ANSWER.

THOMAS FAWCETT.

BRO. FAWCETT was born in Scargill, Yorkshire, England, February, 1808. He was in early life favoured with pious parental example and training, and the teachings of the Wesleyan Ministry, and at the early age of fifteen years, was converted to God, and united himself with the Wesleyan Church, of which he was a faithful member until death. At

the age of eighteen he began to exercise his gifts, as a Local Preacher, in which capacity he served the Church for five years. In 1831 he emigrated to Canada, in the following year entered our itinerant work, and for a period of twenty-seven years, laboured faithfully and successfully as a Wesleyan Minister. During these years he occupied many laborious and important fields of labour, in some of which the membership was doubled during his term of service. He was at times called to endure a considerable amount of privation—but which he willingly and joyfully endured as a good soldier for Christ. The last few years of his useful life were devoted exclusively to our Indian work, in which he was engaged at the time of his death. In these various fields he is still remembered with strong affection as a faithful and devoted minister.

Early in the morning of the 19th March, 1859, whilst travelling on the Great Western Railway, one of those distressing accidents which have so frequently thrown families into mourning, hurried him to his reward. A fearful storm had been raging during the night, by which a portion of the embankment was swept away, leaving a deep chasm into which the fatal train with its living freight was plunged. He was taken out alive but such were the injuries he received, that he died on the following day. During this period of extreme suffering he proved the sufficiency of that religion which he had recommended to others, to sustain and cheer his own spirit; addressing his friends he said "Cheer up;" (laying his hand upon his heart, he said) "It is right here," and then exclaimed triumphantly, "I am on the rock, glory, glory to God!"—At about 10 o'clock on the Sabbath morning the 20th day of March, 1859, this devoted minister of Christ entered into rest.

Resolved,—That the following be inserted in Rule 1st, on the Composition of the Stationing Committee, after the words "Chairmen of Districts,"—"the President of Victoria College, being a member of the Conference."

II. ON OBTAINING LABOURERS FROM ABROAD.

1. *Resolved*,—That whenever it is desirable or necessary to obtain laborers from any branch of the Methodist Church abroad, in order to supply the wants of our work, the names of the persons shall be first submitted to the Stationing Committee, or the Conference Special Committee, with the necessary information, as to age, qualifications and general fitness for our work; and either of the said Committees may, if they judge advisable, invite such persons to come to this country, with the view of being employed in our Ministry.

2. *Resolved*,—That the Conference strongly disapproves of any of its individual members at their option, giving encouragement to persons from abroad, to come to this country, with a view to employment in our work.

3. *Resolved*,—That the Resolutions of Conference, in reference to the employment of married men, adopted at the Conference of 1857, be inserted in the minutes of the present year, viz. :

“This Conference, deeply impressed with the conviction that the reception of candidates for the Ministry, having families, is involving serious embarrassment to our itinerant work :—

Resolved,—(1.) That no Chairman of District, or other Conference officer, shall have authority to employ a married Preacher during the year, with a view to his being received as a candidate for the Ministry, without the consent of the Conference Special Committee.

Resolved, (2.) That no District Meeting shall recommend any married Preacher to the Conference for reception on trial, unless he has been previously employed, in case of absolute necessity, in accordance with, and under the restriction of the foregoing resolution.

III. ATTENDANCE AT CONFERENCE.

Resolved,—That the Resolutions adopted at the Conference held in Montreal, limiting the District Meetings in the appointment of Ministers to attend Conference to those who have travelled four years in full connection with the Conference, be rescinded, and that the following regulation be adopted, viz. :—

1. That the Conference shall each year, after the place of holding the next session of Conference is fixed, determine the whole number to be appointed by the District Meetings to attend the Conference, and leave each District Meeting to select its proportion from among the members of Conference belonging to the District.

2. That this limitation shall not apply to the District within the bounds of which the Conference is to be held.

3. That the number of Ministers allowed to attend the Conference for the year 1860, shall be 200, and the young men to be received into full connection.

V. CLAIMS ON CHURCH RELIEF FUND.

Resolved,—That no District shall have any claims on the Church Relief Fund, until the Financial Secretary of such District has made a return of the money to the General Treasurer; and that the Financial Secretaries be requested to make these returns on or before the first day of the Conference.

