The steamer La-Tour brought 517 crates live lobster to Yarmouth on Saturday, for the Boston market.

The ferry boats were not allowed the use of the Ferry today. A pile driver has been engaged all day at the docks on the east side.

The wooden "Lady of the Lake" arrived yesterday from Grand Lake with the first cargo of coal this year. She is discharging her cargo at York Boat slip.

The Newfoundland seal catch this year is reported to have been something unexpected. Within the short period of six weeks seals have been taken to the value of \$110,000.

The following suspicious warning is attached to certain groceries, a short distance above Fredericton. "Beware, persons trespassing on these grounds is liable to 20 dollars fine."

The Landship the Bishop Cathedral, will hold a Confirmation service in St. James' church (not St. Mary's) as stated in a morning paper, this evening at 7.30 o'clock.

The yacht will be built on the lines of the celebrated boat Jubilee, which contained all the American craft on St. Andrew's year ago.
