Ottawa, Ont., April 17—It would not be surprising if the details of the recent agreement armyed at between Canada and the West Indies, when made public, should show that the arrangements for reciprocity trade are not so far reaching and important as stated by the ministerial press. The articles on which it is understood Canada will secure a preference include lab, flour, bran and biscaits, lumber (other than pitch pine), cooperage stock and shingles, cheese, butter, bacon, ham, beef, pork, boots and shoes, nails, shingles, rivets paper, peas, oats, hay, soap, cordage, horses, paints, steam engines and machinary.

Halifax, April 17—The cable ship Mackay Bennett, chartered by the White Star Line to go to the scene of the Titanic disaster, was being loaded today. In the hope that some bodies may be picked up, coffins are being included in the cargo, and several undertakers and embalmers will

go along.

Toronto, April 17—It is probable that a memorial service will be held in Massey Hall on Sunday afternoon. Rev. Alfred Hall, secretary for the British and Foreign Sailors Society is endeavoring to make arrangements and has interviewed members of the provincial and municipal governments and prominent officers of churches to enlist their co-operation. It is likely that the chief address will be by the Anglican Archbishop of Ruperts Land, Most Rev. Dr. Matheson.