VI. DIVIDED CIRCUITS.

Resolved,—That no Minister or Preacher who has travelled three years on a Circuit at the time of its division, shall be eligible for a re-appointment to either part.

Resolved,—That in the Annual Examination of Candidates for our Ministry, it shall be the duty of the Chairmen of the Districts to include the Disciplinary Question, "Do you take no snuff, tobacco, or drams?" and that a distinct answer in the negative shall be required in every case as a condition of continuing on trial from year to year.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

The statistics which have come under the review of this Committee, and which are herewith presented, exhibit a pleasing increase for the past year, in every item. They are as follows :—

The Schools, as a rule, are efficiently conducted; and God is putting his own sanction upon the efforts of the Preachers by converting a considerable number of the scholars; so that the Sabbath School not only continues to answer to its popular designation—that of a “nursery to the Church,” but in it also are many “trees of the Lord’s right-hand planting,” bearing fruit to his praise.

Notwithstanding an increase of 57 schools for the year, the Committee is of opinion that the total number of schools is very far below what it might be—the average being a little over two schools for each circuit or mission. Some of the District and Circuit reports tend to confirm this view by representing that, in many places, so far as this line of labour is concerned—“the fields are white already to the harvest.” Impressed with the importance of the work, it urges the putting forth of every effort, and to the entering of every open door, that the youth of this land may be claimed for and won to Christ.

The question of the relation of the minister and the pulpit to the Sabbath School has occupied the earnest attention of the Committee; and as it appears that insuperable difficulties lie in the way of a general and systematic ministerial visitation of the Schools—it begs to recommend, that whenever practicable, once a month, or at least once a quarter, the ordinary preaching service be conducted with a special reference to the young—the school or schools being present at that service.

The Committee would further urge to the more extended establishment of Bible classes. Many such are already in very successful operation, inviting to increased effort in this particular department. Everything that can—should be done to retain under Christian teaching and influence those who outgrow the ordinary classes in the school.

The responsibilities of the Church—ministers and members—to the children and youth of our population are very

weighty. They may, however, be discharged. And let them be discharged, in humble dependence upon God, and the issues will become increasingly wonderful. Zion will reckon among her converts thousands of youth, and multitudes of children will throng the road to heaven.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF
VICTORIA COLLEGE.

The operations of the College have been continued during the past year with the usual vigor and success.

The number of under-graduates in the Faculty of Arts is 59; in the Faculty of Medicine 73; the number of occasional and preparatory students 153; making a total of 285.

In addition to the President of the College there have been employed, during the year, three Professors and four Tutors; a staff not larger than that employed ten years since, when the attendance of students was not more than one-half what it is now.

Many of the students are truly pious and the customary religious services, have been maintained among them.

The Boarding Hall, for the past session, has been under the direction of a Lay Steward, whose whole attention has been given to that department, and thus far, the results of this arrangement are satisfactory.

The financial condition of this College will be learned from the statements presented by the Treasurer.

The General Agent has continued his labors with unabated diligence, and has co-operated with the President of the College and the Superintendents of Circuits, in carrying out the plan adopted by the last Conference for the payment of the College debt.

Several circumstances have combined to diminish the success of these efforts, particularly the failure of the harvest, and the unexampled scarcity of money; yet, if it be thought that the true method of sustaining the College has now been devised, it will be for the Conference so to modify and improve the plan, as to give it greater efficacy.

It is proper to mention, that most valuable assistance has been rendered by the President of the Conference, who has attended the College meetings, held in the cities and larger towns, and who has, by his example and able addresses, indicated the duty of the church in relation to these great educational interests. It is earnestly desired, that the talents and official influence of the President of the Conference, may still, as much as possible, be brought to bear on this noble enterprise.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

THE ANNUAL ADDRESS OF THE CONFERENCE TO THE MEMBERS OF THE CHURCHES UNDER THEIR CARE.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,

Assembled in our annual Conference we gladly avail ourselves of the opportunity afforded us, to address you with such words of fraternal and pastoral greeting, as the intimate and important relations which subsist between us, and our unfeigned interest in all that concerns your highest welfare, may suggest.

