in the same month, the said Resolution was adopted by the Synod.

And whereas, it is considered expedient in order to carry such (resolution) into effect, that an Act be passed to vest in the said Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia all real and other property held in trust by or for the said D. C. S.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, as follows:

1. All property, real and personal, held by or in trust for the D. C. S. or other funds respectively connected therewith, are hereby declared to have become vested in the Diocesan Synod of N. S. in trust, to be held and managed, for the several purposes for which they have heretofore been held and managed by the D. C. S. as fully and effectually as the same were previously vested in or held in trust for said D. C. S.
 2. The said Synod shall be bound to fulfil all engagements made by the said Society previous to such transfer, and to observe all the conditions under which the several funds may have been held in trust by the said Society.
 3. In all cases where moneys of the D. C. S. have been loaned on mortgage in this Province for the benefit of any trust funds in connection with said Society, and in all like cases it shall and may be lawful in case of the payments of the amounts due on such mortgages, for the said Synod to discharge such mortgagors by writing under their seal, and thereby the mortgagors, their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns shall be fully discharged from all further liability on account of such mortgages.
 4. The receipt of the Treasurer of the Synod shall be a sufficient discharge to the Treasurer of the said Society for all moneys and securities transferred by him.
