DON'T EXPECT IT FOR NOTHING.

Promoters of Island Railway Offer to Pay For the Privilege.

Meredith, Clark & Bovey, solicitors for the applicants, have forwarded the following letter to the City Clerk, in the matter of the petition of the Toronto Island Railway Company:

As some misapprehension appears to exist in connection with the petition of the Toronto Island Railway Company for the privilege of constructing an electric railway on the south shore of the Island, we are instructed by the company to say, and they wish it thoroughly understood, that they do not expect to obtain the franchise for the line on the contrary, in the petition already presented the company asked to be apprised of the terms and conditions upon which the franchise would be made, and they were under the impression that the council in response to the petition would impose conditions and terms and submit them to the company for their consideration.

As no response to the petition has been made by the council or terms submitted, we have to say that the company will be willing to pay to the city 5 per cent. of its gross receipts for the first year of the operation of the railway and 10 per cent. each subsequent year for 20 years, at the end of which time the franchise to run the line will be returned to the city, and the company will agree to run its cars at not more than five miles an hour if necessary and will pay the cost of the franchise to the City Engineer.

If the franchise is granted to the Island Railway Company the company undertakes to commence operations this summer and to have the cars in running order by May 15 of next year.

The company are willing to make any reasonable arrangement with the City Council for the franchise and are prepared to consider any fair modification of the offer contained therein.