Nor do we attend to this duty merely as a custom hitherto observed; but, with the deepest conviction, that the success and prosperity of the Church of God depend essentially, upon the united prayers, efforts, and sympathies, of ministers and people, we present this address, earnestly praying that it may prove a means of binding us more closely together in the work of faith and labor of love which the Great Head of the Church has assigned us.

The past year has been in many respects one of an eventful character. The blight of a portion of the fruits of the earth has taught us most impressively our constant dependence upon the care and kindness of our Heavenly Father for all the blessings we enjoy. The result of the financial embarrassments of former years, have occasioned much anxiety and suffering, and exerted a depressing influence on many communities.

The sound of war had scarcely died away in India, when the clashing of arms is again heard on the ancient battle

fields of Europe. How far the present war may extend, or what may be its ultimate influence on the destiny of the world, no human foresight can at present determine. But as Christians, it is our delightful privilege to know, that all things work together for good to them that love God; and amid the convulsions that distract the nations of the earth, we find a ground of confidence and peace in the assurance, that "the Lord God Omnipotent reigneth." While we devoutly thank the God of all mercies, that thus far our own country has been preserved from taking part in the sanguinary conflict now raging on the Continent of Europe, let us earnestly pray, that God may cause this conflict of nations, to be the means of opening up channels, for the dissemination of the truths of the Gospel.

In reviewing the past we desire to present our grateful ascriptions of praise to Almighty God, for the degree of success with which he has crowned our efforts, to promote the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom. The same grace that has caused us through the whole period of our history, to triumph over persecution, and every form of opposition, has been graciously vouchsafed during the past year. We rejoice to know, that our labor has not been in vain in the Lord. The word preached has been made the power of God unto the salvation of souls. Amid the toils and anxieties of our work, we have been constantly sustained and cheered by evidences of the Divine presence, and approval. We have fully realized the promise, "they that sow in tears shall reap in joy." During the year there has been an increase in our membership of 3347. And while from year to year, the places of esteemed Fathers and Brethren, are becoming vacant, as they pass away to their reward, or become disabled from age or infirmity for the work of the ministry, we rejoice to know that God is raising up young men of piety and talent, to fill up the ranks thinned by death, and to carry on the great work of winning souls to Christ. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to his abundant mercy hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus. For whatever has been ac-

complished through our instrumentality, we desire to say, "Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name give glory."

But we cannot review the past without discovering cause for humility and self-examination, as well as gratitude. How little has been done compared with what remains to be done? How far have the actual achievements of the Church fallen below her acknowledgements? Have we, as members of the Church of Christ, been as holy in our example, as self-denying in our duty, as we ought to have been? Alas! how many have a name to live and are dead; how many give practical evidence that they have forgotten the apostolic admonition, "Ye are not your own; for ye are bought with a price, therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are his."

In view of the responsibility devolving upon us, and the mighty interests depending upon our faithfulness, let us resolve, by divine grace, that in the future we will stand fast with one spirit in one mind, striving together for the faith of the Gospel. As a body of ministers, we believe that we were never more heartily and effectually united in the cause of Christ; or more fully resolved to be men of one work,—to know nothing among men but Jesus Christ and him crucified. Give us then, dear brethren, your sympathy and prayers, that while we go forth to do battle for the living truth, our hands may be made strong by your co-operation.

We commend to your prayerful attention and Christian liberality the various institutions of our Church, organized to sustain and promote the work of God among us. All our connexional funds are instituted for important ends, and a withdrawal of support from any one of them would be a serious calamity to the Church. Our Missionary Society presents special claims for your prayerful support. During the thirty-four years of its existence, it has accomplished an incalculable amount of good, both in the new settlements of our rising country, and among the Indian tribes who had no knowledge of God. Thousands of glorified spirits above, and

thousands more who are walking in the fear of the Lord, and the comfort of the Holy Ghost in the Church militant, are the fruits of the efforts put forth in this department of our work.

