ECLIPSES.

There will not be any Eclipse of the Moon during the year. Of the Sun there will be only two Eclipses, and as they are neither of them visible on this continent it will not be necessary to state many particulars:—

I.—On the 23rd of February an Annular Eclipse of the Sun takes place. It will be visible in Africa, South America, and Southern Europe.

II.—On the 18th of August there will be a total Eclipse of the Sun, visible in Australia, Southern Asia, and also in Eastern Africa.

PLANETS.

Venus will be an Evening Star until July 16; after that day a Morning Star. Until the 2d January and after the 13th November, Mars will be an Evening Star; between these two dates, it will be a Morning Star. Until March 10th Jupiter will be an Evening Star; from that date to the 4th July, it will be a Morning Star. Until February 24th Saturn will be a Morning Star, and from that date to the 29th November, it will be an Evening Star. Mars will come to the meridian during the day-light for the first nine months of the year, but will become an object of interest towards the end of the year. On the 8th of April Jupiter will be very close to Mars.

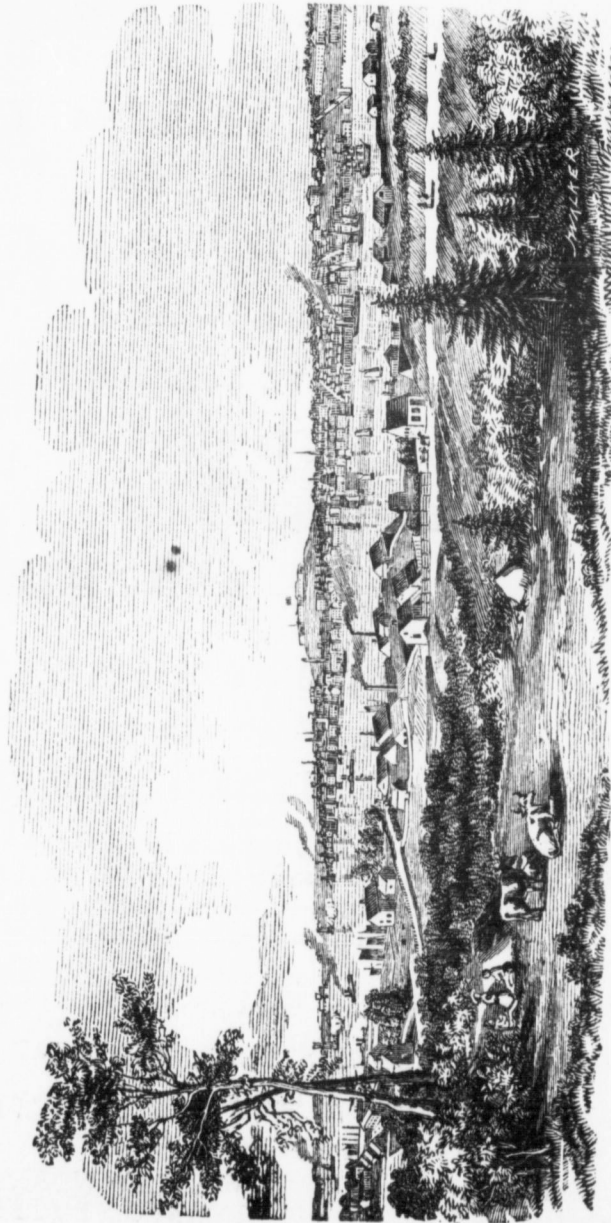

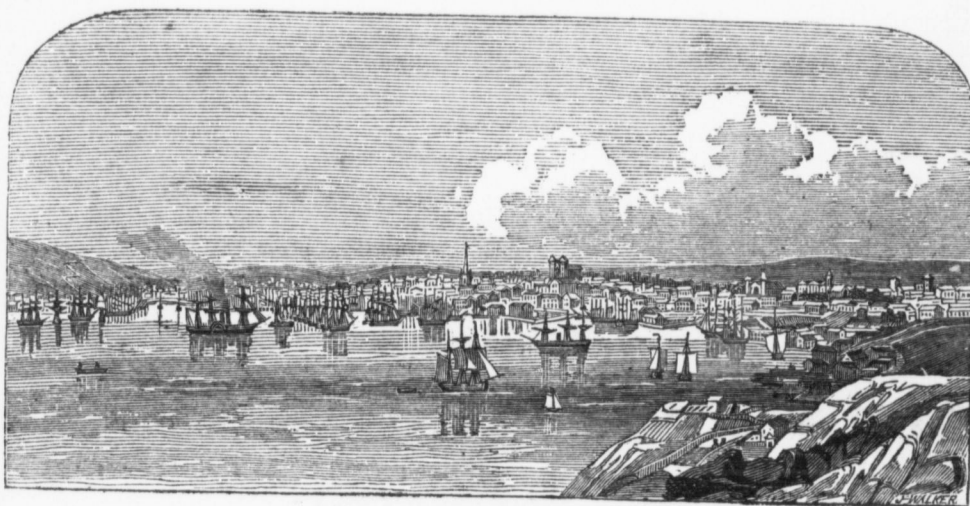

Local letters if pre-paid.... 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. | Local letters if unpaid 7 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. If a letter is posted partially unpaid the charge on delivery will be the same as if wholly unpaid, deducting, however, any amount that may have been pre-paid upon it. Letters mailed for delivery at the office were posted 1 cent each. Letters are re-directed from one place to another without any further charge. On letters re-mailed from the Dead Letter Office, 3 cents additional; 2 cents for letters delivered by letter carriers.

Letters to Non-commissioned Officers and Privates, whether in Her Majesty's Service or Canadian Volunteers, whilst on active service, pass if pre-paid for two cents each, when not over the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; if over $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., ordinary letter rates.

On letters circulating within the Dominion, or for the Island of Prince Edward, the charge is 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., pre-payment optimal; to Newfoundland, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

Letters may be sent fortnightly by "Royal Mail Steamer" from Boston for Nova Scotia and Newfoundland, but must be prepaid 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

Letters sent to the United States, British Columbia, California, Oregon, Red River, and Sandwich Island, when forwarded *via* United States, and not through England, the postage is 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Letters for British Columbia, however, can only be pre-paid as far as San Francisco. Those for British Columbia, California and Red River, must be pre-paid.

Letter postage to Cuba *via* United States is 20 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; to Bermuda, Porto Rico, 23 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., which must be prepaid.

Letter Rates to the United Kingdom, if by Canadian Packet, not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.....

exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.....	12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents,

and so on increasing one rate of postage for each additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. If letters for the United Kingdom are posted unpaid, they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling in addition to the postage on delivery.

The postage on letters by the Cunard line is 17 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and an additional 17 cents for every $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., with a fine of 6d. sterling if posted unpaid.

NO CUSTOM DUTY ON NOTMAN'S PHOTOGRAPHY GOING TO ENGLAND.

Mail Matter exempt from Postage.

All mailable matter sent to or by the Governor-General, or sent to or from any Public Department at the Seat of Government, or to or from any member of the Legislature at the Seat of Government during the Session, or ten days before the meeting of Parliament. Letters on her Majesty's Service passing between the United Kingdom and the Dominion of Canada to any of the Imperial Military Departments. Periodicals devoted to the education of youth, Agriculture, Temperance, or any branch of Science.

Newspapers and Periodicals.—Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, *if paid quarterly in advance*, by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted or by the subscriber at delivering post office :

For a paper published 6 times a week.....	2s.	or 40 cents per qr.,
Ditto do 3 times a week.....	1s.	or 20 " do
Ditto do 2 times a week.....	8d.	or 13 " do
Ditto do 1 time a week.....	4d.	or 6½ " do

When the above rates are not paid in advance, by either publisher or subscriber, such papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

Miscellaneous Charges.—The charge on parcels, by Parcel Post, to any place in Canada, is 25 cents per pound, [with 5 cents additional, if registered.] No parcel must exceed *three* pounds in weight.

One cent per ounce, payable in advance by postage stamp, is the rate on printed circulars, prices-current, hand-bill, and other printed matter of a like character ; and on books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office, addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The charges upon prices-current, when addressed to the United Kingdom, is 2 cents each, and must be pre-paid by postage stamp.

Registration Charges.—For the registration of a letter addressed to any place in British North America, the charge is 2 cents.

For the registration of a letter to the United Kingdom, 8 cts.

For the registration of a letter to the United States, 5 cts.

France, and other countries for which letters pass through France, an amount equal to the postage.

No letter can be forwarded as registered unless postage and registration fee are both pre-paid.

Postmasters are furnished with lists, and will afford every information required by applicants.

Money Orders in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

The rules relating to local Money Orders in Quebec and Ontario apply equally to local Orders in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, but a slight difference exists in the commission charged, which is as follows :—

THROUGH ALL THE LUNATIONS OF EACH YEAR.

This Table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom found to fail.

