UNION OF N. B. MUNICIPALITIES HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING HERE.

Work of Various Sessions Shows That the Delegates are in Earnest and Good Results Are Already Manifest from Their Deliberations.

THE TELEPHONE MATTER.

The fourth annual convention of the New Brunswick Union of Municipalities opened Wednesday at 11:30 o'clock, Mayor Chestnut presiding over the president, in the chair. There was a good representation from the various towns and counties, though it was marred by the absence of St. John city or county, which was represented by only one delegate.

Mayor Murray welcomed the delegates on behalf of the council and citizens generally. It was gratifying to him, he said, to have Hon. John Morrisey, commissioner of public works, present at the gathering. His presence, he hoped, would be productive of much in the way of legislative betterment.

City Clerk Magee of Moncton moved a vote of thanks to the commissioner for his attendance and address. This motion was seconded by Mayor Murray of Campbellton, and carried unanimously.

President Chestnut in tendering the thanks of the convention to Mr. Morrisey, expressed the hope that the government would in the future continue to send a representative to the union.

The secretary announced that the St. John delegates would arrive in the evening. It was arranged that Rev. T. Hunter Boyd should address the convention that evening on the Prevention of Tuberculosis.

At the afternoon session of the convention, Mayor Murray of Moncton presided. He welcomed the delegates and expressed his confidence in the success of the convention.

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CAMPBELLTON VS. FREDERICTON RINKS

No Definite Word From Rinks Playing on Fredericton Ice.

THE REPORTS

The Campbellton rinks which have been playing on the Fredericton ice have not sent any definite reports as to their progress, which remains in an encouraging way but the press reports are somewhat discouraging.

In the first two games Fredericton was leading by eight points, while in an 11:45 hour yesterday P. Murray was leading his opponent by four points.

During recess, my government has continued to press for a settlement of outstanding claims in connection with fishery matters, against the government of Canada, and will continue to do so, and is hopeful that a settlement of all questions in dispute may be arrived at during the present year.

At the opening of the last session, I informed you that arrangements had been made by my government, under which certain books used in the common schools were being supplied at a reduced price of forty per cent, and you will be glad to learn that the list has been extended so that practically all the books in the school curriculum are being sold at a similar reduction thereby affecting a very considerable saving to the people of the province.

At the last session of the Legislature an Act was passed in aid of the development of the Gloucester county iron deposits. Aid and encouragement by the carrying out of the provisions of that Act, the Northern New Brunswick and Sea Board Railway Company entered upon the construction of a line of railway from the iron mines near the Grand Falls of the Nepisiguit River to the International Railway, and in spite of the very wet weather last summer and autumn, has made such substantial progress with the work that it is expected the road will be completed not later than July next, and that thereafter the provincial revenues will be increased to a considerable amount by the royalties on the output of the mines.

The encouragement given by my government to this enterprise has caused great activity in prospecting for minerals in Gloucester and the other Northern counties, and so far favorable reports have been received of indications of other valuable deposits, and the receipts from mining licenses have largely increased.

LOCAL LEGISLATURE NOW ATTENDING TO ITS IMPORTANT DUTIES.

OUR VANISHING FORESTS DISCUSSED

Mr. Lawlor of the Canadian Forestry Association Delivers Address.

OF TIMELY INTEREST

Mr. James Lawlor, Secretary of the Canadian Forestry Association, lectured to a full-sized audience in the Opera House, Tuesday, Feb. 16, on 'Our Vanishing Forests', the same being a special for the preservation of Canadian timber lands and reforestation in places where practicable. supply in our streams with its attendant effect upon waterpowers and navigation, the prevention of said erosion, and evaporation and the forming cover for game and insectivorous birds.

The area of the forests of Canada has been very much overestimated. Estimates have dwelt on the size of the belt of timber stretching from Ungava across northern Quebec and Ontario and thence north of the prairies to the Peace River County. But the timber on most of this is not merchantable. Except for firewood it is scarcely serviceable to man, and firewood cannot be transported long distances. Nowadays while the matter is still keenly debated, the best estimate fix the amount of Canada's merchantable timber at from one third to one half that of the United States. A very generous estimate places the available supply at 52 billion feet board measure. This seems an enormous quantity at the present rate of consumption, this would last the United States only twenty years, or England, who is a more careful user, only sixty years. A recent Ontario estimate was to the effect that the timber of this province will last at the present rate thirty years.

The necessity of better fire protection for our forests was set forth and the beneficial effect re-forestation would have upon trade.

What can be done to stop the progress of these evils. In the first place probably sixty per cent of the Province of Ontario is fitted only for the growing of trees. What should be done in regard to this part is to retain it in forest, and manage it so that it shall continually be producing crops of trees. In this part of the Province there will be entirely satisfactory replanting. Various methods are in use by which as the crop of mature trees is taken off, sufficient areas are left to seed the cuts. By the time the last mature trees are cut out there is a good stand of young growth. Fire is kept out, thinning is done from time to time, seed trees are cut out and in sixty, eighty or one hundred years a new crop of timber is ready to be cut.

and the destruction of the soil, which will prevent the reproduction of forest within the lifetime of man. This is a great moral question and forest fires will never cease until the responsibility of civilization is accepted. We have been very wasteful in this matter of fire. The fire in the American States, ten times what it is in European countries. In settling areas where land is not so fertile as in the States, the land is made the obvious duty is to get the back into forest as quickly as possible. The Ontario Government is having certain sections look at 45 per cent. It should be supported in this work. Then as the municipalities are directly interested there might well be developed a system of municipal forest reserves in which the lands would be owned by the municipality, but managed by the provincial Bureau of Forestry, the profits over the cost of management to come back to the municipality.





Robinson followed and claimed the Government took credit for many things for which it was in no way responsible. The opposition leader was the weakest of the speakers. The bill to provide for teachers' pensions would provide for teaching the use of 50 or 60 males and 45 for females, pension not exceeding \$100.

NEW TRIAL IN CROCKET VS. TOWN OF CAMPBELLTON

There Was No Evidence to Justify Finding of the Jury in Favor of Plaintiff.

WAS NO NEGLIGENCE

FREDERICTON, Feb. 17.—In the supreme court today judgment in the following cases were delivered:

Crocket vs. Town of Campbellton.—This was an action for damages against the defendant for refusing to supply him with water for a motor engine used in his printing office. Judge McLeod upheld the contention of the town council on every point, acting in the interests of the whole people, had a perfect right, when there was danger of a shortage in the water supply, to decide what services should be cut off. Their action in terminating the supply for the plaintiff's motor engine had not interfered with the domestic or sanitary service of the town and his holding could not be regarded as a breach of contract and there was no negligence, and no malice. There was no evidence, he said, to justify the finding of the jury in favor of the plaintiff. The court unanimously decided to grant the defendant a new trial.