During the year four of our brethren were sent out to British Columbia, on the far distant Pacific coast. By the blessing of God they arrived in safety, and have already entered upon the great work of proclaiming the unsearchable riches of Christ to the new settlers and the destitute Indian tribes of that vast territory. Their accounts of the spiritual destitution and moral degradation that prevails, especially among the Indians, strongly appeal to every Christian heart; and call for a large increase of contributions to the funds, in order to supply the immediate and pressing demands for missionaries in that newly-settled province of our united empire.

Our Collegiate Institution, is still favored with encouraging prosperity; although for many years it has been encumbered with a heavy debt, which has seriously fettered its operations. During the past year a general appeal was made to relieve the Institution from its pecuniary embarrassments, and place it in a position of increased efficiency, and though the commercial pressure so generally felt, prevented that appeal being in all respects, as successful as it would under other circumstances have been, yet the disposition manifested, and the liberality with which many contributed according to their ability, give hope that an institution founded by the liberality and piety of our fathers, and which has conferred such important advantages upon our connexion, shall not be permitted to sink and discontinue its salutary operations for want of the pecuniary resources necessary to liquidate its debts and erect suitable buildings.

A united and general effort at the present time, would place the Institution in a position of untrammelled usefulness, for the future. We feel deeply on this subject; and appeal to you by the benefits already conferred—by the necessity that exists for such an institution—by the sanction of the

great Head of the Church, so frequently manifested in the outpourings of the Holy Spirit, which have occurred in connection with the Institution—and by the incalculable loss to the Connexion, involved in the extinction of our only University in B. N. America, to unite with us in placing Victoria College in a basis, that shall secure its free and efficient operation in the future.

Nor would we forget to remind you of the importance of sustaining our Book Room, and supplying yourselves with our literature. We feel deeply sensible that this is too much neglected; and that, in many instances, our people are either un supplied with books, or else supply themselves with those whose general character and influence, are highly questionable.

We also commend our connexional organ, the "*Christian Guardian*," to your patronage and support. No other paper can supply its place in your homes; and there is no other whose influence in your families is so salutary and reliable.

We earnestly respond to the addresses received from several influential Temperance Associations, calling our attention to the evils of intemperance and asking our support and co-operation for the removal of this fearful scourge from our land. We would in accordance with resolutions agreed to at the Conference held in Toronto two years ago, most earnestly urge upon you the importance of giving your influence in public and in private, by precept and example, to a cause so intimately connected with the welfare of both the bodies and the souls of men.

We especially urge upon you, dear brethren, the essential importance of having your own hearts right with God. Endeavor to walk in the light of God's countenance continually.

Remember your usefulness in the world, your happiness and your safety *depend upon your own personal holiness*. There are fields of duty and usefulness open to all Christians, which now are prepared to occupy efficiently, unless the

heart is brought under the influence of the sanctifying love of God. Give your countenance and support to the important institution of the Sabbath School, and endeavor to watch over the spiritual welfare of the young within the range of your influence. Work and watch as those who must give an account.

Be punctual in your attendance on all the means of grace—the public preaching of God's Word—the class meeting—the prayer meeting—private and family prayer—and above all, the prayerful and careful reading of God's holy Word—There are the counsels of Infinite Wisdom,—the great and exceedingly precious promises of God, and the sanctifying truth by which alone we can be made wise unto salvation.

As we go forth to our fields of labor and duty, for another year, we would address you in the words of the great Apostle of the Gentiles, "Brethren pray for us, that the Word of the Lord may have free course and be glorified." Live near to the cross of Christ. Let your conversation be as becometh the Gospel. Remember you stand before the world as witnesses for God. Endeavour to walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called. Acquit yourselves as faithful servants of Jesus Christ, that when your earthly stewardship is terminated, you may render up your account with joy

THE ANSWER

OF THE BRITISH CONFERENCE TO THE ADDRESS OF THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CONFERENCE IN CANADA.

