Washinoton, March 31.—At a special meeting of the Ways and Means Committee to day chairman McKinley presented the Republican Tariff Bill.

The minority will be allowed ten days in which to offer amendments and prepare their views upon such simendments as may be made before the bill is reported to the House. The bill, according to Chairman McKinley, will effect a reduction of \$45,000,000 in the revenue. The only change of special signiff cauce made in the bill since these already announced within the past week is in hides, which have been placed upon the dutiable list at the rate of 15 per cent. al valorem, with a provision allewing a drawback on exported goods made from imported hides equal to rate of duty paid.