If the new moon, the first quarter, the full moon, or the last quarter happens:	IN SUMMER.	IN WINTER.

Observations.—The nearer the time of the Moon's change to noon or midnight, the more nearly will the result accord with the prediction.

It is also said that less dependence is to be placed on the Table in winter than in summer.

Reduce the sum to sixpences, and add a cipher if there be no odd pence in the sum to be reduced; and if there be odd pence, add their equivalent in cents. The result will be the sum in cents.

To reduce Sterling into dollars and cents.

If the value of the sterling money be reckoned at par of exchange, then substitute for every pound sterling £1 4s. 4d., and for every fraction of a pound sterling a similar fraction of £1 4s. 4d. The result in currency reduce by the currency table. If the value of the sterling money be calculated at the current rate of exchange, convert into currency as above, reckoning the value of the pound sterling at the exchange rate, in lieu of £1 4s. 4d., and the fractions proportionately.

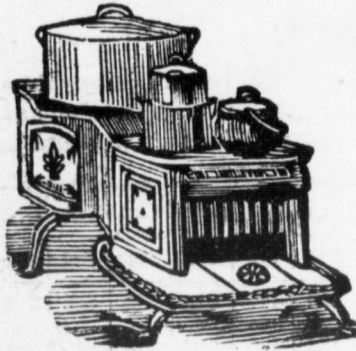

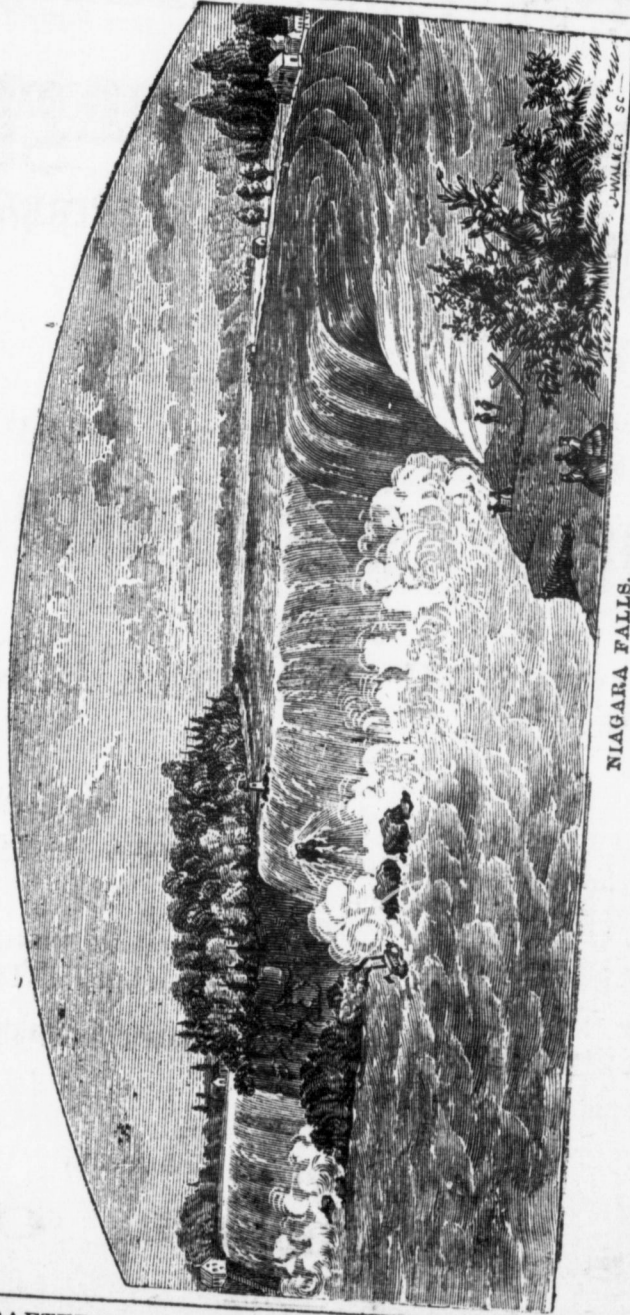

EXAMPLE.—A Note for \$2,637 74, if executed singly, would require to be stamped with 81 cents; if executed in duplicate, each part with 54 cents; if in more than two parts, each part with 27 cents.

EXTRACT FROM ACT OF 1865.—“The person affixing such adhesive stamp, shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and such stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon; and if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail; any person wilfully writing or stamping a false date on any adhesive stamp shall incur a penalty of one hundred dollars for each such offence.”