REVEREND AND DEAR BRETHREN,

The affectionate Address of your last Annual Conference, has afforded us unfeigned satisfaction. Your warm attachment to the principles and doctrines of Wesleyan Methodism, and your earnest desire for the maintenance of that union which exists between us, are most gratifying. We "have great joy and consolation in your love, and are refreshed in beholding the zeal with which you cultivate the vast field committed to your care." Our heart is enlarged, as our affiliated Conferences multiply, and extend our influence and sympathies. In your Minutes of Conference, and in your Missionary publications, as well as in your Annual Addresses, we gratefully discern proofs of the facility with which Methodism spreads its influence over the world, and blesses the family of man. Narrow fields may suffice for narrow theories; but we hold the glorious truth, that the human race at large is ransomed by the precious blood of Christ; and our habits of itinerancy, combined with our connexional principle and our uniform system of doctrine, pre-eminently qualify us for Missionary work. The manner in which the pleasure of the Lord prospers in our hands, we regard as the seal of Divine approval upon the truth we preach; and we are thus encouraged, "whereto we have already attained," to "walk by the same rule," and "mind the same thing."

We trust that, however widely scattered, you will "stand fast in one spirit, with one mind, striving together for the faith

of the Gospel." If in the waste places of the earth, and among the more arduous spheres of evangelical toil, you are "in perils oft," you have every where, and under all circumstances, the inspiring promise of the Head of the Church, "Lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." He is your dwelling-place in the wilderness, and your refuge in the storm; and to His holy protection we commend you anew, praying that richer measures of His grace may be your portion for ever.

We sympathize heartily with your estimate of the incomparable means of social and religious improvement which, as the Ministers of the Wesleyan Methodist Society, we hold in our hands. A thousand blessings follow in the rear of the Gospel, when published with purity and faithfulness. We have unquestionable authority for expecting that, wherever the regenerate dwell, "the wilderness and solitary place shall be glad for them." True religion not only satisfies the soul of man, but remodels his domestic constitution, introduces the blessings of civilization, and makes all things new. Your own spheres of labour among the scattered tribes of North America present a fine field for the illustration of the truth, that the religion of Jesus is the true civilization, combining all that is needful for man's social elevation, with the amplest provision for his spiritual and eternal life.

We thank God for the great work which you are doing. Your numerical increase during the past year is most cheering. The raising up of a large number of Candidates for the ministry among you, is one of the most palpable signs of your spiritual vigor, and of the sanction of the Most High upon your labours. You have not vainly offered the prayer which the Redeemer dictated to his disciples, that the Lord of the harvest would send forth more labourers into His harvest. The gracious answer of Heaven to your intercession calls upon you to reiterate your appeals, and to give fresh diligence to every department of your holy toil, hopefully waiting for the day when "he that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him."

Among the most encouraging features of your work, is the fact, that so many of your members are reported to be living in the enjoyment of entire sanctification. The influence of this richer experience of the grace of God must be wide-spread and life-giving. The deepest experimental Christianity is the best defence against all the devices of the Man of Sin. Erroneous doctrine will hardly make much progress among those who have tasted that the Lord is gracious, and whose "good hope, through grace," is "as an anchor of the soul, sure and stedfast." As Wesleyan Methodists, it is our high privilege to hold the faith in its purest and most perfect form; and our unflinching guarantee against the pernicious doctrinal novelties of the age, is to preach those grand and eternal truths which we have in trust from our Fathers, and which have proved in our day, as in theirs, "a savour of life unto life." In the midst of the social and scientific progress of these times, it will be well for us to remember that whatever in doctrine is new is untrue, for truth is eternal. Our only unerring guide is "that which was from the beginning."

We rejoice greatly in your Educational efforts of various kinds; and the more so, because we are assured that they are pervaded by the spirit of the Christian faith. We must never forget that, while "knowledge is power," its right use can only be secured by its absolute and constant submission to the guidance of Revelation. With augmented power, augmented iniquity will ever be associated, unless it be shaped and directed by the Spirit of Truth. It is a matter of deep concern that the progress of nations religiously is not in the same ratio with their progress in education and art; and it is evident that, if the education of the masses is to be a blessing, it must be leavened by God's truth, and accompanied by continual prayer for His Grace.

We note with pleasure that you are making very strenuous endeavours to use for Christ the power of the Press. The Press has grown up into a great national institution, of immense power for good or evil. In our own land, the influence of secular and infidel literature is appalling, and calls loudly

upon the Church of Christ for fresh and more vigorous action. We long for the time when this mighty engine shall be wholly secured for God and His truths

Your Address alludes to the commercial panics of the past year, of which we, too, have had painful experience. We regard them as to a great extent the result and penalty of a lax commercial morality, and as calling upon the ministers of Christ to be more faithful in the exposition of those laws by which commerce must be guided. Religion is God's rule for man's life; and never will its function be fulfilled until trade be baptized into the name of Christ, and have for its motto,—“Holiness to the Lord.”

Many efforts are made in our day to improve society by various modes of collective action, which may operate more or less as hindrances to individual repentance, faith, and regeneration. We cannot be too jealous of all attempts to point the eye of man to any other source of help than the Cross of Christ. The religion of the Cross is the only true regenerator of society; and, though, spurious imitations of virtue may be taken in some quarters for the work of the Holy Spirit, we have a more sure word of testimony than “the commandments of men.” It is our safety and our glory to “know nothing among men, save Christ, and Him crucified.”

In the various departments of our work, at home and abroad, we discern the most cheering tokens of the presence of God. Our District returns present a very encouraging increase. More than a hundred Candidates of promise have been accepted as probationers for our ministry. Our Educational agencies are enlarging, and yielding most satisfactory results. We have paid off an unprecedented number of Chapel debts, and have expended a large sum on new erections. We are endeavoring to provide for the spiritual wants of British Soldiers in all parts of the world. Our various Funds, notwithstanding the monetary crisis of the

past year, are in a healthful condition. The spirit of our Societies is good. Every where we are looking for a blessed revival, and in many places "the promise of a shower" is already dropping from heaven.

Our joy, however, has been tempered with sorrow. We have been warned by the stroke of bereavement to "cease from man," and to seek for guidance and strength from "the Creator of the ends of the earth," who "fainteth not, neither is weary." Our trust is in the living God, the exalted and glorified Redeemer; and we cling to the promise of His word—"As I was with Moses, so will I be with thee: I will not fail thee, or forsake thee." With holy faith in that word, let us go forth to possess the promised inheritance. The world is Christ's, and this is the field of our labour. Let us cry aloud, "Ho, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters;" and, while "the Spirit and Bride say, Come," "let him that heareth say, Come."

With great cordiality we assent to all that you have recorded respecting the Minister who lately filled the chair of your Conference. The value of his services you can, perhaps, appreciate more exactly than ourselves; but we cannot be insensible to the zeal and inflexible fidelity with which he has for many years administered the affairs of the Connexion, nor can we be unmindful of the signal success which has crowned his efforts. In the department of Missions, however, we are glad to know that you will still retain the services of the Rev. Enoch Wood; and we trust that his health will prove equal to its requirements, and that he will receive that reward of his labours which will be most acceptable to him,—the still further advancement of the cause of Christ, both foreign and domestic.

Your work among the French Canadians is regarded with just interest in England. We remark with pleasure that you are increasing the number of these Missions, and hope to hear of the conversion of many Romanists to the truth of the Gospel. We also look with interest and hope to the

colony rising on the shores of the Pacific Ocean, and trust that its hardy and enterprising inhabitants will not long remain unvisited by Methodist missionaries.

We cheerfully respond to your request and appoint the Rev. Joseph Stinson, D. D., President of your next Conference, and the Rev. John Douse, Co-Delegate.

THE ADDRESS

TO THE

BRITISH CONFERENCE FROM THE CONFERENCE OF
THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA.

REVEREND FATHERS AND BRETHREN :—

The duty of addressing you annually on the general interests of our wide-spread connection is undertaken by us, not as a mere formality, or as a routine recognition of our alliance with you, but from a deep sense of filial obligation, and from a most sincere and ardent attachment to you as our fathers and brethren in the Lord, with whom we are associated in bonds more sacred, and in treaties of peace more binding than any declared and acknowledged by the kings and rulers of this world. We are, by the unfailing grace of God, "joined in one spirit," enjoying a fellowship which is "from the Father and from His Son, Jesus Christ ; and we rejoice to know and feel ourselves to be not only a part of the great sacramental host of God's elect, but also of that vast brotherhood of the Christian Church known by the name of Methodists. The history of the past, in regard to Methodism, is most instructive, admonitory, and encouraging. We see by what means God hath wrought, for his own glory in the salvation of sinners. The truth as it is in Jesus, declared by faithful men, accompanied by the power of the Holy Ghost, has made us a people who were not a people. Godly simplicity in the Word spoken,—Godly sincerity in the agents employed, and God's own Spirit in all and through all, have accomplished wonders in the world, and not less so in our own beloved Canada. Never will we depart from these Heaven-acknowledged principles. Our system of doctrine and government shall by God's help be preserved intact, and

handed down from generation to generation, so that hereafter, as now, the dwellers in the wilderness may be made glad in the Lord, and millions from Canada join in the jubilee of eternal redemption, through the blood of the everlasting Covenant.

You will not be surprised to learn that, in consequence of the severe monetary depression to which we referred last year, some of our connexional funds are not sufficient to meet existing demands. Many of our brethren have had to suffer loss and struggle with difficulties and embarrassments, which have put to a severe test their faith and patience. Yet through the Divine Goodness they have been sustained, and have cheerfully discharged their duties; nor have they labored in vain, for in many parts of our work we have had gracious revivals of religion, and are encouraged still to prosecute our sacred toil. We are entering every open door, according to our means, and even beyond our means. With our Scriptural principles of action and usefulness, we anticipate accomplishing all that is included in the expansiveness of our benevolent designs. Our country is our parish,—and as its boundaries are not ascertained, so the whole field is before us, and we hope to go forward “conquering and to conquer,” “sounding out the Word of the Lord” “in every place.”

We joyfully recognize in your magnificent schemes of usefulness in the Missionary field a blessed development of the ancient policy of Methodism. That which a zealous Coke and others devised for India, you will ere long achieve. China will acknowledge the blessedness of the religion you offer. Other nations will open their arms to receive the messengers of Christ you send. Your aggressive warfare against Satan's kingdoms will powerfully affect the minds of myriads among the Gentiles; and we trust that soon the veil will be taken away, and all Israel turn to the Lord. We observe also with emotions of pleasure your reference to efforts now making by the Methodist Church and Ministry, in the Home Missionary enterprise; but more particularly the zeal and energy put forth for the salvation of souls in the British Army. Canadian Ministers and Missionaries have

often had occasion to rejoice in the good accomplished by these among the various regiments which have occupied our military stations, and although the changes effected in late years in regard to the regular Army have diminished the number of battalions stationed here, our sympathy in your efforts and desire for the salvation of the British Army can never diminish. It affords us great satisfaction to know that a large number of the men who constitute the 100th or Canadian Regiment have returned themselves as Methodists, and have been placed under Wesleyan Preaching, according to the existing regulations of the Army. Although it is to be feared that many of them were not in the enjoyment of religion, yet their expressed preference for Methodism affords gratifying proof that the influence of our teaching and example has permeated the whole land, from all parts of which these men have been drawn. May the Holy Spirit bless your efforts for their salvation!

The opening and progress of our work on the Pacific coast has thus far been attended with most remarkable providential coincidences. It is evident that one spirit pervades the Church of Christ. You and we were simultaneously moved toward the great enterprise. Suitable labourers offered themselves. Your noble-spirited Missionary Committee advanced assistance. A willing people were prepared of the Lord. The Rev. Dr. Evans and his brethren proceeded to their work, and their reports are of the most cheering character. More labourers are demanded, and you may rely upon our zealous determination to lay the foundations of a future Conference of Affiliated Ministers, who will not fail, by God's blessing, to bring their sheaves with them, in the day of the Lord. Imbued with the Spirit of Christ and devoted to the work of saving souls, our Missionaries on the Pacific will not only extend the Saviour's authority over the Natives and Colonists of Vancouver's Island and British Columbia, but also over the regions beyond, where the name of Christ is not yet known and loved. In this connection, we would more distinctly refer to our ardent desire to commence a Mission in Japan—which, by recent treaties, has been providentially

made accessible to the Christian Missionary. Its proximity to our Missions on the Pacific, renders it less difficult of cultivation as a Mission field, and we are encouraged in the proposal to undertake such a Mission by the generous offer of £300 toward that object. Under the severe monetary depression of this country and the consequent diminution of our resources, we are reluctantly compelled to defer the undertaking; but we shall have your sympathy, and from the past experience we know how cheerfully you will co-operate with us in every effort to bless and save mankind.

Large demands are made upon us in reference to our opening missions among the French Canadians of Lower Canada. The field is great, the labourers are few. The cause is the Lord's; and we trust in Him, that the time may not be distant when the means and the agents may be forthcoming to enable us to prosecute that part of our duty, with a zealous energy more commensurate with the necessities of the case. A deeper sympathy is felt for the thousands of our countrymen who are yet the votaries and victims of the man of sin. In this, your minds and ours accord; and we are led to look for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit, to break the bonds of superstition and deliver the captives of the Papal power.

During the year our beloved President, the Rev. Joseph Stinson, D. D., has faithfully and efficiently discharged the duties of his responsible office. Having travelled very extensively for the advancement of our religious interests, and devoted himself zealously to promote the edification of the people, he has our heartiest gratitude, and brotherly confidence. We therefore respectfully request that he may be appointed as President of our next Conference. We also respectfully desire the appointment of the Rev. Richard Jones as co-delegate, a brother who has for many years entitled himself to our confidence and esteem.

In all our Christian operations, but more especially in all our Missionary undertakings, we continue to receive the hearty assistance and co-operation of the Rev. Enoch Wood, whose zeal and assiduity are well known to you, Appreciating

as we do his excellencies, and desiring the continuance of his services, we unanimously request his re-appointment as the General Superintendent of Missions.

From the proceedings of your last Conference we entertained the hope that, at our present session, we should have received a visit of fraternal recognition and intercourse from the ex-President of your Conference, the Rev. Francis A. West. We anticipated from a Minister of his standing and experience much valuable counsel, as well as much encouraging information. In this we are disappointed, and sincerely regret his absence. Yet we entertain the hope that you will concur in our desire for a continued personal intercourse, and that we may have the privilege, as soon as practicable, of welcoming amongst us one of your number, believing that such intercourse will tend to cement those bonds of union which so happily exist between us.

Beloved Fathers and Brethren,—We are about to proceed to our various fields of labour and Christian enterprise, constrained by the love of Christ to proceed in our glorious work of seeking to bless our country and save the world.

REVEREND FATHERS AND BRETHREN :

Your Address of 1856 was received and read by us with thankfulness and satisfaction, and the visit of your Representatives, the Reverend Dr. Raymond and the venerable William Hamilton, afforded us intense delight both by the ability and fervor of their ministrations, the urbanity and kindness of their social intercourse, and their highly interesting and encouraging statements relative to the work of God and the marvellous progress of the Methodist Episcopal Church in your great country.

We rejoice to have another opportunity to renew and perpetuate our intercourse with you, feeling that we are not less one with you in doctrine, discipline, fellowship, and purpose, than when we were under your parental jurisdiction. Since then, now 31 years, our Ministers have multiplied from 48 to 420, and the membership of our Church has increased from — to —, and our various financial interests, the number and convenience of our places of worship, our means and facilities of educational and literary culture have increased in like proportion. The spirit of revival is, as ever, the spirit of our Ministry and Church, and the thousands of sound conversions and holy experiences from year to year, are our witnesses that the doctrines preached by Wesley are still preached throughout our Church in the demonstration of the spirit and of power. We have been blest with numerous and extensive revivals of religion during the past year; our work among the Indian Tribes is still maintained with unabated efficiency and interest; our Collegiate Institution now numbers its students and pupils by hundreds, instead of by scores; the spirit of Missionary benevolence advances throughout our

Congregations, and we have been enabled during the past year to send several Missionaries to the new settlements of British Columbia on the shores of the Pacific.

But for full information as to the state of our affairs and the field of labour before us, we refer you to the Rev. Joseph Stinson, D. D., our President; the Rev. Enoch Wood, our Superintendent of Missions; and the Rev. Asahel Hurlburt; brethren honoured and beloved, whom we have appointed our Representatives to present to you our filial and affectionate salutations, and to confer with you on the interests of our common Methodism.

Praying for your continual unity and prosperity, and entreating an interest in your prayers and supplications, we remain your sons and brethren in the Wesleyan bonds of the glorious Gospel of the Son of God.
